"What's Up Utah" a weekly half-hour program hosted by Greg Johnson, is directed toward the needs and concerns of our Utah Community. The program airs twice per week. This 3rd Quarter of 2013, the subjects included Neighborhood Watch...Local youth driven activities...and the mobilizing local communities and organizations to come together in the protection of children, youth, schools, neighborhoods, and communities keeping our children in a safe learning environment....a discussion about handling finances during our present economy.....an interview with 3 candidates running for public office in the Layton community...tips on how to make your dentist your friend ...and a program discussion on the vastness of and dangers of human trafficking.

July 3 , 2013

Airing Wednesdays at 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm, WHAT'S UP UTAH presented an interview with Ken Mulholland. The host Greg Johnson discussed with Ken a program called Transitions to help people leaving the LDS church to understand traditional Christianity. Transitions is offered to anyone interested for a reasonable cost on their website: ldstransitions.com.

Week of July 10, 2013

Airing on WHAT'S UP UTAH, Wednesdays 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm Neighborhood Watch...Local youth driven activities...and the mobilizing local communities and organizations to come together in the protection of children, youth, schools, neighborhoods, and communities keeping our children in a safe learning environment, we featured a rerun of the program with Tibby Milne and Police Sargeant Pat Evans in a discussion about local crime prevention. Ms Milne is the founder of the Utah Council of Crime Prevention Training for Utah. Among the topics discussed: Neighborhood Watch...Local youth driven activities...and the mobilizing local communities and organizations to come together in the protection of children, youth, schools, neighborhoods, and communities keeping our children in a safe learning environment with the DARE Program taught by a officers in each city throughout the state of Utah.

Sgt Evans, from the Draper City Police Dept. discussed the efforts of trying to equip parents to engage in meaningful conversations with teens re: moral conduct, drinking, and drugs.

Week of July 17, 2013

Dealing with Autism is the discussion on this week's What's Up Utah program which airs Wednesdays 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm. Christopher Lindsey and Stephanie Nilsen were guests who discussed the different factors that can influence Autism and the discouraging news that there is no known factor that causes this problem. Nilsen is the director of a school for kids with Autism. The talked about how their school is designed to meet the unique needs of kids dealing with Autism, and how they can help them become more successful later in life.

Week of July 24, 2013

This week on What's Up Utah, which airs on Wednesday from 9:30pm – 10pm and Friday from 7pm – 7:30pm, featured an interview with former NFL Football player Luther Ellis. The focus of this weeks program was to discuss Luther's financial difficulties and to discuss how to better manage one's personal finances. Luther is a sad statistic when it comes to former NFL players who make phenomenal money while playing and then end up bankrupt when their careers stop but their spending does not. This program consisted of a good teaching to our viewers about being committed to wise spending, budgeting, and getting financial counseling for any kind of financial difficulties.

Week of July 31, and August 7, 2013

This week on What's Up Utah, which airs on Wednesday from 9:30pm – 10pm and Friday from 7pm – 7:30pm, features interviews with three candidates for public offices in the city of Layton. Grace Stevenson who is running for mayor, Joy Petro and Thomas Day who are running for city council were all asked about their experiences growing up in Layton and why it is so important to them that new officials are elected. They discussed how some of those who are currently in the mayoral and city council positions are disrespectful toward and neglectful of the people of Layton. They also talked about a new law that developers are trying to pass that they feel will reduce the amount of farm land, discourage home buying and will increase the transient population without producing jobs.

Week of August 14, 2013

This week's What's Up Utah program featured Mike Tunnel the author of the book "Candy Bomber". The book tells the true story of a post WWII pilot who brought candy to the kids in West Berlin. The story teaches about love and sacrifices and human kindness in the worst situations.

The Week of August 21, 2013

WHAT'S UP UTAH, Wednesdays at 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm, featured Shiloh and Kimberly Jessop. Shiloh told his story of life growing up in a polygamous family. He explored the historical background, history and an understanding of the different practices and life styles of polygamous communities. He told about his experiences leading up to and after his departure from his family.

His wife Kimberly talked about their new work of going to the Philippines and working with the victims of the human sex slave trafficking.

