For Viejas tribal Chairman Anthony Pico, the abundance of today harks back to the times before contact with Europeans. Today, the State is trying to charge a gaming tax greater than the standard corporate rate, a challenge to the newly found abundance of California tribes. CALIFORNIA'S "LOST" TRIBES is the first documentary to go behind the facade of glitz and glamour of American Indian casinos to reveal the current conflicts over Indian gaming, explore the historical underpinnings of tribal sovereignty, and the evolution of tribal gaming over the last thirty years. Concern over gaming is further stoked by the development of casinos in rural lands, creating friction between tribes and non-Indians. Known as a primitive artist, Cunningham was essentially a self-taught painter who utilized a unique visionary technique to record his adventures as a wanderer and mariner. Earl Cunningham's work realizes a different realm of American art. His art has been associated with the works of American folk artists such as Grandma Moses, Morris Hirschfield and Lawrence

Lebduska. Born in 1893 in Edgecomb, Maine, Cunningham spent his early years working as a tinker and became an accomplished mariner sailing the East Coast on giant coastal ships. It was during one of these voyages, around 1913, that Earl first visited Florida. He owned several boats in his lifetime and during World War I worked as a seaman. In 1915, Earl married a piano teacher named Iva Moses whom he called Maggie and began an almost nomadic lifestyle for several years. The couple bought a 35-foot cabin cruiser and cruised up and down the East Coast between Florida and Maine. Around 1936 the couple were divorced, and in 1949 he moved to St. George Street in St. Augustine and opened up the Over Fork Gallery. His landlady, Theresia Paffe, became his patron, close friend and personal and professional mainstay. He became known as 'the Dragon of St. George Street', a cranky, eccentric shopkeeper who was likely to run prospective customers out of his shop and was reluctant to sell his paintings. Earl Cunningham continued to paint as he moved into old age despite personal and emotional upheaval. Cunningham took his own life in 1977 at the age of 84.
