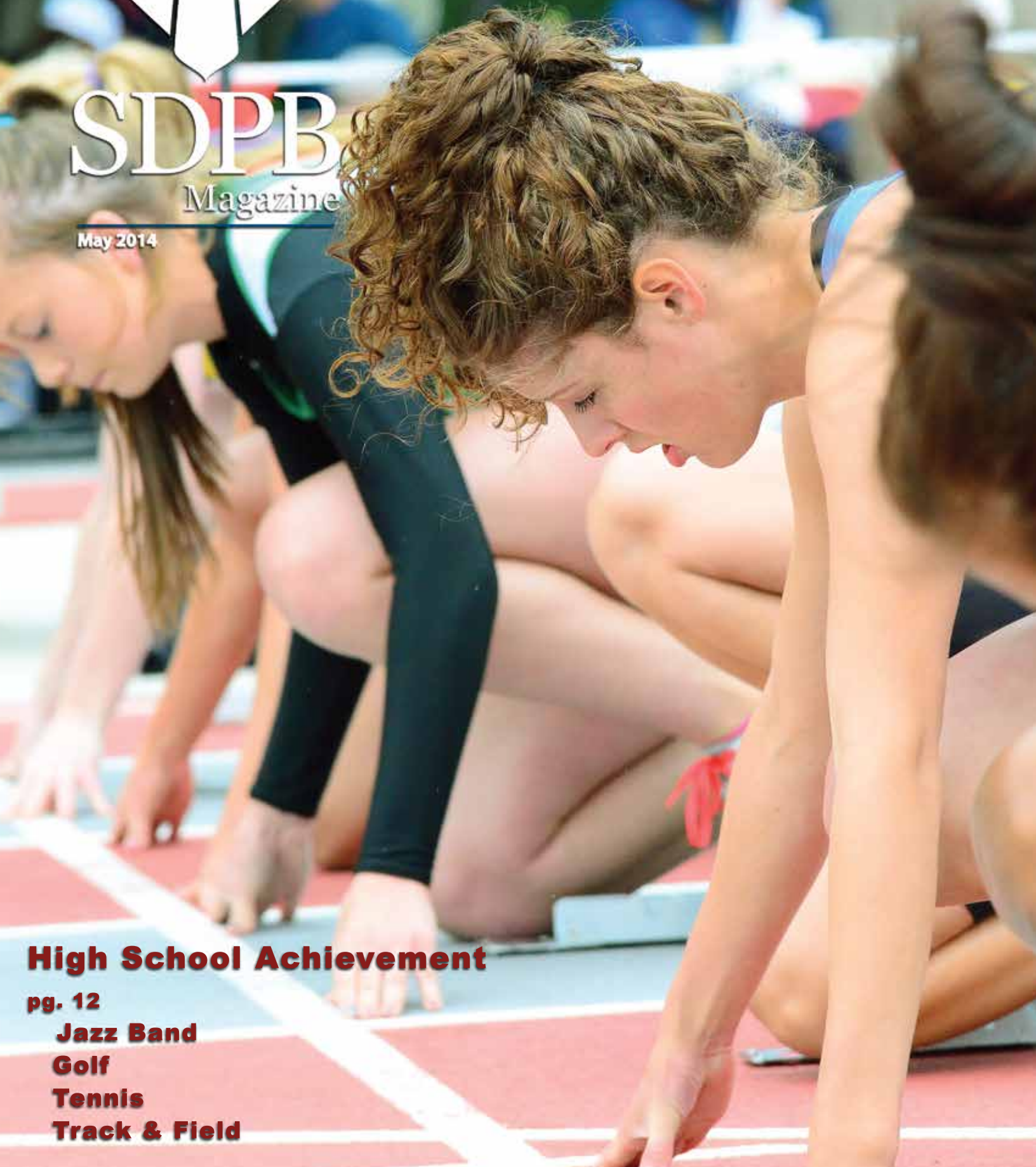

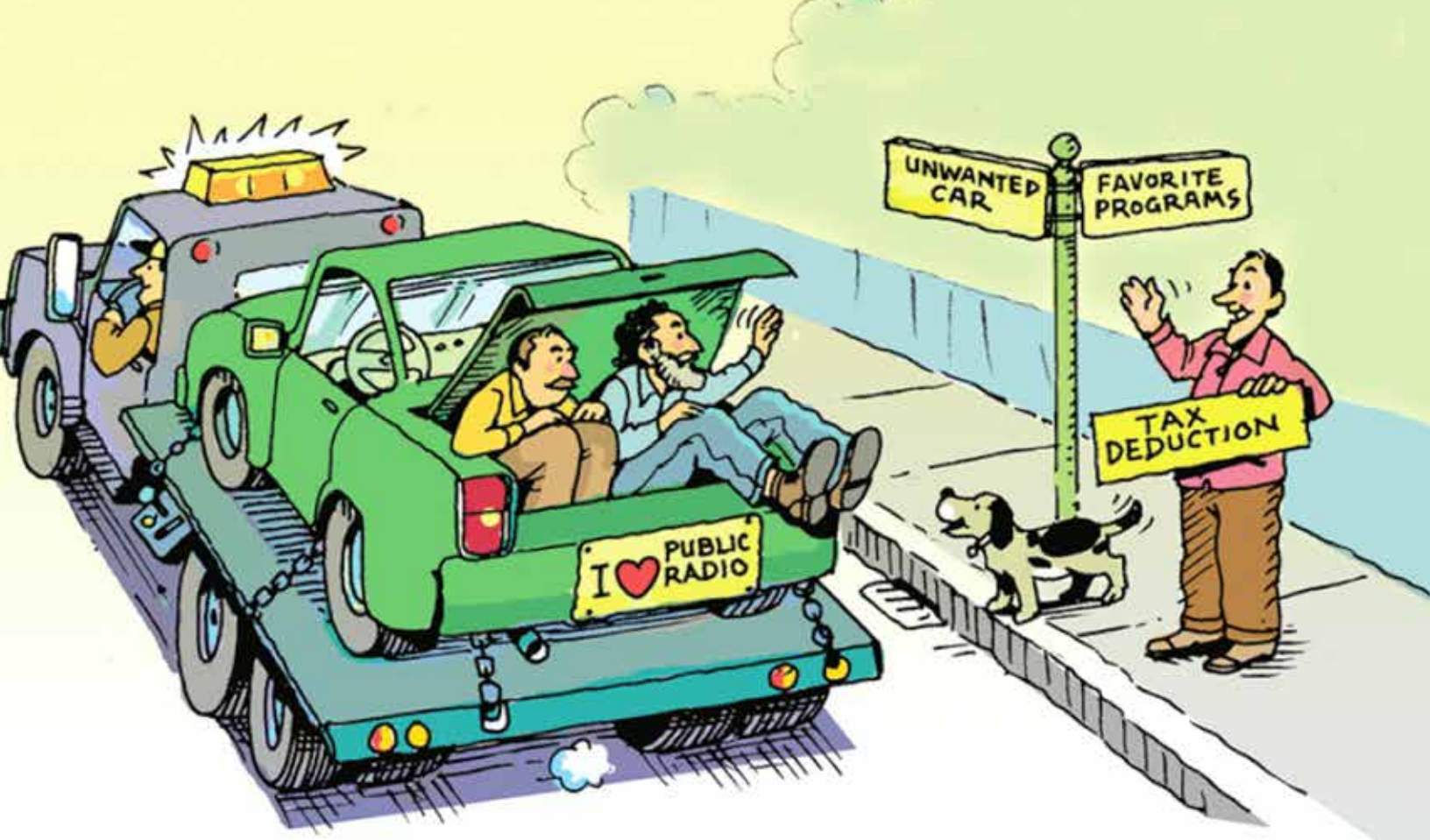

To commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Normandy landing, four veterans gather to share their experiences from that fateful "Day of Days."

Escape from a Nazi Death Camp

In 1943, 300 Jewish prisoners staged a fantastic and bloody breakout in Poland that shook the Nazi party to its core.

NOVA *Bombing Hitler's Dams*

The 1943 destruction of two dams with "bouncing" bombs cut the water supply to arms factories.

Eagles of Mercy

In the opening moments of D-Day, two young American medics found themselves trapped in a church in a small village. They provided first aid as a fierce battle raged.

American Experience *Death and the Civil War*

SDPB1: Monday, May 26, 8pm (7 MT)

The staggering casualty levels of the Civil War changed the American people, who had to find ways to cope with a landscape littered with bodies.

D-Day Uncovered

SDPB1: Tuesday, May 27, 8pm (7 MT)

SDPB2: Thursday, May 29, 8pm (7 MT)

D-Day was a logistical effort on a scale never seen before or since – 14,000 planes dropped 23,000 airborne troops behind German lines, and 5,000 ships delivered 30,000 military vehicles and 160,000 soldiers onto the beaches.

The Navy Band Sea Chanters is the United States Navy's official chorus. They perform sea chanties and patriotic fare, as well as music ranging from traditional choral music, to opera, Broadway, and contemporary music.

The U.S. Air Force Singing Sergeants

The Singing Sergeants, the official chorus of The United States Air Force, is composed entirely of professional vocalists from leading colleges, universities and music conservatories throughout the world – all of them sergeants in The United States Air Force.