Week August 28, and Sept 4, 2013

How to make your dentist your friend...was the topic of WHAT'S UP UTAH. Local dentist Dr. Randy Stucki represented the dentists in our area as he gave advice to those who "hate to go to the dentist". He discussed how to alleviate the fears and anxiety people have over going to a dentist and the reasons for that fear of injections and drilling. He also told about the advances in new techniques and material used to make the dentist trip less intimidating. He offered sound advice over the importance of proper dental hygiene and preventive maintenance to prevent "big problems and big bucks". In discussing ethics in dentistry he encouraged the viewers to get second opinions...get referrals from friends over

which dentist to go to... to question your dentist in advance about treatment over materials used and costs of procedures...and gave a web site for checking out dentist's reputation and complaints through the Department of Professional Licensing.

Week of September 11, and 18, 2013

This week on What's Up Utah, which airs on Wednesday from 9:30pm to 10:00pm and Fridays from 7:00pm to 7:30pm, features host Greg Johnson and a interview with Paul Mero from Sutherland Institute. Greg and Paul spoke about how Sutherland Institute is a conservative think tank for Utah. They discussed their involvement with informing the public about the latest political policies and how they affect the public.

The Week of September 25, 2013

This week on What's Up Utah, which airs on Wednesday from 9:30pm to 10:00pm and Fridays from 7:00pm to 7:30pm, and features host Greg Johnson. This week Greg interviewed Brad Manuel who is the Executive Director with Operation 61. Operation 61 is a ministry that works with people who are victims of human trafficking. The goal of the ministry is to bring awareness to the public and get legislation changed to help the victims. Brad also promoted a ¹/₂ marathon that raises awareness and money for the ministry.

KTMW produces and airs a number of live local produced studio productions each week. Each program has open phone line available for viewers to call-in to talk with the host and guests to ask questions or make comments. Among the programs are:

"This Week in the Word" Mondays 11am and repeated at 8pmwhich includes a discussion between several local area Church Ministers dealing subjects of interest to the local Christian Community. Promotion of the up-th coming MY HOPE AMERICA ...with Billy Graham that will air on this station. During the program, the pastors also discuss verse by verse different bible passages and how it relates to us today. They also discussed this year's "Worship 2013" an annual local area music concert that takes place on the State Capitol Grounds. During this past quarter, they are studying the book of John and how the teachings affect our daily lives today. They also discuss the weekly activities planned in the local area churches. Phone lines are open for questions and comments from local viewers.

Wednesdays 8pm the hour long live studio program "Ancient Pathways", hosted by Jason Wallace, brings in local people for discussions of different issues of concern to Utah people today. They have discussed many issues from racialism to areas of dealing with Christianity and Mormonism, living in a Mormon community...including guest Martin Tanner...KSL radio's religion talk show host. Callers are encouraged to call to add to the discussion or voice opposition or ask questions.

Thursdays 8pm Doris Hansen hosts "What Love is This" dealing with people involved in polygamy. Each week the program has people on the program who have been involved in various polygamy communities around Utah. Several woman guests openly described the physical abuse they've received while involved in the groups. They also described what led up their departure and escape. Phone lines are open for viewers to call in questions or comments during the program. Each week there has been a different guest and a different area of concern.

In addition to the above list of local live studio programs originating here at KTMW, we also air other local originated programs. They include programs from Faith Baptist Church in Layton, UT; Calvary Chapel of St. George, UT; Miracle Rock Church, Salt Lake; Jesus is the Way Church, West Valley City;

View of Zion; Thinking Allowed; Have you Experienced Jesus...a local manon- the- street type interview show.

KTMW airs daily programs dealing with health problems and issues a 60 minute network program called "Your Health" where Dr. Richard and Cindy Becker open the phone lines for viewers to call-in, many from our local viewing audience, and ask health questions.

KTMW also airs as a public service a program by Doug Kaufman "Know the Cause" where Doug and his guests discuss vital health issues.

A new program that airs weekly at 9:30pm, "Advisor's TV", hosted by businessman, entrepreneur and financial advisor Alan Joselyn, teaches the importance of and how to obtain quality successful relationships in all area of your life...including marriage, financial, business, and friendships.
