Behl has received grants from the Bush and Griffith Foundations and the South Dakota Arts Council to support her artistic and teaching practices, which are rooted in traditional printmaking processes and works on paper.

"Coolidge: Rediscovering an American President" reveals a leader who offers urgent lessons for our age of inflation, exploding debt, and partisan rancor. A portion of the program was dedicated to Coolidge's time spent in South Dakota while in office - making Rapid City and Custer State Park the "western White House."
History	Images of the Past: Space Age South Dakota	12/28/2023	8:30pm CT	30 min	This documentary begins with the record-setting high-altitude balloon flights launched out of the Stratobowl in the Black Hills in 1934 and 1935 and how Raven Industries grew and continues to prosper as a leader in high-altitude platform technologies. We visit EROS and look at how the Earth Resources Observation Satellite network has contributed to knowledge of the Earth's surface. And we also speak with young South Dakotans just entering various fields in space science to learn their visions for the future of space exploration.

This threat is an insidious, impersonal villain – one that comes through TV sets and social media sites, through Tweets and comic strips and the daily news. The menace is the English language, and the victim seemingly marked for extinction is the Lakota language itself – the language of the Lakota nation, once usually called the Sioux. For the Lakota people, it’s a local problem, but it’s just one instance of a massive global one – a worldwide epidemic of language extinction.
