

THE **PRAIRIE DOC** GOES HOME

Richard Powell Holm, M.D. passed away Sunday, March 22, 2020, at home under hospice care, surrounded by his family. He was 71.

Driven by his passion for providing ethical, science-based medical information, Rick founded a variety of programs including a weekly **Prairie Doc® Radio** show, a weekly Q&A television show, **On Call with the Prairie Doc®** broadcast on SDPB, and **Prairie Doc® Perspectives** weekly column published in more than 120 newspapers in five states including South Dakota, North Dakota, Wyoming, Nebraska and Kansas.

Rick authored two books, The Picture of Health: A View from the Prairie with Judith Peterson, M.D. and Life's Final Season: A Guide for Aging and Dying with Grace.

Rick practiced medicine in Brookings for nearly 40 years. He served as the hospice medical director in Brookings until the time of his death.

Rick guested weekly on SDPB's **In the Moment with Lori Walsh**. From this partnership, a friendship grew. Lori Walsh shares her tribute to Dr. Holm with us.



Remebering Rick

Dr. Rick Holm would be the first person to tell you he lived a spectacular life. He followed his own advice — exercise every day, eat fewer calories, connect with others. He lived well and laughed often. And yet he knew he was going to die. For years, he prepared himself and the people around him for a meaningful death.

Please understand, that doesn't mean his death was easy. It wasn't free of suffering. But a difficult death cannot erase one moment of a beautiful life. That's worth considering right now.

Because here we are, remembering Rick and fearing death in ways we didn't know possible. What does his legacy teach us about how to face our own fears?

Here's what I know. Rick Holm was willing to "hop to the next lily pad" and have faith that another lily pad would soon appear. Rick Holm was willing to "Snoopy dance" every day, brimming with joy and gratitude no matter how grim the future appeared. He was vibrant and devoted and unafraid to show up, even when he was frail, even when he was frightened.

Let's all do that too. Let's do the next right thing and celebrate every day we are healthy, every day we are together. Let's support honest, science-based information. Let's despise poverty and inequity. Let's do the difficult things because the difficult things save lives. Let's sing every now and again, because singing is good for the soul.

The last words I said to Rick were "I love you." Those were the last words he said to me too. You don't often hear people say that on the radio. I'm glad we did.

The work of the Healing Words Foundation, the work of Rick and Joanie Holm, goes on. We can still tune in to **On Call with the Prairie Doc**[®] on SDPB TV. Rick's voice is amplified through the voices of others. When you remember Rick, remember them, support them. If we didn't already know our South Dakota doctors are heroes, let's prove we know that now.

I also enjoy listening back to our conversations on **In the Moment**, and I invite you to do the same. We talked about taking care of yourself, about staying active, about being clear about what kind of life you want to live and what kind of death is worth embracing. He was unflinching in conversation and uncompromising in compassion. He was kind. He was funny.

Rick wanted to be remembered as a father who read to his kids. If you want to be a good guy, he said, read to your children. They are better human beings for it. That's how I'm spending my days right now. Loving my daughter. Laughing with her. Noticing how the books we spent hours with when she was younger have helped create the thoughtful, kind, fierce woman she is today.

We are together, huddled here on this metaphorical lily pad, dancing a dance of our own making, saying "I love you" in a million shimmering ways. This is our wish for all of you, no matter how heavy grief feels draped about your shoulders right now.

Love. Sing. Connect. You also might want to get a little exercise. A mile a day really does make a world of difference.

Shortly after his diagnosis of pancreatic cancer, Rick and Joanie, co-founders of the Healing Words Foundation established a plan to continue their legacy of service. Rick and Joanie took steps to assure that the work of the Prairie Doc[®] will go on. Four physicians from Brookings have agreed to take on the role of hosting Prairie Doc[®] radio and television programs, as well as authoring the weekly newspaper essays. Rick wanted everyone to know that, while he originally developed the Prairie Doc[®] programs and had been known by many as "THE" Prairie Doc[®], he felt he was always surrounded by a "team of Prairie Docs."






Through Native Waters: A Chitimacha

THE MIDDLE OF EVERYWHERE CONNECTING RURAL SOUTH DAKOTA

New SDPB documentary premieres this fall.

In 1878, Deadwood, South Dakota had a small operating telephone exchange. At the time, San Francisco didn't have a major exchange. Even the White House didn't have a telephone.

The Middle of Everywhere – Connecting Rural South Dakota, a new 60-minute documentary premiering this fall, explores the history and ongoing work of services – from basic electrical service and early telephone exchanges, to cell phone technology and broadband



Internet – that keep rural South Dakota connected to the world.

The Middle of Everywhere - Connecting Rural South **Dakota** presents milestones in transportation, energy, and communication infrastructures. The wiring of South Dakota farms and ranches between the 1930s and 1960s changed the agriculture industry and rural life almost immeasurably. The construction of hydroelectric dams on the Missouri River provided a reliable source of renewable energy. Farm-tomarket road improvements reached a high point with the construction of I-29 and I-90, South Dakota's intersecting Interstate connection to the rest of America.

Various people in South Dakota experimented with radio as early as 1912, and many of those stations continue to operate today, including KGFX, WNAX and KUSD. The Middle of Everywhere shares the stories of how radio, and later television, kept South Dakotans informed and entertained during both good times and bad.

