Tickets start at \$18 and go on sale to the general public Friday, March 3.

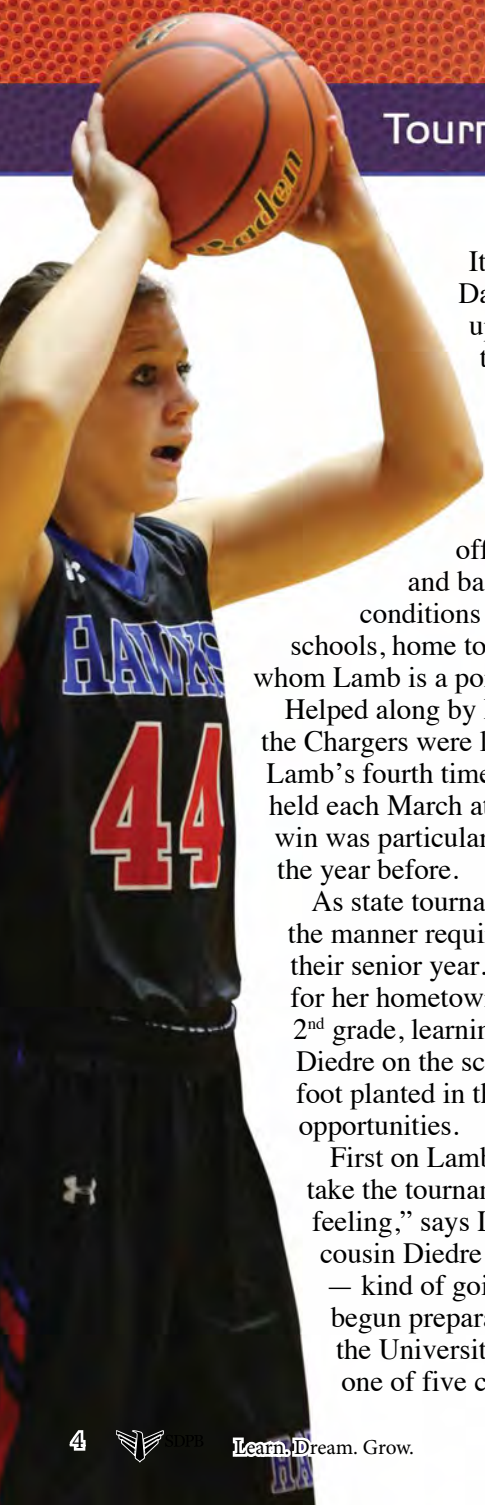

SD HIGH SCHOOL HOOPS

Tournament Vets Chloe Lamb & Myah Selland Stay In-State

It's a fierce winter afternoon in South Dakota, as wind and snow wallop the upper Midwest, and schools across the state have issued a coveted snow day. At home in Onida, a town of about 700 folks located just northeast of Pierre on US Highway 83, high school senior Chloe Lamb is enjoying a rare day off from the double duties of school and basketball practice. Hazardous road conditions have closed Agar-Blunt-Onida schools, home to the Sully Buttes Chargers, for whom Lamb is a point guard.

Helped along by Lamb's skillful ball handling, the Chargers were last year's State B champs. It was Lamb's fourth time playing at the state tournament, held each March at the Huron Arena, and Sully Buttes' win was particularly sweet after a second-place finish the year before.

As state tournament time nears, Lamb is pivoting in the manner required of promising student-athletes in their senior year. The close of 11-plus years playing for her hometown is upon her — a stint started in 2nd grade, learning from big sister Kylee and cousin Diedre on the school courts — and Lamb has one foot planted in the present while turning to survey opportunities.

First on Lamb's agenda is helping Sully Buttes take the tournament again. "That was a pretty cool feeling," says Lamb. "And I got to do it with my cousin Diedre Lamb and the rest of those seniors — kind of going out with a bang." But she's also begun preparations for her transition to play for the University of South Dakota in the fall — one of five colleges who recruited her. She's

applying for scholarships and gearing up for college-level basketball. "I'll still be playing the game of basketball and being a student athlete and going to school," says Lamb. "But the atmosphere will be different. The girls I'll be playing with and against are going to be much stronger, faster, and better overall athletes in most cases. I'll have to get stronger and faster as well."

