History - 902 - October

A South Dakota Guide ~ The New History Book - Pierre (Andersen)

Published in 2005, this book is a comprehensive look at SD history, published by the State Historical Society. It would be nice to see how this book was compiled and meet some of the people who worked on this huge project. This book is part of an effort to complete the Federal Writers' Project.

Black Hill Railroads: Then and Now - Black Hills (Patten)

The influences of the railroad on the Black Hills, the Northern Plains, and the American experience cannot be overstated. The railroads were the catalyst for the westward expansion, and for the development of the cities, the transportation routes, and other forms of commerce in the country that we know today. Good or bad, depending on a person's own heritage and experiences, the railroads and their employees have played a pivotal role in this region and the country.

Prairie Village – Madison (Hamersma)

Prairie Village in Madison...The buildings have been moved from neighboring towns and many of the local people in those towns have memories and stories of those buildings. For example, the Social Hall, moved from Oldham, was originally built as part of the Socialists movement (in the 1920s?) and on the name above the front door that reads "Social Hall" the remnants can still be seen. My father, Sid Packard, used to sell dime a dance tickets there on Saturday nights during the late 40s.

Agriculture - 903 - November

Heritage Museum - Brookings (Andersen)

Visitors to the State Ag. Heritage Museum will understand the important role of agriculture in South Dakota's past, present, and future. Located on the SDSU Campus.

Field to Table Program – Vermillion (Rissler)

This is a program to teach students in this area the process of farming. The man who conceived the idea and brought it to fruition is Ray Hall, a local farmer who uses his own money, seeds, equipment, land, etc...to put on this 2 day event on.

Sinte Gleska University Buffalo Herd - (Matoney)

A long time dream of SGU President Lionel Bordeaux, the SGU Bison Ranch was founded with 2 buffalo donated by the Montana Education Consortium in 1994. With no place to put the buffalo nor any way to transport them, they remained in Montana, a promise that fueled President Bordeaux's dream as he joked about going to get the buffalo and riding them along Interstate 90 to the Sicangu Homelands 600 miles east. In 1996, the Rosebud Sioux Tribal Council granted SGU 1,600 acres of land east of Mission, South Dakota, to be used as a new campus and the beginnings of the bison ranch.

The first 14 buffalo were brought to the Ranch in 1999 from Wind Cave National Park in the Black Hills. In 2000, SGU purchased 40 head of buffalo, and in 2002, ranchers donated 131 head of buffalo to the University.
