In Britain, he soon gained esteem as a television critic for THE OBSERVER, for which he wrote for 10 years, until venturing into the television world himself. In 1993, he released FAME IN THE TWENTIETH CENTURY, a PBS series examining film and television stars in the last 100 years, and in 1995, he brought us his innovative travel series, POSTCARDS. Despite television notoriety in Britain, James maintained his work in the literary medium, writing more than 20 books, essays and portraits in the coming years. Minneapolis Faces Its Future As Crews Prepare to Clean Up Bridge Collapse: Crews working to remove the debris from the Mississippi River following a bridge collapse in Minneapolis began moving in their heavy equipment on Monday.
