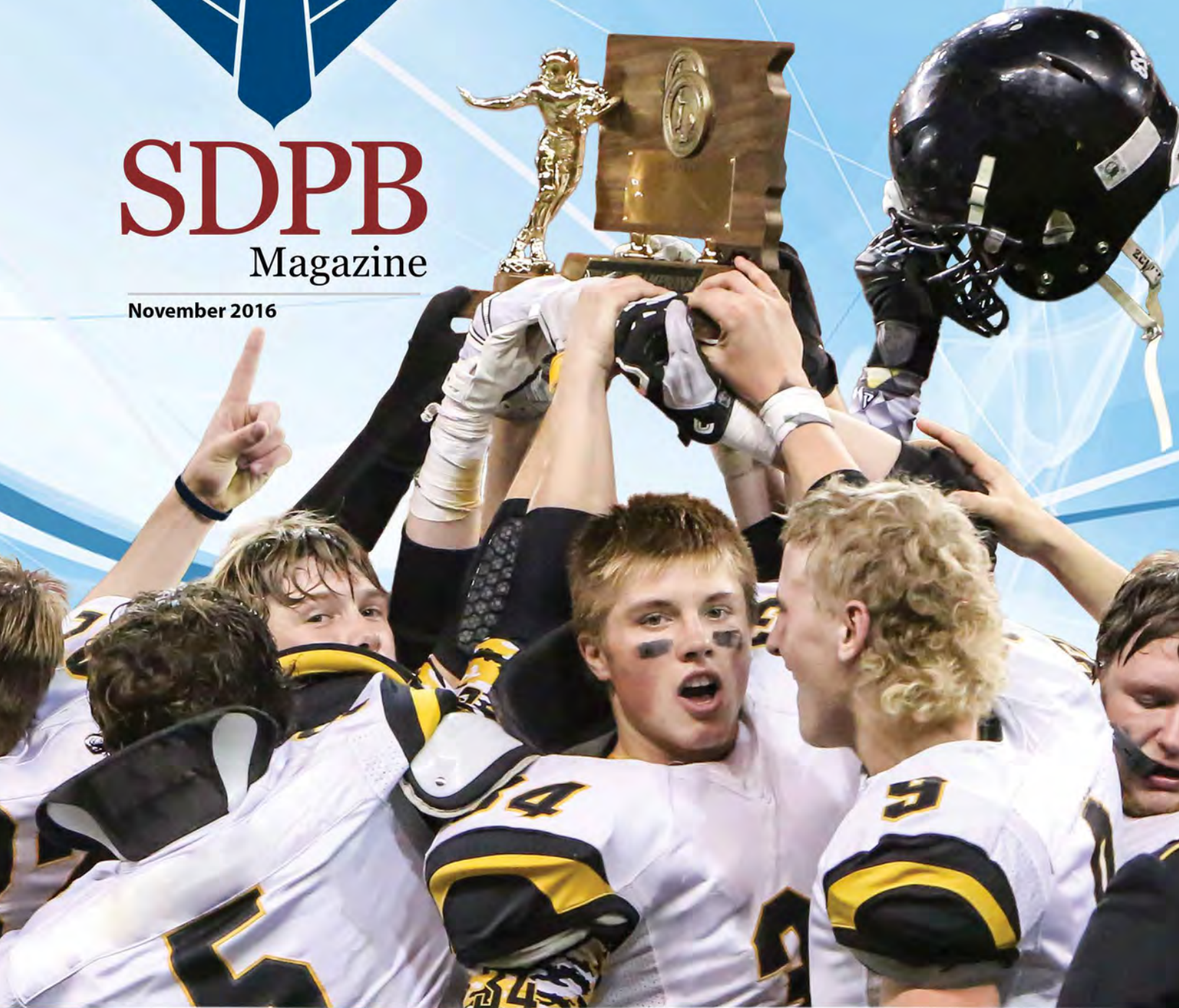

Stories from the Cutting Edge of Recorded Music

For eight nights beginning Monday, November 14, SDPB1 airs the highly anticipated television series *Soundbreaking: Stories from the Cutting Edge of Recorded Music*, an eight-part event that traces the nexus of cutting-edge technology and human artistry that has created the soundtrack of our lives.

Episode 1: The Recording Artist

Monday, Nov. 14 – 8pm (7 MT)

Profiles some of the most accomplished and revered producers in the recording industry, including George Martin and his work with the Beatles at Abbey Road and recording “Please Please Me,” “Yesterday,” & “Eleanor Rigby.” Includes interviews with Ringo Starr, George Martin, Brian Eno, Giles Martin, Rick Rubin & Tony Visconti. Also features the story of Dr. Dre as the most influential producer in hip hop and interviews with Questlove, Jimmy Iovine, RZA, Q Tip, & Dr. Luke, and includes Rick Rubin’s revitalization of Johnny Cash’s career in the 1990s, featuring the songs “Rusty Cage,” and “I Don’t Hurt Anymore.” Includes interviews with Rick Rubin, Johnny Cash, Rosanne Cash, & Tom Petty.