The U.S. Army Herald Trumpets

The U.S. Army Herald Trumpets are part of the pageantry of high office. They serve as the official fanfare ensemble for the President of the United States. The ensemble, founded in 1959, is part of the U.S. Army Band, and patterned after traditional British "fanfare" trumpet ensembles.

The U.S. Army Chorus

The Army Chorus performs frequently at the White House, the Vice President's Residence, the U.S. Capitol, the Supreme Court, and the State Department, often for visiting heads of state. The Army Chorus is able to sing in more than 26 languages and dialects.

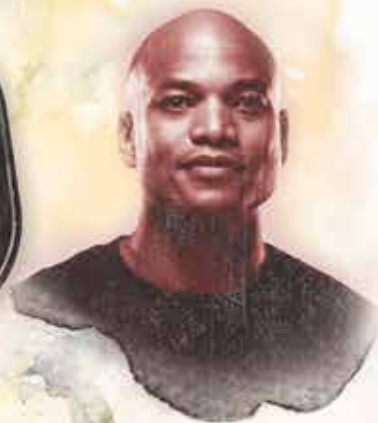

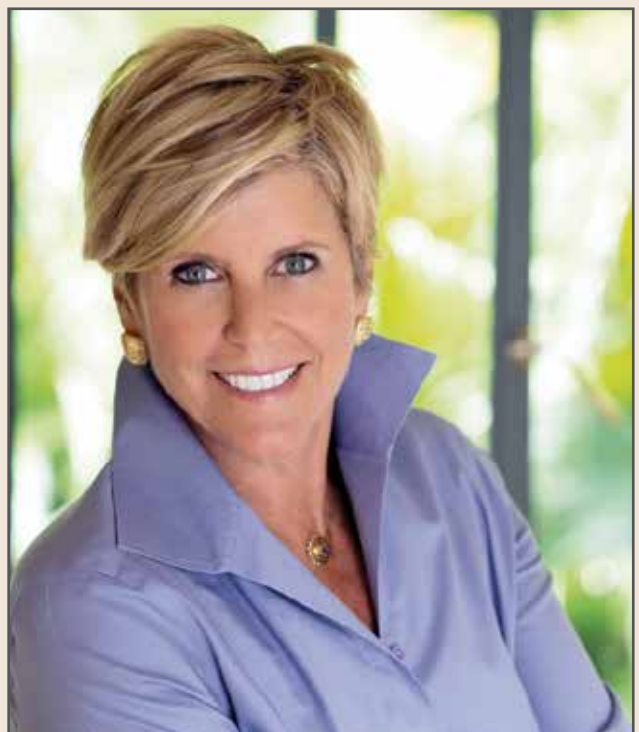

The half-hour show premieres on Thursday, May 1, at 8pm (7 MT), with an encore on Sunday, May 4, at 1pm (Noon MT).

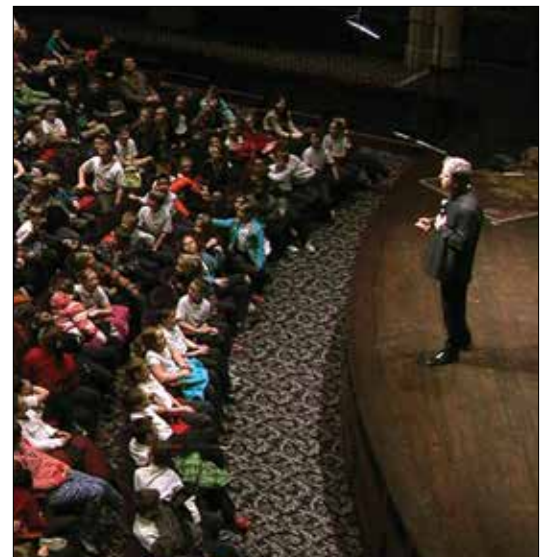
The episode includes:

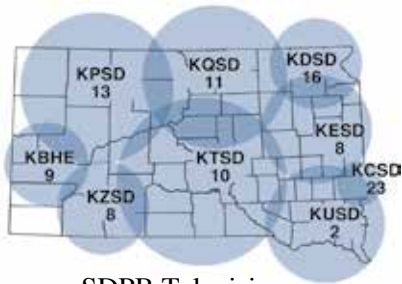

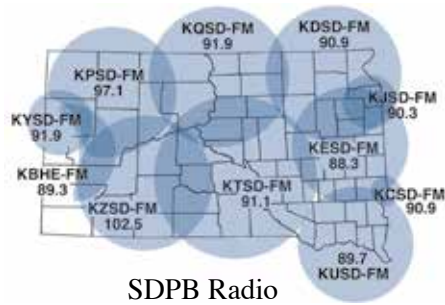
