Restoring the Swift Fox – Badlands (Andersen)

Sept. 2005 the staff of Badlands National Park released 30 swift foxes into the wilds of the part. The animals were captured from a wild population in Colorado with the assistance of the Colorado Division of Wildlife. The foxes are radio-collared and monitored throughout the seasons. The zoo in Watertown has a couple foxes if needed for video.

Preserving the Lakota Language – Oglala, Various (Matoney)

Ollie Napesni has had a life which should be of interest to all in the state. She has hand made over 650 star quilts. Her book Salt Camp: Her Story was published in 2003. She has the ability to live equally in the Indian or the non-Indian world and also bring religions together by attending church services or traditional ceremonies without conflict. She was named SD's Indian Living Treasure in 2002 and has received many other honors. She spoke at the Cry of the Earth Conference at the United Nations in 1993. She continues to teach Lakota Language and Traditional Lakota Arts at Sinte Gleska University. She will turn 89 in June.

Also - A special Scrabble tournament in the Sioux language made its debut, pitting teams from Sioux reservation schools in North Dakota, South Dakota and Manitoba. The game is part of the tribe's campaign to revitalize the Dakota Language, now spoken fluently by a dwindling number of elders. One survey predicted the last fluent Sisseton-Wahpeton Dakota speaker would die in 2025.

Sorraia Horse Preservation - Hot Springs (Bellew)

The Sorraia horse is an endangered South Iberian wild horse, or a direct descendant of that wild subspecies. At Caballos de Destino they are engaged in the preservation of these horses, and are fortunate enough to have a herd of Sorraia Mustangs.

The Caballos de Destino program is designed to:

- A) enlarge the Sorraia Mustang population through the strength of our herd,
- B) disseminating information about Sorraia Mustangs and Sorraia Horses,
- C) finding other mustangs of obvious Sorraia ancestry displayed through characteristics, in cooperation with the Sorraia Mustang Studbook (SMS),
- D) helping other to obtain Sorraia Horses and Mustangs,
- E) and offering guidance in making the most beneficial breeding choices.

Red Cloud Art Festival – Matoney – Pine Ridge - Segment 1

Red Cloud School near Pine Ridge holds an annual huge Art Show with Native artists from the U.S. and Canada, including South Dakota. It attracts over 10,000 visitors every summer, including international people. It has helped artists from many different tribes to launch careers in art. There is a "special preview" (i.e. opening reception June 2) and the show runs June through August 18th. This year is the 40th anniversary. Red Cloud is one of the largest private Native schools in the country and only Catholic school on Pine Ridge. The Heritage Center Museum on its grounds has more than 2,000 permanent pieces and it's considered one of the finest collections of Native art in the region.
