holiday is filled with wonderful and happy celebrations and traditions. Is both, a time to remember those who have passed on and also a time to celebrate life. The origins of Día de los Muertos can be traced back 3,000 years to an Aztec festival that was celebrated during the entire 9th month of the Aztec calendar. When Spanish Conquistadores arrived in modern-day Mexico, they tried to stop the celebration by moving the date to coincide with two holidays at the beginning of November: All Saint's Day and All Soul's Day. Over time, parts of both traditions blended together to become what we call Day of the Dead. Though it is around the same time as Halloween, Día de los Muertos is a different celebration

entirely.

Content: People tend to mentally classify environmental behaviors like recycling within

the domain of morality. Intentions in this area are not based on a thorough calculation (conscious or unconscious) of the balance of costs and benefits but are a function of beliefs in what is right or wrong. Altruistic behavior offers a more satisfying starting point for understanding recycling behavior in affluent industrial societies.

As an alternative to conventional waste disposal to prevent the waste of potentially useful materials and reduce the consumption of fresh raw materials, thereby reducing: energy usage, air pollution (from incineration), and water

pollution (from landfilling).