Her naturally competitive spirit should serve her well. "I don't even like losing card games," she says. Pushing herself on the court transfers to academics. "There are not a lot of things I leave undone or if I don't do them to the best of my ability, I don't really feel satisfied. There are times I might take too long to do something because I want it to be done as best I can. It's kind of a weakness, but I'd rather be that way than any other way."

Lamb says she's motivated not only by positive results, but by being a role model for younger teammates in the way her sister, cousin, and teammates were for her. It's important to her to extend this esprit de corps beyond basketball. "When I walk through the hallways at school, I try to say hi to everyone and kind of just get people involved," says Lamb. "It may seem kind of weird, but I just want to make sure everyone knows that they're being seen. I think that might be how my off-the-court and on-the-court personality kind of connect. I think I'm a quiet leader. But I am getting more vocal as I've gotten older."

Part of that connection takes place at the state championships in Huron, which Lamb and her family try to attend whether or not the Chargers

have made it. “I love to watch, honestly,” says Lamb. “Knowing those girls that I’ve either played against or have watched – I love to watch them compete, and see all the fans get crazy and support their teams.”

One of those girls is Myah Selland, a senior who plays forward and guard positions for the Sanborn Central-Woonsocket Blackhawks. Snowbound in the same winter storm as her Sully Buttes colleague, today Selland is at home on the family farm near Letcher, also taking advantage of some downtime to fill out scholarship forms. Lamb and Selland haven’t played against each other since eighth grade, but the similarities they share are compelling — both toddled onto the court as little girls, following the steps of an older sister and cousin who didn’t go lightly on their fledgling charges simply because they were younger. Both have mothers who are teachers and fathers in the ag business (Selland’s father farms. Lamb’s sells and repairs Case International Harvesters.) Like Lamb, Selland has competed in the state tournament four times. And like Lamb, Selland has committed to a South Dakota college after being courted by several. Selland starts her career as a Jackrabbit at SDSU this fall.

Of course, Selland would also like a state tournament win. The Blackhawks have placed fifth through second, but have yet to capture first. In addition to her sister, Shelby, who plays for Augustana University, Selland says one of her strongest athletic and academic inspirations is her good friend and former teammate Tanna Kingsbury, who died at the age of 15 from Ewings Sarcoma. “Tanna was a big part of my life,” says Selland. “The way she fought, the way she lived life was extremely inspiring. She had a motto: ‘I believe, I believe, we believe.’” The Blackhawks have transformed Tanna’s motto into a chant in the huddle that Selland says both inspires and provides perspective. “Tanna couldn’t play after eighth grade,” says Selland. “It was just kind of ripped away from her and that was eye-opening — like, this is a sport, it’s a lot of fun to play, but you also can’t take it for granted.”

The memory of another exceptional young woman inspires players each March at the state tournament. Every year six players from all three classes of girls and boys basketball are chosen to receive the “Spirit of Su” Award, in honor of SuAnne Big Crow, a standout player from Pine Ridge who was killed in a car accident en route to the Miss Basketball Banquet in 1992. Honorees are selected for academics, character and sportsmanship and are presented with star quilts from members of Big Crow’s family. Lamb’s cousin Diedre received the award in 2016. Selland’s sister Shelby was awarded in 2014.

It’s one of many traditions at the state tournament, both official and informal, that celebrates the connectedness of small, rural communities and of young people working together to make each other stronger, faster, and better. While the competition

Sponsored in part by PBS LearningMedia, it provides opportunities for 10th and 11th graders to work with a university-level mentoring scientist to explore careers in science and become part of the next generation of cancer researchers.

Bursott lost her father Alan Wurm, age fifty-four, to cancer. That experience looms large in her desire to pursue a career in medicine or medical research.

SDPB followed up with Bursott about her experience resulting from winning the award. Finances prevented Alyssa from job-shadowing her mentor, Dr. Angela Ozburn, a behavioral neuroscience researcher at the Portland, Oregon VA Health Care System, but Alyssa and Dr. Ozburn made it work virtually.

