

ISSUES AND PROGRAM LISTS FOR 2nd QUARTER 2013

“What’s Up Utah” a weekly half-hour program hosted by Greg Johnson, is directed toward the needs and concerns of our Utah Community. The program airs twice per week. This 2nd Quarter of 2013, the subjects included local crime prevention, with a visit with the founder of the Utah Council of Crime Prevention... Immigration and border control... a discussion about gay marriage and its affects on the families...children’s rights... polygamy...human trafficking...GED studies... and an introduction to a youth oriented career and business training program called Jr. Achievement.

On the national level, Utah Congressmen Rob Bishop appeared to discuss the important Utah issue of Hill Air Force Base, as well as other issues of concern to the people of Utah.

The Week of April 3, 2013

WHAT’S UP UTAH, Wednesdays at 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm, featured Shiloh and Kimberly Jessop. Shiloh told his story of life growing up in a polygamous family. He explored the historical background, history and an understanding of the different practices and life styles of polygamous communities. He told about his experiences leading up to and after his departure from his family.

His wife Kimberly talked about their new work of going to the Philippines and working with the victims of the human sex slave trafficking.

Week of April 10, 2013

Airing on WHAT’S UP UTAH, Wednesdays 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm , we featured Tibby Milne and Police Sargeant Pat Evans in a discussion about local crime prevention. Ms Milne is the founder of the Utah Council of Crime Prevention Training for Utah. Among the topics discussed: Neighborhood Watch...Local youth driven activities...and the mobilizing local communities and organizations to come together in the protection of children, youth, schools, neighborhoods, and communities keeping our children in a safe

learning environment with the DARE Program taught by a officers in each city throughout the state of Utah.

Sgt Evans, from the Draper City Police Dept. discussed the efforts of trying to equip parents to engage in meaningful conversations with teens re: moral conduct, drinking, and drugs.

Week of April 17, 2013

This week on WHAT'S UP UTAH, host Greg Johnson and guest Rachel Johnson – Canyon Ridge AG Church discusses her book “Gods Girl” and the “Not for Sale” convention and the morale issues of teen girls are facing in this generation.

Week of April 24, 2013

Airing on WHAT'S UP UTAH, Wednesdays 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm , featured host Greg Johnson and guest Pastor Steve Peterson on the show discussing the importance of prayer in our State and Nation. The National Day of Prayer, we pray for our President, leaders, businesses, military, Utah State representatives, media and family and children of our state and country.

Week of May 1, 2013

WHAT'S UP UTAH, Wednesdays at 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm, featured Laura Bunker-Director of United Families Utah, Mary Summerhays-Chairman of the Board of Utah Celebration of Marriage and Amelia Summerhays thirteen year old daughter.

A discussion on the topic of marriage being between a man and a women. The implications that same sex marriages can have on families, small businesses, society and the law of protecting the child's rights to have a relationship with their parent. Statistics are showing that boys that are raised without a father increasing their risk of being involved in criminal activity, drugs and alcohol abuse.

Amelia gave her powerful declaration that children in Utah and in the world deserve to be raised in a heterosexual upbringing. She stands very strongly in supporting the United Families of Utah.

Week of May 8

Bishop, Utah congressman since 2003 is on several committees of special interest to people in Utah. Among them are: Public Lands, Federalism, and the committee on Military Issues. Among the discussion, Bishop spoke about immigration and the controlling of our borders...the 10th amendment...Utah's concern about our public lands, and of vital importance the continue functioning of Hill Air Force base and the readiness of our nation's military.

May 29, 2013

Eric specifically brought attention to their Good Neighbor program that help people earn their GED. They also talked about the 6 million in scholarships that is currently available.

June 26, 2013

Airing Wednesdays at 9:30pm and Fridays at 7:00pm, WHAT'S UP UTAH presented an interview with Ken Mulholland. The host Greg Johnson discussed with Ken a program called Transitions to help people leaving the LDS church to understand traditional Christianity. Transitions is offered to anyone interested for a reasonable cost on their website ldstransitions.com.

KTMW produces and airs a number of live local produced studio productions each week. Each program has open phone line available for viewers to call-in to talk with the host and guests to ask questions or make comments. Among the programs are:

“This Week in the Word” Mondays 11am and repeated at 8pm ...which includes a discussion between several local area Church Ministers dealing subjects of interest to the Christian Community. Among the subjects discussed was a message of hope from Billy Grahamsuicide among teens....church leadership and baptism. During the program, the pastors also discuss verse by verse different bible passages and how it relates to us today. During this past quarter, they are studying the book of John and how the teachings affect our daily lives today. They also discuss the weekly activities planned in the local area churches. Phone lines are open for questions and comments from local viewers.

Wednesdays 8pm the hour long live studio program “Ancient Pathways”, hosted by Jason Wallace, brings in local people for discussions of different issues of concern to Utah people today. They have discussed many issues from racialism to areas dealing with Christianity and Mormonism, living in a Mormon community, same sex marriage & homosexuality. Callers are encouraged to call to add to the discussion or voice opposition or ask questions.

Thursdays 8pm Doris Hansen hosts “What Love is This” dealing with people involved in polygamy. Each week the program has people on the program who have been involved in various polygamy communities around Utah. Several woman guests openly described the physical abuse they’ve received while involved in the groups. They also described what led up their departure and escape. Phone lines are open for viewers to call in questions or comments during the program. Each week there has been a different guest and a different area of concern.

KTMW airs daily a 60 minute network program called “Your Health” where Dr. Richard and Cindy Becker open the phone lines for viewers to call-in and ask health questions.

KTMW also airs as a public service a program by Doug Kaufman "Know the Cause" where Doug and his guests discuss vital health issues.

Additional public service announcements are aired on a regular basis from the Television Networks
