### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Community Awareness:** The Hudson Valley community is filled with individuals and organizations who improve the quality of life of everyone each day. This quarter we spoke with organizations that are available to the community to offer support in various fields. Many of which were hosting bright and vibrant events for the start of the year and for holidays such as Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day. Different groups discussed their purpose in the community, their upcoming events, and how they strive to better the lives of the community around them through their events and missions.
- **Health Awareness:** February was American Heart Month, so we took the time to understand the risks of heart disease and how it effects our community. Also, March was Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month. We discussed topics that centered around mental health and abuse. With the beginning of the new year, the topic of New Year's Resolutions came up a lot and how people could start healthy habits such as various ways of getting physical and eating right that will benefit them for months and years to come. The organizations we spoke with dove into how they are spreading awareness, breaking down stigmas, and making conversations easier.
- **Local Economy:** This quarter, we spoke to small businesses who are using their platforms to educate their community through philanthropic deeds. We also focused on the importance of tourism in the area as the weather transitions from the holiday season into spring. We talked about programs that encouraged the public to get involved and become local leaders. Not just that, but we focused on the stories and grind behind local accomplishments to inspire and motivate the community.
- **Arts & Education:** The Hudson Valley has a very strong cultural base that includes Arts and Entertainment. It factors into a lot of areas in the region including economic and community wellness. As mentioned in previous buckets, the start of the new year was a major conversation topic. Various groups are using the arts to convey shared emotions within the community, along with educating and uniting people through storytelling and presentation.