SDPB: What did your research entail?

Alyssa Bursott: “I researched the topics of circadian rhythms and alcohol use disorder and how AUDs affect circadian rhythms.”

SDPB: Can you put it in “laypeople” terms?

AB: “Essentially, certain genes control your circadian rhythms, the 24-hour cycle that controls sleep/wake patterns and metabolism. Studies have shown that certain mutations of these genes are associated with alcohol abuse. Also, other studies have shown that chronic alcohol abuse affects



circadian rhythms by throwing off the cycle, so to speak.

Since I was unable to work in a lab, I worked on a research paper regarding the topic. Dr. Ozburn and I felt that this would be the most beneficial way to spend my time because of the distance between us. I think this was a great choice because I learned what a research paper entails, and I learned a great deal about the topic. For the most part, I spent my time reading medical journals about the topics. I would then use the information I learned to piece together my paper.

Dr. Ozburn has become my go-to person on anything career or college related. I emailed her a lot, and we were also able to use Google Hangouts to chat in a Skype-like setting. Honestly, it was hard to get used to, but the communication was still very beneficial.”

SDPB: What was the experience like?

AB: “It was a unique experience, and I didn’t like it at first. I didn’t like not being able to work with Dr. Ozburn in person, but I think I got way more out of the experience by being uncomfortable. I learned how to communicate via email. Often times it’s very hard to explain thoughts in a detailed message, but that was exactly what I learned to do. Obviously I learned how to research, but I learned a lot about other important work aspects, too: diligence, communication, work ethic, organization, and perseverance. There were times where I wanted to give up on the project because I didn’t understand what I was doing, but I learned from that. I learned to push forward, and I got the result that I wanted. I wouldn’t have been successful without Dr. Ozburn

keeping me in line.”

SDPB: How was the experience different from learning science in high school? Was it more real world?

AB: “This application of science in the real world allowed me to fully understand what I was talking about. I comprehend the subjects better. With high school coursework, even when I don’t understand what I’m doing, I can still answer things correctly. With my research, I *had* to understand every aspect of what I was talking about.

Honestly, there isn’t a single thing I can think of that was not amazing. Dr. Ozburn is the best mentor I have ever had. She was so patient with me in the beginning. I was pretty bull-headed with my ideas when I started, but Dr. Ozburn managed to retrain my way of thinking. She broadened my perspective on not just the medical research community, but also in my everyday life. Another thing I really appreciated was her commitment to her job. I have always been a driven person, but she really set the bar high for me. I think that teaching me how to be a professional while treating me with kindness and respect was the most important, and Dr. Ozburn accomplished this flawlessly.”

SDPB: What are you currently interested in, science-wise? Do you still want to be a neuroscientist?

AB: “Currently, I plan to become either a surgeon or a forensic pathologist. I would love to do further research, especially in neuroscience, but I do not plan on making that my career.”

SDPB: Have you solidified plans for college yet?

AB: “I have. I will be attending Creighton University in Omaha to major in Neuroscience and Pre-Medical Studies. After that, I hope to be accepted into Creighton’s medical school and continue my education.”

