A new survey says students, teachers, and parents like the idea of single-gender classrooms, and South Carolina is on the cutting edge of the concept. State Education Superintendent Jim Rex and other school officials crunched the numbers - the results of a two month study show 75% of parents would place their children in single-gender classes for the school year if that option were available. These past school year single-gender classrooms were already an option in Richland School District 2 - Dent Middle was one of 85 schools in the state making that part of the curriculum. The most recent survey also finds that female students say the single-gender experience increased their confidence and success, but as the grade level increased, the amount of girls or boys in favor of the single-gender classrooms went down. Nearly 250 schools in this state are expected to offer the single-gender classroom option in the coming year.

The State Education Department is working on the test to replace the Palmetto Achievement Challenge Test known as Pact. Lawmakers ordered the pact to be dropped earlier this year. The test has been criticized for failing to give enough details about individual students' strengths and weaknesses. The new test is supposed to be finished by the end of the year.

According to the State Education Department South Carolina students are racking up on scholarships. The Department says the class of 2008 earned a record 767 million dollars in college scholarships. The roughly 40,000 recent public school graduates received 83 million dollars more than last year's class.

School District Lexington-Richland Five Superintendent Scott Andersen has resigned. The board accepted his resignation at special meeting this morning. The board would not comment on why Anderson left his post. The resignation is effective tomorrow. Good and bad news for South Carolina's recent high school graduates. Seniors improved on the ACT college exam for the fifth year straight but are still below the national average on the test. The average score for the class of "08" was 19.9 on a 36-point scale. That is up from 19.6 from last year. Education officials say pre-testing has helped contribute to improved test results.

School Superintendent Jim Rex will start the new school year by touring classrooms across the state. Rex says during the tour he's encouraging lawmakers to revamp the current funding system calling it incomprehensible and unfair. Rex is also working to change the wording of what an education means in the state's constitution. Currently the state is required to offer students a "minimally adequate" education. Rex wants to see that change to "High Quality."

More than one-hundred college presidents are calling on lawmakers to lower the drinking age. Supporters say lowering the drinking age will help reduce binge drinking. The idea is already drawing sharp criticism. Mothers against drunk driving say lowering the drinking age will only lead to more fatal car accidents. Currently the United States has the oldest drinking age in the world.

Students in one Midland's School District could soon be in the classroom year-around. Lexington-Richland Five officials say if the district's 244 million dollar bond proposal fails year round, school will be their last resort to fight overcrowding. A new report says adult obesity rates across the nation are on the rise. According to the trust for America's health, adult obesity rates have increased in 37 states. Mississippi ranks as the nation's fattest state while South Carolina comes in at fifth with a 29 percent obesity increase rate.

If you live in Lexington County, health officials are urging you not to adopt wild animals. The Department of Health and Environmental Control say six people are being treated for rabies exposure after they tried to adopt a wild raccoon.