Episode 2: Painting with Sound

Tuesday, Nov. 15 – 9pm (8 MT)

Chronicles the moment when the recording studio itself effectively became an instrument and gave rise to sounds that could never be reproduced live. Features George Martin and the Beatles’ groundbreaking work on “I Saw Her Standing There,” “A Day in the Life” and others, as well as Brian Wilson taking the Beach Boys to new heights with *Pet Sounds*.

Eurythmics talk about recording their first album at home on a simple analog. Beck, Bon Iver, St. Vincent, tUnE-yArDs, and Nigel Godrich, producer of Radiohead, discuss recording in the digital age. Features songs like “Loser,” by Beck, “Bizness” by tUnE-yArDs and “Give up the Ghost” by Radiohead.

Episode 3: The Human Instrument

Wednesday, Nov. 16 – 9pm (8 MT)

Celebrates the most powerful of all instruments—the human voice—and surveys the range of ingredients that go into a perfect vocal track. Features rare studio footage of some of the world’s most renowned vocalists—from blues divas to suave crooners like Sinatra to rock star screamers. Profiles the recording of Adele’s hit “Rolling in the Deep” and how producers captured Amy Winehouse’s unique voice in-studio. Explores the use of Auto-tune and vocal manipulation by artists like Kanye West, Roger Troutman, and Cher.

Episode 7: Sound & Vision

Tuesday, Nov. 22 – 9pm (8 MT)
Tracks the music video from MTV to the internet and tells the story of how a one-time marketing tool became a powerful mediator between artist and audience.

Features artists who embraced video in the pre-MTV era, like David Bowie, The Beatles, Blondie and Devo, and the artists who made MTV what it was: Michael Jackson, Madonna and Eurythmics. Remembers Nirvana’s memorable taping during *The Unplugged* era.

Episode 4: Going Electric

Thursday, Nov. 17 – 9pm (8 MT)

Traces both the chain reaction unleashed by the invention of the electric guitar and the evolution of synthesized music. From Muddy Waters to B.B. King to The Rolling Stones and Jimi Hendrix, from Stevie Wonder and The Who to The Black Keys and electronic dance music, reveals the power of technology to continuously redefine what music is.

Episode 5: Four on the Floor

Friday, Nov. 18 – 9pm (8 MT)

Charts the progression of the beat from drum and bass to beatbox and beyond—from Little Richard and James Brown to disco and electronic dance music (EDM). Includes producing and recording Beyonce’s “Single Ladies,” and features 70s-era Chic, Donna Summer, and the Bee Gees, Blondie & Madonna, the sounds of the 80s, and the rise of EDM.

Episode 6: The World Is Yours

Monday, Nov. 21 – 9pm (8 MT)

Beginning with the pioneers of hip hop, including Afrika Bambaataa, Chuck D, and Rick Rubin, tracks how borrowing fragments from existing records created a new genre—a potent musical form that emerged from the margins, up-ended the establishment, and set in motion a controversy over copyright that has yet to be resolved.

Features Run-DMC and the first rap/rock single, “Walk this Way,” the rise of Public Enemy and the Beastie Boys.

Episode 8: I Am My Music

Wednesday, Nov. 23 – 9pm (8 MT)

From vinyl, cassette tape, CD, and MP3, each generation has had a piece of musical media to call its own—a way of listening that determines not only how and where we listen, but also the manner in which we collect, store, and share the music we love. Chronicles how Frank Sinatra invents the concept album with *In the Wee Small Hours*, Miles Davis and Marvin Gaye use the long-playing record for new kinds of expression, the story of Bob Dylan’s recording of “Like a Rolling Stone,” and The Grateful Dead and the rise of the bootleg cassette tape.

Dakota Life: Special Veterans Edition

In November, **Dakota Life** tells the stories of servicemen in and from South Dakota.

We visit Ft. Pierre to learn about Lt. Cmdr John C. Waldron. Waldron, born in Ft. Pierre in 1900, led a squadron of torpedo bombers that was shot down over the Pacific Ocean in the pivotal Battle of Midway in 1942. Waldron and the men he commanded were awarded the Navy Cross posthumously. The bridge from Ft. Pierre to Pierre crossing the Missouri is named for Waldron and the 1976 film *Midway*, starring Charlton Heston, Henry Fonda, and Pat Morita, features Waldron in the Battle of Midway, a crucial turning point in WWII.

We also travel to Spearfish to visit John Wilkinson, 93, who was a flight lieutenant (equivalent of captain in the U.S.) in the Royal Air Force during WWII. "When I'd get into that cockpit, I'd really become sort of one

with the machine," says Wilkinson. Learn more about John's piloting prowess of his Spitfire fighter.

