Charleston-based Darkness To Light estimates 20,000 state teachers now know how to prevent, identify, and react to child sexual abuse. 40% of South Carolina teachers are trained to identify child sexual abuse. That's more than any other state.

This evening 200 girls from USC will learn some self defense. The Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity there has organized the event to teach young women how to protect themselves. The "Take Defense" program was started in 2004 after the murder of Jessica Kemp. So far more than 20,000 girls have taken the class.

10/20/09

Columbia leaders are coming together to fight gang violence. The Benedict College Center of Community Development and the National District Attorneys Association hosted local politicians, law enforcement, and other community members at the National Advocacy Center today. The group discussed forming a gang and Youth Violence Prevention Council to lead the effort.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**10/30/09**

October is Domestic Violence Awareness month and Midlands officials continue to spread the word. Sistercare is recognizing the Lexington County Sheriff's Department because it's the 10th anniversary of the county's criminal domestic violence court, or CDVC. Authorities say this court has changed the focus of domestic violence prosecution from a traditional, passive, approach to an active approach that emphasizes victim safety, offender accountability, and batterer treatment opportunities.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**10/31/09**

Tracking sex offenders gets a little easier thanks to the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division. The South Carolina Law Enforcement Division said it's introducing a new online program where people can log on and see map of registered offenders near any address they enter. The new program, called Offender Watch, brings up a map showing color photographs of registered offenders, along with the details of their offenses and previous addresses.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**11/1/09**

Law enforcement statistics show the number of concealed weapons permits issued in South Carolina is up this year. Concealed weapons permits issued by SLD totaled more than 28,000 as of mid-October – that's 14,000 permits more than last year. The state also reported that permits rose about the same among men and women between 2005 and 2008.

COPS**11/7/09**

Police go after a bank robber in a car chase through Las Vegas; an armed man in San Bernardino County, Cal., calls the cops and threatens to shoot innocent bystanders near his apartment.

AMERICA'S MOST WANTED**11/14/09**

In northern New Jersey, John Walsh joins the hunt for a drug kingpin and an aspiring DJ wanted for attempted murder. Also: an arrest in the case of a Georgia madam who allegedly had a client killed. Featured fugitives include a suspect in an Oakland double murder; an accused arsonist; and a convicted child molester.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**11/16/09**

Unlicensed drivers – they're many of the motorists you pass each day . . and they pose a deadly problem. An AAA Carolinas study shows more than 800 fatal accidents happened in South Carolina from 2001-2005 involving unlicensed drivers. Corporal Paul Brothers with the SC highway patrol says it's become fairly routine during a traffic stop, or at checkpoints, to find an unlicensed motorist. And the danger these drivers can cause is not just on the roadway – “unlicensed drivers are uninsured drivers. It affects you if your are involved in a situation – your insurance has to help you cover from that loss.”

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**11/24/09**

Hate crimes are on the rise in South Carolina. According to the FBI's annual report, last year 153 hate crimes were reported. That's an increase from the 127 reported in 2007. South Carolina is one of five states that does not have a law that allows suspects to be charged with hate crimes.

WACH FOX NEWS REPORT**11/24/09**

As Black Friday approaches you might have some holiday shopping on the agenda but when you're out looking for all those deals, pay attention, because plenty of crooks are out there looking for a five-finger discount. Richland County deputies putting on a mock robbery in Columbia, teaching residents to keep their eyes open. Officers say be aware of your surroundings at ATMs because that's where most armed robberies are likely to occur – "When you are going to the ATM, be prepared, have the exact money that you know you want to get out, have your card in your hand, have everything prepared – don't be a target."

WACH FOX NEWS REPORT**11/24/09**

With the holiday shopping season officially kicking off Friday, some Midlands groups are warning about hidden toy hazards. The annual Toy Safety Survey results are out tonight. It offers safety guidelines and provides examples of potential hazards. Choking is a particular concern. Cassie Price with Palmetto Health Children's Hospital says if you can fit a toy in a toilet paper roll, you child can choke on it.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**12/10/09**

Gang violence is on the rise in South Carolina. That's according to a report released by the Department of Public Safety Wednesday. Officials say the number of known gang murders increased from zero in 1998 to 21 in 2001. The number of inmates who were in gangs also spiked 184% from June of 2000 to 2008