SDPB's new documentary

considers ongoing

communication issues in rural South Dakota. Most of the state has had cell phone service for some time, and high-speed Internet is available in most larger towns, but most rural areas still do not have broadband access. A state-backed "rural broadband initiative" has been implemented to address that issue and the success of it remains unmeasured.

South Dakotans who can access and use social media are finding creative uses for Facebook, Twitter, and other platforms. The Middle of Everywhere -Connecting Rural South Dakota shares conversations with rural people using social media to keep their communities connected during uncertain times and amid issues that include rural population loss, a new pandemic threat in the form of COVID-19. and the forever challenge of maintaining a healthy ag-based economy.

He can be found at basketball practice, on the golf course, looking to the stars, always going full blast," Bordeaux added.

How to Listen to SDPB on Your Smart Speaker

Smart speakers are hands-free, wi-fi connected speakers controlled by voice commands. The most popular devices include Apple HomePod, Amazon Echo, and Google Home. However, other smart speakers are in development including Samsung with voice assistant "Bixby" and Microsoft with voice assistant "Cortana."

To use the hands-free device, you speak a trigger phrase – such as "Hey Siri," "OK Google," or "Alexa" — and then ask a question or make a request. The speakers are powered by voice assistants like Siri and Alexa that talk back.

If you own an Amazon Echo,

listening to SDPB Radio is as simple as saying "Alexa, play NPR." The device might ask what station you wish to listen to, and in that case answer "SDPB Radio." You may also answer with the call letters of your nearest SDPB radio station – "KUSD," "KESD," "KBHE," etc. See SDPB's radio coverage map on the back of this magazine for assistance.

If you own a Google Home smart speaker, TuneIn continues to be the default radio stream provider. Say "OK Google, play SDPB on Tune In." The voice assistant known as "Siri" powers all Apple platforms. You will need to open the Apple Music app and choose SDPB Radio's stream to hear local programming.

The most ambitious television chronicle of the Asian American story in the United States launches this month on SDPB.

According to data from the 2010 U.S and South Dakota Censuses and July 1, 2018 estimate, individuals in South Dakota who identified solely as Asian grew by 94% between 2010 and 2018. Americans of Asian descent are among the fastest growing racial/ ethnic groups in the United States. **Asian Americans,** an engaging new five-part documentary led by a team of Asian American filmmakers, captures the impact of Asian Americans on the country's past, present, and future.

This groundbreaking series, produced by Renee Tajima-Peña (Who Killed Vincent Chin?, No Más Bebés), examines the significant role of Asian Americans in shaping American history and identity, from the first wave of Asian immigrants in the 1850s and identity politics during the social and cultural turmoil of the twentieth century to modern refugee crises in a globally connected world.

Monday, May 11 Episode 1: Breaking Ground 7pm (6 MT)

In an era of exclusion and U.S. empire, new immigrants arrive from China, India, Japan, the Philippines and beyond. Barred by anti-Asian laws they become America's first "undocumented immigrants," yet they build railroads, dazzle on the silver screen, and take their fight for equality to the U.S. Supreme Court. **Episode 2: A Question of Loyalty 8pm (7 MT)**

An American-born generation straddles their country of birth and their parents' homelands in Asia. Those loyalties are tested during World War II, when families are imprisoned in detention camps, and brothers find themselves on opposite sides of the battle lines.

At the turn of the new millennium, the country tackles conflicts over immigration, race, economic disparity, and a shifting world order. A new generation of Asian Americans are empowered by growing numbers and rising influence but face a reckoning of what it means to be an American in an increasingly polarized society.

SPOTTED ONLINE: SOCIAL DISTANCE POWWOW

Some of the most traditional of ceremonies, Native powwows and dances are finding a new life online. Tribes are canceling events and gatherings to adhere to restrictions because of the coronavirus. But Indigenous people across the continent can share their talent and cultures online.

Social media has helped thousands of people see 16-year old Wakiyan Cuny and his 14-year old sister Wicahpi Cook dance. The two are Oglala Lakota and live in Washington state. They compete at powwows across the country, and usually travel a lot in the summer.

But that won't happen this year. So instead, they put on their regalia and danced in their front yard. Their mother recorded the performance and posted a video on social media. Wakiyan Cuny explains the roots of his Grass Dance.

"Back then the grass would be really tall. So they would have all the grass dancers go out and dance before everybody to lay down the grass so that it would be ready to dance on for everybody else."

His sister Wicahpi Cook danced in her Jingle Dress. It has about 200 metal cones sewn onto it that make noise when she moves. She says it's a healing dance that originates from the Ojibwe Tribe.

"Some dresses, they kind of differ depending on your age because you don't want too many on a smaller child's dress. But a normal dress should have 365 for the days of the year."

The siblings usually compete in separate categories. So dancing in their yard, together, is a treat.

Cook: "It's fun dancing with my brother and having him by my side.

Cuny: "Yeah, I think it's pretty fun and she's just my first sibling and



we're pretty close."

A Facebook group called Social Distance Powwow shares a variety of traditional performances. It's the creation of Whitney Rencountre he's a member of Crow Creek Tribe who is based in Rapid City. So far, it has almost 90 thousand members.

"A platform has been created for them to share these songs and dances and so that's why I think it's just going viral for everybody. Because it's the right time and it's important to share the talents, and the songs, dances and artistry, languages and all these things that I think throughout the world we never really had a platform for to provide that," says Rencountre.

Rencountre says the pandemic has helped draw interest to traditional Indigenous practices.




