### **Public Safety and Crime**

#### **WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**

**1/23/09**

A new era in law enforcement is now underway as local and state officers form a unique crime fighting partnership. Previous policy dictated SLED work separately from local law enforcement agencies on certain cases. Now they can all work together for more efficiency. Sheriffs call this a positive move.

#### **WACH FOX GOOD DAY**

**1/29/09**

Some local law enforcement agencies are teaming up to take crime out of schools. The Student Crimestoppers program allows young people to report a crime anonymously – and there is an incentive – students can also receive a cash reward for the information. Richland One Superintendent Dr. Percy Mack says this program will help make schools safer for children.

News from the Statehouse this morning – the House has given key approval to a bill that would allow lawyers access to their locked-up clients. The measure would require jail officials to let lawyers see their clients whenever they request it, unless there's a safety issue or jail lockdown.

**2/25/09**

A bill that aims to prevent children from being injured on all-terrain vehicles is up for discussion today in a House subcommittee. The bill bans children younger than eight from driving an ATV and limits the engine power for drivers between 8 and 16 years old. Governor Mark Sanford has repeatedly vetoed the safety legislation saying it infringes on private property rights.

**2/28/09**

There are more than 70 apartment complexes in Richland County and deputies are hoping to improve the quality of life for people who live there and we want to help. WACH FOX 57 is teaming up with the Richland County Sheriff's Department to award the "Silver Star of Safety" to apartment communities that meet certain standards. John Lakin lives in the Broad Road area at the Lexington Station Apartments – that complex is February's recipient of the Silver Star of Safety. The complex made changes after the Sheriff's Department made suggestions to help improve safety. Lyree Brown is the complex's property manager – she says they recently changed lighting fixtures, trimmed bushes, and paved the parking lot.

The Senate has given key approval to a bill that makes sex between students and teachers a felony. If passed, teachers who have sex with students 16 and older could be sent to prison for up to five years. While state law says 16-year-olds can consent to sex, the bill would make it illegal for school employees in supervisory roles to have sex with teenage students.

This is the Tornado Drill – Gilbert Elementary 4<sup>th</sup> graders practicing safety standards like evacuation and the "dick and cover". It's all part of Tuesday's statewide Tornado Drill. Tim Oswald is the school's Principal. The goal is make this trial run an easy-to-remember routine for Gilbert's 650 students – "It's a life threatening situation with a tornado, so it definitely can protect them and keep them safe".

**WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN****3/4/09**

South Carolina is ranked in the top ten for domestic violence and 6<sup>th</sup> in the nation for women who are killed from the abuse. According to the South Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault – nearly 40,000 cases of abuse were reported in 2002. Of those, more than 27,000 were by their ex-spouses or boyfriends.

**WACH FOX GOOD DAY****3/6/09**

Some Columbia police officers won't carry city cell phones and won't be able to take their patrol cars home as the city tries to make up for a projected 4 million dollar shortfall in it's general fund budget. City residents are concerned that the new changes will affect their safety. However, there is some good news – the Columbia Police Department will have nearly \$600,000 to buy new equipment for the force. The money comes from stimulus grants

Senate President Pro Tem Glenn McConnell has introduced a bill that would take the control of Statehouse Police away from the Governor. McConnell wants a new Capitol Police Force created. The move came after months of bickering with Governor Sanford about Capitol Complex security.

State Superintendent Jim Rex says there's good with the bad – "We have traction and we are making improvements. We still need to do much more, especially for some of the communities and districts in this state that have high concentrations of poverty." One of the initiatives Rex has taken to improve achievement in schools is creating the Palmetto Priority Schools Project. The Project singles out 16 schools in our state which have not met long-term student learning goals mandated in South Carolina's Education Accountability Act.

**1/30/09**

The Department of Health and Environmental Control says it needs an extra 7.5 million dollars to clean up gasoline-polluted sites that threaten drinking water in South Carolina. Due to budget cuts DHEC has already seen 32 million dollars cut from its funds. Officials say it will be difficult to find more money for clean-ups.

**1/30/09**

The House approved an abortion bill yesterday. It would require that women wait at least 24 hours after an ultrasound before getting an abortion. Critics argue the bill creates a burden, especially for poor, rural women. Supporters say the 24 hour wait would give women time to reflect on a decision.

Two local hospitals are working together to improve healthcare. Providence Hospital is supporting Lexington Medical Center's efforts to secure an open heart surgery program. An internationally known Claflin University biotechnologist has uncovered flaws in two drug tests used to identify marijuana use. Doctor Omar Bagasra says the test kits have an unacceptable high rate of giving false positives. Police across the US use these tests – Dr. Bagasra says it could clear people who are charged with drug offenses.

**2/20/09**

Health officials say influenza is spreading across South Carolina. The Department of Health and Environmental Control says the flu is now widespread in the state, with the most cases along the coast. Officials say 40% of the cases reported this year have been resistant to Tamiflu, a popular antiviral drug. According to DHEC, your best protection is through a flu shot.

**WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN****3/12/09**

Now a new spin on children's' fitness – the "Fun Bus" rolled into South Carolina last year and has been putting smiles on children's' faces ever since. According to the National Survey of Children's Health, 15 to 20 percent of children are obese in South Carolina. Health experts recommend at least 150 minutes of physical activity each week for elementary age children and 225 minutes for older children. The "Fun Bus" brings the fun to you – the nationally owned franchise is equipped with age appropriate games, obstacles and more. Fun Bus driver and owner Kevin Johnson knows the importance of teaching children active lifestyle lessons while they're young – "The earlier they learn to incorporate just basic exercising principals in their lives, the more likely they're going to continue throughout their lives." This year close to 200,000 women will find out they have breast cancer. While there is no cure or a guaranteed way to prevent it, there are things we can do to help stay healthy. A new USC study says exercise helps reduce the chance of getting the disease – and surviving it – and it doesn't take that much. Dr. Steven Blair says if you're physically active for two and hours per week – that's three 10 minute walks a day – your risk of dying from breast cancer lowers by 40 percent,

It will soon be more expensive to smoke. On April 1 a federal cigarette tax hike goes into effect, adding 62 cents to the per pack price, and South Carolina lawmakers are once again trying to raise the State cigarette tax, from its current 7 cents per pack to 57 cents per pack. The money from this tax hike would help pay for health care.

Councilman Paul Livingston says the new fee is \$10.00 per vehicle and \$15.00 per commercial vehicle and to give Richland County residents a little break council is lowering the restaurant hospitality tax by one-percent.

Some State lawmakers are outraged tonight after learning local governments need to make more budget cuts – in all, another 122 million dollars need to be slashed. Now legislators are trying to figure out how to recover from this shortfall. Representative Anton Gunn says "It's going to hurt things like trash pickup, police officers, being able to go to your parks and recreation – those are vital things in your community."