AMERICA'S MOST WANTED**12/12/09**

An update on the child-sex case involving evangelist Tony Alamo, who was convicted in July 2009 of transporting minors across state lines for the purpose of illegal activity. But one of his wanted associates, John Kolbeck, is still at large. Other featured fugitives include Los Angeles murder suspects Jesus Catalan and Jose Luis Saenz. (Saenz is on the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list.) Also: a report on the capture of Berkeley, Cal., triple-murder suspect Rafael Campbell.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**12/17/09**

Good news for local law enforcement this morning, Columbia police officers getting more crime fighting tools, the City Council, accepting a \$94,000 federal grant. The police department will use the money to buy 60 tasers, along with training equipment to teach officers on how to use them. Police spokesman Brick Lewis says the tasers can potentially help save lives.

US Attorney Walt Wilkens is giving the company two years to get in compliance with federal practices. He also says the company has agreed to pay the government \$1.5 million to settle pending claims. Last fall federal agents rounded up hundreds of illegal immigrants at Columbia Farms' Greenville facility.

Camden Elementary students opening a piece of history today. The group will open a 25-year-old time capsule. The capsule will contain lists of favorite songs, library books and yearbook pictures, all dating back to 1984.

10/15/09

Taking a look at education this morning, some news that some might find encouraging – others, discouraging – for South Carolina. State students show little improvement in math, but they're not losing ground. According to the latest report from the National Assessment of Education Progress, South Carolina 4th graders score three points below the national average, 8th graders, two points below the national average. In both cases the performance is not significantly different from 2007. With that being said, parents from now until November 8th you have a chance to weigh in on your child's reading material. Textbooks that could be used in South Carolina public schools are on display. You can check out the books by visiting Columbia International University or Columbia Converse College. At each site you can fill out a review telling education leaders what you think. State Board of Education will review those comments before deciding whether to adopt materials.

10/11/09

Today several kids from across the Midlands spent their day traveling through the pages of their favorite storybooks. The annual Read and Romp Family Literacy benefit event was held at the State Museum. The event offered children the chance to engage in fun learning-based activities, all themed around children books. The kids also got; the chance to meet several local celebrities, including Cocky, the USC mascot. And for the parents – they say it was a chance to get a jump start on reading and preparing their child for success. This marks the 5th year for the Read and Romp event

10/20/09

Some Midlands parents are back in class – but this time, they're not learning math –they're focusing on their children. These folks are attending "The parenting with love and logic" workshops at Gilbert Primary School. The five session class teaches ways of working with children that puts parents and teachers back in control.

Have you heard the WWE comes to Ridgeview High School? Three entertainers from the World Wrestling Entertainment are in town to celebrate Teen Read Week at the school. Teen Read Week is a national adolescent literacy initiative. Today's visit kicks off Ridgeview's Wrestlemania Reading Challenge.

What's going on with climate change? The government is giving USC five million dollars to find out. Students will use the money to study whether carbon dioxide can be stored underground to keep greenhouse gases from affecting global warming. School officials say the grant will focus on the underground deep saline aquifers in Beaufort Colleton and Jasper counties.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**10/21/09**

Are South Carolina public schools breaking the bank? New numbers say yes. According to the State Office of Research and Statistics schools received a 5% increase in government funds, compared to 2008. That's more than \$8 million. However, officials say the cash isn't actually making it into the classroom. But new reports say the 85 K-12 schools are exceeding their annual rate of spending – despite news of local and state budget cuts. So, where is the cash going? Well, the money trail points to “school and district administration” along with classroom instruction.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**11/1/09**

A rededication ceremony was underway for Sanders Middle School today. Folks enjoyed a school tour, student performances, and remarks by the school's first principal. Richland School District One renovated the former Keenan High School for Sanders students and staff who moved onto the campus in August.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**11/1/09**

An uncertain enrollment forecast has some Richland District Two parents hoping for clearer skies. This fall the District welcomed close to 750 additional students. What's unfair to the parent is the uncertainty of where the students will go. That has Stephen Gilchrist looking for solutions. He recommends another charter school, like the Hope Academy. District Two spokeswoman Theresa Riley says change is still coming. Riley says construction for several new Richland Two schools are in the works – the plan includes four elementary, one middle school, and one high school. All are scheduled to open by 2012.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**11/10/09**

