Broadcast Date: July 1, 2020 **Source:** Local Officials

Description: Deputies prep for July 4th

We spoke with Captain Adam Myrick with Lexington County Sheriff's Department about how they were preparing for the holiday weekend. He said that there would be a lot more staff and officials present at the lake and surrounding areas. He said that there would be a paramedic on boats to respond to any medical situation. Myrick reminded everyone to have a plan that they will stick to in case something happens to them. Health officials warned people to practice social distancing and wear a mask.

Richland County Sheriff Leon Lott announced that deputies would begin wearing patches that say, 'peace officer'. This came after a month of protests around the world to stop police brutality. Lott said this is a way for people to know that the department is transitioning to guardian and peace policing.

Description: Richland County Mask Ordinances

Starting on this day, Richland County began enforcing its mask ordinance. In an effort to stop the spread of coronavirus, local government passed an ordinance that people were required to wear a mask when in public and near other people. The fine for not wearing a mask was between \$25-\$100.

Description: Gun Locks

After two Midlands children accidentally shot themselves, Richland County Sherriff's Department gave away free gun locks to the public that to help promote firearm safety and awareness. Gun locks are mechanisms that prevent the trigger of the gun from being able to be pulled and discharge the weapon. In addition to distributing the locks, Deputies also talked with attendees and showed them how to properly use the gun locks.

Description: Safety Plan for BLM Rally

After the shooting of an unarmed black man in Wisconsin, organizations like BLM SC planned to hold a rally to demand racial justice and to encourage people to vote. Columbia law enforcement was approving of them plan but wanted to make sure things did not turn violent like they did in May. Law enforcement met with the organizations and made a plan that encourage the protest and prevented violence.

Description: Camden Man uses crash to help others

A man from Camden was hit in a head-on collision and almost died. Emergency responders had trouble identifying him and contacting his family because his emergency contacts were not set up on his phone. He then used his experience as a way to caution others to have their emergency contacts correctly set up.

Description: I-Team: Children Gun Safety

To raise awareness and to caution gun owner against leaving their guns unsecured a local mother spoke about losing both her son and her fiancé in the same day. The son, 2, found an unsecured gun in the home and accidentally shot himself in the head. The boy's father (mother's fiancé) soon found their son and proceeded to take his own life with the same gun. The mother hopes that her tragic loss will help others to be more mindful and cautions about firearms in their home.

After recently noticing a pattern of violent offenders being re-arrested for crimes while out on bond, we dove further into the topic of bail bonds. One man, for example, was out on bond for murder when he used a child as a human shield during a shootout with Lexington deputies. The story shed light on issues with the bail bond system and how it is actually legal to let people out on bond even for violent crime because they are considered innocent until proven guilty at trial.

SCDC officials announced that they would be requesting that state lawmakers help find a more effective and thorough way to use cell-phone jamming in prisons throughout the state.
