ISSUE: Health Education

PROGRAM TITLE: “What’s Up, Utah?”

SYNOPSIS:

1. January 12th and 14th

Alfred Murillo, founder of the Utah Dream Center, described its program to transform the community, including Adopt a Block, Mobile Medical Unit, after-school programs, Dream Center Arts Academy, etc.

2. January 19th and 21st

Tonia Tewell, from Holding Out Hope, discussed the effects of polygamy on those involved in that way of life.

ISSUE: Self-Improvement through Religion

PROGRAM TITLE: “What’s Up, Utah?”

SYNOPSIS:

1. January 26th and 28th

Dan Voss, assistant to the President of Focus on the Family, talked about how it seeks to serve and encourage healthy families across America, including support for families as the parents try to protect their children from the harmful influences of the culture.

2. February 2nd and 4th

Robert Millet, BYU Professor of Ancient Scriptures, discussed the relationship between the Mormon and Evangelical communities in Utah and how they have improved their dialogue with each other recently.

3. February 9th and 11th

Matt Robert, Pastor of the Genesis Project, described how it engages the community of Ogden through genuine relationships that lead to new beginnings in Christ, which will empower the church, strengthen families and ultimately change the community. He explained to the host the ways services in which it is caring for the Ogden inner city community.