And we also venture into the Black Hills National Forest, where we ride some of the 3,600 miles of roads and trails designated for Off Highway Vehicles (OHV) travel as the U. S. National Park Service system celebrates its 100th year.

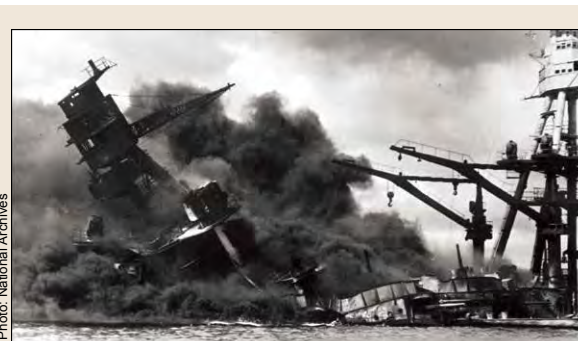

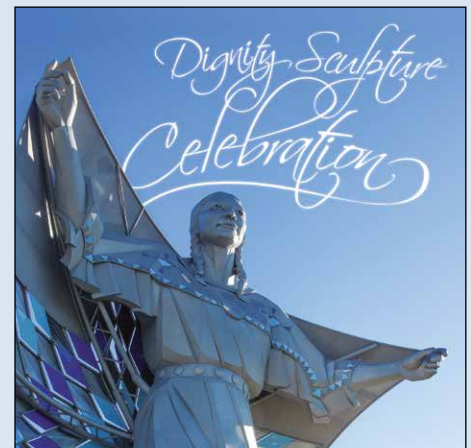

Medicine Women

New Documentary Features Native Women in Health Care

Princella RedCorn made a stirring personal discovery while researching the writings of Dr. Susan La Flesche Picotte, the first Native American doctor in the United States.

“Dr. Susan is from my tribe,” explains RedCorn. “I was reading her diaries and researching old photographs and a lot of my family was in them. She mentions she works on someone’s stomach and it was like my great-great grandfather. That was really exciting. It really brings history to life.”

RedCorn co-produced, with director Christine Lesiak, the new documentary **Medicine Woman**, a film that asks and seeks to answer the question of how to heal a people who continue to bear physical and psychological manifestations of historical trauma endured when families and ways of life are violently disrupted. Using Dr. Susan as a touchstone, RedCorn and Lesiak turn an intimate lens on her modern-day counterparts – Native women who live and work in their tribal communities as doctors and healers.

The relatives RedCorn read about were among the 1,200+ people for

whom Dr. Susan instantaneously became primary care physician upon her return to the Omaha Reservation in northeast Nebraska after completing medical school and a residency on the East Coast in 1889. Many of the personal and professional struggles she faced in the Victorian era remain today. “The women that we interviewed are mothers who work full-time in hospitals and health care and also have their own families,” says RedCorn. “The added component would be trying to help their own tribal community – combine all those forces for Native women and it’s like an extra thing to balance to help their communities. It’s very personal because these are people you interact with daily. It’s really involved.”

Medically, Dr. Susan saw the emergence of alcoholism on the Omaha Reservation. “But the struggles haven’t changed that much over the years,” says Lesiak. “Alcohol has expanded to include all kinds of drugs. Tuberculosis is no longer a problem, but diabetes is. Suicide is rampant in places like Standing Rock. Bottom line is that these medicine women are living and working in some of the poorest places in America. And yet the story we’re telling is surprisingly hopeful. Like Dr. Susan, these women have a confident, even joyful approach to the work of healing. And most

exciting, they’re learning new ways of healing that can help us all.”

RedCorn and Lesiak cite Dr. Lucy Reifel, a pediatrician on the Rosebud Reservation, as the closest modern-day match to Dr. Susan’s tenacious salutary spirit. “Dr. Susan was a doctor, advisor, translator, lobbyist, and spiritual advisor to her Omaha people,” says Lesiak. “Dr. Reifel is equally pivotal to her community. We filmed at her Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) clinic in Mission, SD and I believe she’s the most expansive, loving doctor I’ve ever seen in action.”

Dr. Reifel, who has worked alongside the Rosebud Sioux WIC mobile clinic since 1993, agrees she and Dr. Susan both dedicated their professional lives to the health care of their reservations, but she emphasizes the impact they’ve made on their communities outside their medical practices. “I coordinate a book giveaway program for infants and children, started a school district summer bookmobile, volunteer after school for Destination Imagination, and all of my kids attended public school here and excelled in sports, music, theatre, and many other extra-curricular activities,” says Reifel. “The balance is always challenging and seems best when the two can be interwoven. But for almost 37 years, I’ve lived and worked on Rosebud. Although my ‘jobs’ have been different, I have always been providing health care for children. I have saved some lives. I have helped many be healthier.”