Allen University is celebrating something new on the historic campus. The school has completed six new or renovated facilities. Over the last two years Allen has retrofitted the former cafeteria into a the new Sons of Allen Chapel, renovated the Gibbs Science Hall and Chapelle Administration Building, and converted an old strip mall into the new Campus Mall housing a new student cafeteria, bookstore and career center, among other things.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**11/11/09**

Thousands of students invaded the Carolina Coliseum to attend the District's Annual College and Career Expo. They got the chance to network with college representatives and military officials. The students also received information about financial aid.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**11/16/09**

In education news this morning – a unique school program is getting more popular in South Carolina – single gender classes. Statewide, more than 5,000 students take part, and as Jerrita Patterson reports, a new survey indicates more parents would like their kids in the program. Killian Elementary Principal Eric Brown is using a new game plan, and more than 150 other SC schools are doing the same. Single-gender classes get a passing grade from students and teachers. Killian has had the program for four years. State Education Superintendent Jim Rex says it has shown promising results – “We’ve said for a long time – all children are different. They’re all individuals, but the genders have some differences also.” Differences in how they learn. Instructors say the boys are more active, while the girls enjoy more dialogue. In addition to this initiative, students can participate in several programs like middle or early college programs and night high school.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**11/25/09**

Bad news for South Carolina High Schools. New numbers show state students are slipping on exit exams. According to the Education Department roughly 3 of every 4 students passed the state exam on their first attempt this year. The 76% pass rate is down from last year’s nearly 81% tally. 2008’s passing rate was the highest in state history. Spokesman Jim Foster suggests budget cuts may be to blame, but there could be other factors.

WACH FOX GOOD DAY**12/15/09**

Thousands of South Carolina high school students got some college classes out of the way for taking advanced placement tests in 2009. Nearly 15,000 students scored well enough to earn college credit – a record for the state. The percentage of students to earn college credit increased to 57%.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN**12/18/09**

New test results show nearly 60% of South Carolina high school students lack a basic understanding of US history and the founding principles of American government. A spokesman for South Carolinians for Responsible Government, a group that promotes school choice, says the test scores show public school students aren’t getting the basic knowledge necessary for them to be productive in society. State education officials acknowledged the scores were low, but say first year results were also worse than expected when the state implemented end-of-course tests in other subjects several years ago.

Not everyone can be the smartest – somebody has to come in last, and sadly, many times. South Carolina is the last state standing. However, we're not dead last in a new study – but we are in the Top 10 - - for the least brain healthy states in America. These evaluations were based on diet – physical and mental health and social well being of the residents.

WACH FOX NEWS AT TEN

10/7/09

Here's new information based on research here in Columbia. A USC study finds people going through stressful periods don't necessarily reach out for comfort foods – cake, chips or soda. Instead, researchers say those are times when people are most open to change – some even choosing healthier foods and lifestyles. The study found increased levels of stress and change correlated with a person's tendency to pick unfamiliar products, so that might rule out those familiar comfort foods which can often be fast or fried foods.

10/7/09

Some discouraging news about HIV rates. New numbers show they're ten times higher in African Americans than whites. University of North Carolina researchers say this is despite billions in government and private spending to fight the virus. According to the Centers for Disease Control, an estimated 45% of new HIV infections in 2006 were blacks.

10/12/09

Out to raise awareness was the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. A 5K walk was held earlier to also raise money for the organization. More than 32,000 people in the US die by suicide every year, and it's the country's 11th cause of death. One mother, who lost her son earlier this year to suicide says prevention is the key.

10/18/09

A startling report about the future of the Palmetto State, that may help you push away from the dinner table. A study by the United Health Foundation shows within ten years almost half of South Carolina residents will be obese. Doctor Ken Thorpe estimates more than 48% of South Carolinians will be clinically obese by 2018. Those estimates will mean higher health care spending for you and the government. The Reports says, since the mid 1980's, one third of increased healthcare costs can be linked to growing obesity rates.

Host Chris Wallace talks with Dr. Bernadine Healy, the first woman to head the National Institutes of Health, about the fight over health care reform this week, two new cancer screening studies became part of the argument. First, a government task force recommended women delay starting routine mammograms from age 40 to age 50. And then an association of medical

experts said women could delay their first screening for cervical cancer until age 21 and then be re-screened less often.
