4/1/07

Senators have given preliminary approval to a Bill extending protection to people using ATM or making night deposits at banks. The bill would make it a felony to use intimidation, force, or threat to steal from a person at or in the vicinity of an ATM, bank depository or other banking device. The Bill also makes it a misdemeanor for a person to panhandle, beg, or otherwise solicit money from people who are conducting transactions at such locations.

4/3/07

April is "Prevent Child Abuse Month" – an effort to help save children from injury, even death, at the hands of a parent or caregiver. This is the announcement of a new campaign called "Just One". The event, held today at the State House, is just one in a fundraising initiative to support child abuse and neglect training in each of South Carolina's 46 counties. The search for 14-year-old Victoria Caine is over tonight....This story obviously has a good ending but raises important questions about a system designed to help find missing children quickly. The Amber Alert System was *not* activated for Victoria Caine yesterday, a fact that troubles her father, William Caine. But officials say they follow strict guidelines on deciding when and *when not* to issue Amber Alerts. Florida Police issued a missing child alert for Victoria Caine saying she did not meet the Amber Alert criteria because she was considered a willful runaway. Jeff Moore, Executive Director of the SC Sheriff's Association, says it's import to have strict guidelines – "If we were to issue an Amber Alert for every missing child we would have about ten to twenty a day". Here in South Carolina Amber Alerts focus on motor vehicle abductions – generally, for kids under seventeen. Moore says the goal is to get the driving public to help police.

4/4/07

The Senate has approved a bill that would make first-degree arson – that results in death – a crime worthy of the death penalty. The bill, sponsored by Senator Greg Gregory of Lancaster is now on its way to the House.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**5/8/07**

A new effort to solve a serious problem in South Carolina Domestic Abuse. South Carolina is near the top of the list for domestic violence in this country. The state ranks 6th in The Nation and Law Enforcement Agencies get about 36 thousand domestic violence calls a year. In addition, some of those cases end up being deadly. The State Attorney General’s Office is teaming up with retail Giant Wal-Mart to help fight domestic abuse. You’ll see Wal-Mart’s investment in the effort while you shop Break The Silence was initiated in Wal-Mart stores in the Pee Dee Region during the first 3-months of the campaign organizers say the number of calls to the victim Hotline increase 60-percent. The message of hope has made its way to the Midlands. Organizers hope the response will take South Carolina off the list of States with the highest domestic violence rates. The Garners Ferry location is the first in the Columbia area to put the campaign into action.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**5/16/07**

It has called the Hummingbird and it is new technology that could help solve Midlands missing person’s cases. The Richland County Sheriff’s Department officially unveiled it today. The Kristen Foundation donated the “Hummingbird”. It can help find bodies in Lakes that could help solve two current missing people’s cases.” I’d love to find them both alive somewhere that’s what our goal would be but if we can’t I think we need to find them so we can bring them home and have closure for their families.” Hummingbirds’ cost \$1600 each. The Sheriff’s Department is the second agency in the country to have one donated. Richland County is buying one as well.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**5/16/07**

The “Saylor’s Bill” is an effort to impose safety standards for children who ride all terrain vehicles. Steve and Pam Saylor’s son Chandler died following an ATV accident. They’ve been fighting to get a law passed requiring kids to wear goggles and helmets, and take a safety class. The bill passed the House and Senate for year and for the second straight year Governor Sanford has vetoed the bill.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**5/29/07**

The Lexington County Sheriff’s Department is working to provide extra protection for domestic violence victims. They want to hire deputies to keep batterers away from victims while the case works through the judicial system. Major John Allard says more deputies will help reduce the recurrence of criminal domestic violence. The Department is pushing for a Federal grant to hire the specialized officers. He says they will work with victims who sometimes change their complaints or refuse to cooperate with authorities out of fear.

If you live in the Northeast side of Columbia, you have a reason to feel a little safer. Two new fire stations have opened in the Northeast. Fire Chief Bradley Anderson says one is on Two Notch Road near the Big Lots. The other is on Spears Creek Church Road. The Columbia fire Department’s mission is to protect lives, property and the environment in Columbia and Richland County.

Today State Attorney General Henry McMaster held a luncheon this afternoon to recognize attorneys who prosecute domestic violence cases without pay. McMaster created the Pro-bona program to provide prosecutors in domestic violence cases. Private attorneys can be trained and certified to work these cases. McMaster says the more prosecutors the better. McMaster has named Criminal Domestic Violence the number one crime problem in the state.

6/23/07

Kids of all ages made a splash in Lexington County today in the name of safety. Safe Kids Midlands and the swim lessons company teamed up to give free swim lessons. Drowning is the leading cause of death in children five and under. The Lexington County Sheriff's Department was also at the Palmetto Athletic Center to educate families and prevent drowning. With the July 4 holiday, approaching swimming expert Jim Reiser reminds parents to be overly attentive. Reiser says children need to continue their aquatic education and learn more than the basics. Every year nearly 800 children under 14 die in drowning related accidents.

Regarding the proposed ultrasound abortion bill, State Attorney General Henry McMaster voiced his opinion on the bill's legality to make sure everyone understands – "In my opinion, it would be illegal and improper for the state to force a person seeking an abortion to view an ultrasound image against her will. In my view, the courts would certainly rule such a requirement to be unconstitutional." McMaster suggests amending the bill to require doctors to explain and provide information in a manner that is more clearly consistent with the patient's prerogative to decline or refuse the information.

A bill to raise the state cigarette tax has cleared yet another hurdle tonight – the Ways And Means Committee is sending it to the full House for debate. If the bill being considered becomes law, it will cost smokers an extra \$3.00 per carton to light up. Kelly Davis represents the South Carolina Tobacco Collaborative – she says preventing kids from starting the addictive habit will prevent a lifetime of disease and possibly death. Some of the additional revenue from the tax would go to healthcare - \$70 million. 70 percent of voters told state lawmakers they support a higher cigarette tax. Davis sees adults ditching the habit as a positive thing – “As they’re cutting out smoking, people are spending their money in other places and if people spend their cigarette money elsewhere, that could drive some other part of the state’s economy.”