Among those Dr. Reifel has helped is Casey, her adopted son. Dr. Reifel delivered Casey, who was born with Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, 30 years ago and emphasizes that Casey has equally enriched her family’s lives. “Because of Casey’s disabilities, all

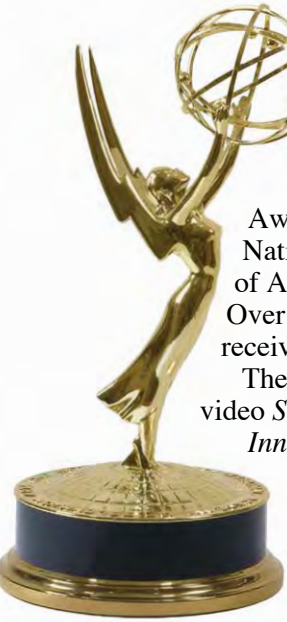

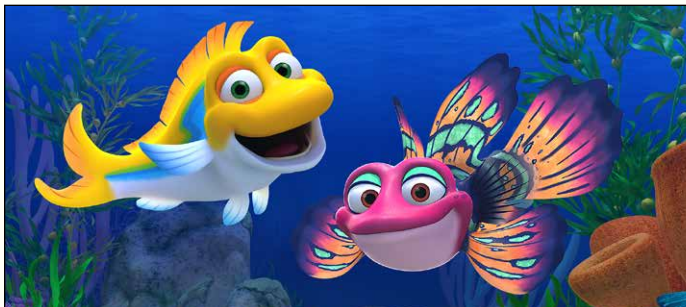

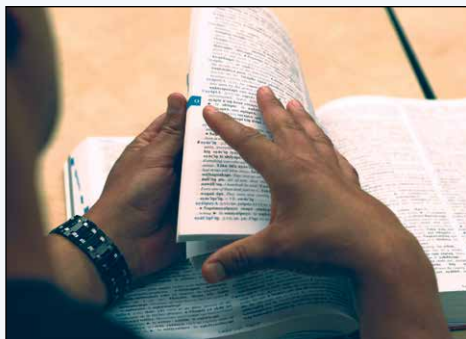

of his brothers and sister learned, while still very young, that Casey needed help doing some things,” says Reifel. “They were all children with compassion for, not fearful of, kids like Casey and have become adults who help and defend the handicapped.”

Medicine Woman presents women doctors and healers who perpetually navigate intersections of identity – gender, race, abilities, traditional and conventional medical practices – on the reservation and off. Another healer, Dr. Lori Arviso Alvord, whose autobiography *The Scalpel and The Silver Bear* accounts her quest to combine traditional Navajo healing techniques with her Stanford University surgical degree, had to overcome the Navajo taboo against touching the dead in order to get her medical degree. Alvord then returned to the healers of her tribe to learn “what a surgical residency could not teach me.”

What can the film teach us about what it takes to heal a people? RedCorn says the film provides a perspective on healthcare that's been left out of the mainstream. “This is the Native American woman's voice and their solutions to treating issues on the reservations. It's a holistic viewpoint that looks at a person as a whole and at the environment, as opposed to just treating a symptom or diagnosing a body part.” RedCorn and Lesiak underscore supporting women like Reifel, Alvord, and countless others who are already doing the work. “When you allow a tribe to practice and govern themselves, they can come up with their own solutions, incorporating traditional medicine into their hospitals,” says RedCorn. “Just understanding and respecting tribal sovereignty is a good step.”

The film is narrated by poet and musician Joy Harjo (Mvskoke) and Dr. Susan's letters, speeches and journals are voiced by actress Irene Bedard (Inupiat/Metis).

Medicine Woman airs on SDPB1 Sunday, November 13 at 10pm (9 MT) & Sunday, November 20 at 2pm (3 MT) and on SDPB2 Wednesday, November 16 at 8pm (7 MT).🐦

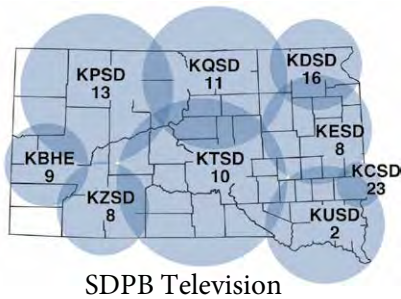

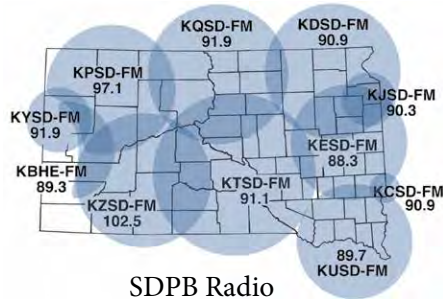