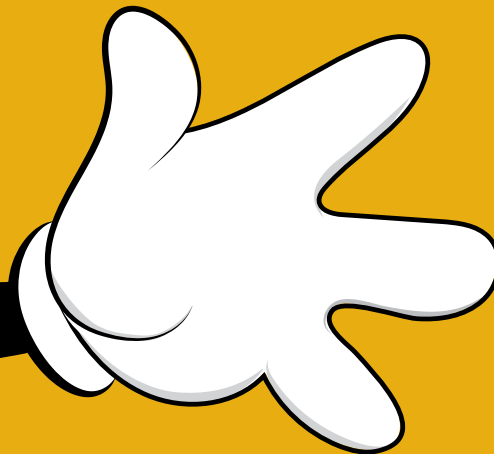

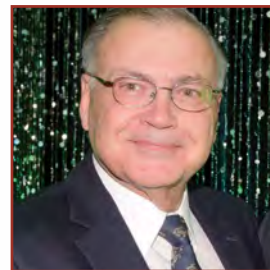

in the paint can be fierce, Lamb and Selland acknowledge the close-knit atmosphere. On the last night, for example, girls who've spent the last three days and entire season trying to crush each other on the court celebrate or console each other after tournament games. When Sully Buttes won the 2016 championship, all the teams revealed together Saturday night at the Crossroads Hotel. "Most of us are on the same hallway," says Selland, "so we'll do a kind of march around or we'll listen to music in the stairwell. We invite each other into each other's rooms and just kind of talk and interact." It was other teams that lifted Sully Buttes' spirits when they lost the championship. "We came back to the hotel and we were upset, obviously," says Lamb. "But coming back and celebrating with all the teams — we run through the halls and have fun, despite the outcomes of the games that night."

Selland and Lamb say that, for them, collegiate hoop dreams set in around eighth grade. Colleges started recruiting Lamb the summer before her freshman year. She recognizes the recruitment process as an amalgam of fun, opportunity, and pressure. "I kind of pushed everything off and focused

on high school ball because I knew I could wait to make a decision. But I knew I was very lucky and thankful to have the opportunity." She visited the recruiting schools and ultimately chose USD after an auspicious summer basketball camp. "I just like that feeling of being able to compete for my state," says Lamb. "I like being able to kind of support my home state and represent them."

Selland is sold on the state as well, which is why she chose SDSU. "I have such fond memories," she says. "South Dakota basketball is incredible. We have great support for women's basketball and that's awesome. You go to State B's in Huron and there is a ton of people. That was a big thing — the way South Dakota supports their women's basketball. And the community I've been surrounded by is incredible. College is a big step and to have the right people surrounding me is something I thought was extremely important. And I think there's some great people in South Dakota."

SD Focus: Education Update



Last year at this time, Governor Dennis Daugaard signed three bills resulting from the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Teachers and Students. The laws comprised a package that raised taxes to fund teacher salary increases, reform the school funding formula, and create programs to help schools operate more efficiently.

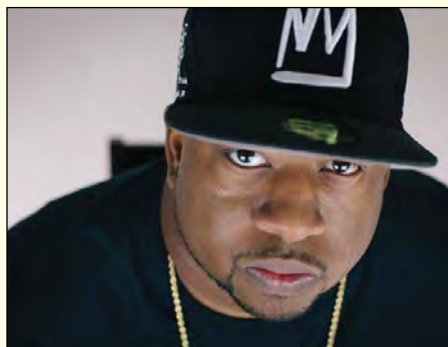

Mad Brother in the Attic: Masterpiece's Branwell Brontë

In early adulthood, Branwell worked intermittently as a poet, literary translator, portrait painter, railway clerk and tutor. He purportedly blotted himself out of a portrait he painted of himself and his three sisters. The piece hangs in London's National Portrait Gallery, a shadowy white pillar occluding the space where Branwell had appeared.

Failing to thrive emotionally and economically due mainly to bouts of drinking, drugging, and impropriety with his pupil's mother (for whom Anne was governess), Branwell returned home to Hawarth, where he experienced nightmares so severe his father brought Branwell into his own bed to still them. He eventually succumbed to tuberculosis, worsened by addiction to alcohol and opiates, at the age of thirty-one.

For the first time, a fictional biopic about the Brontë sisters widens the historical lens to suggest how the tormented life of their impulsive, alcoholic brother Branwell may have impacted their writing.

Written by acclaimed British TV writer Sally Wainwright (**Last Tango in Halifax**, **Happy Valley**) **Masterpiece To Walk Invisible** dramatizes three years in the lives of the Brontës at home in Hawarth Parsonage on the bleak, beautiful moorlands of West Yorkshire. While

Charlotte, Emily and Anne penned (and covertly published – cloaked under masculine noms des plume) the tempestuous novels that would come to dominate the gothic romance canon, they shared both home and artistic leanings with brother Branwell. The only son of the Brontë family, Branwell was tutored at the parsonage by his father, an Irish priest for the Church of England. Characterized as flame-haired, quick-witted, and showy, Branwell hoped to one day make a living as a painter.
