During the election, *Eyewitness News* provided numerous stories on voting locations, voter registration and the latest candidate information. *Eyewitness News* also covered the presidential race as President Biden and Donald Trump win their party's nomination and gave continuing coverage of the campaign trails for both candidates and how current events and Trump's legal issues will shape the race. *Eyewitness News* also has provided continuous coverage of the various local, state and national races as well as the latest news on the candidates, their platforms and latest poll information.

Examples of the coverage provided during the quarter include: the continued success crime fighting initiatives have had to date and how the year end totals compare to previous years; the continuation of gun violence in Houston and road rage incidents; the steady decrease in homicides and rise in burglaries and assaults, Mayor John Whitmire's implementation of his crime fighting initiatives to reduce crime across the city as well as increase funding and resources for the Houston Police Department; *Eyewitness News* also covered the disappearance and murder of 11-year-old Audrii Cunningham as well as provided the latest information on the case as well as the apprehension of the suspect.

Examples of the coverage provided during the quarter include: continual updates on both conflicts and the continuing impacts they are having on the regions and the world, the ongoing debates within the U.S. government on funding and assistance for Ukraine and Israel. The increasing humanitarian crisis the conflicts have caused in Gaza and Ukraine as well as the threat to the nuclear power plants in Ukraine as Russian forces gain territory. The U.N. and U.S. attempts to negotiate diplomatic solutions for both conflicts and effort to increase humanitarian aid to the Palestinians, pro-Ukrainian militant groups attacking various sites in Russia and Putin's pledge to use nuclear weapons if Russia's sovereignty is threatened, the ISIS terrorist attack on Russia and its impact on the war, Israel's plan to further extend its military operations and pressure from the U.S. and the U.N. to limit civilian casualties and work towards a cease fire. *Eyewitness News* has also provided coverage on how both conflicts could impact the upcoming elections in November.

Examples of continuing coverage during the quarter include: The continuing surge of immigrants and migrant caravans arriving at the U.S. border which has increased 80% within the past two years, the legal battle between the U.S. and Texas government on controlling the border including Texas' "Operation Lone Star" and SB4 initiatives including barricades and building a border wall and we provided up to date coverage as these issues worked their way through the court system, the impact the surge in migration is having to the towns along the border, Border Patrol, and the welfare of the migrants detained, the debate on deploying National Guard troops and whether Texas has authority, as well as current debates on future plans and legislation for better border security, reduce crime along the border and provide safety for immigrants and streamlining the process for refugees seeking asylum. *Eyewitness News* has also provided coverage on how the border situation could impact the upcoming elections in November.

Examples of continuing coverage during the quarter include: live reports from the rodeo about the rodeo, including the youth livestock shows, entertainers and performers with daily updates, professional cowboys in the rodeo, unique crafts, foods and exhibits; the huge impact the rodeo has on the city of Houston as far as scholarship opportunities, charities and support of the community; and historical pieces on what the rodeo has meant to Houston over the decades.

Positive Content Feature Stories

Eyewitness News aired daily *Positive Content Feature Stories*, which are locally produced segments covering a full range of subjects, including communities, arts and entertainment, food and local eateries, diversity and inclusion, local businesses, health and beauty, sports, and events that impact Houstonians. These stories air daily as packages within our newscasts, as well as on the ABC 13 app, abc13.com website and various social media platforms. A sample of some of our daily stories are listed below:

The following examples promoted Black History Month and Disney's Diversity & Inclusion Initiative:

Broadway Boy - Michael Jackson was the first black global superstar and broke a number of barriers for Black Americans with his music. Today, a Houston boy is following his footsteps and wants to be just like Mike. 11-year-old Bane Griffith was on Broadway for a year playing Little Michael in MJ The Musical and is currently out on tour with the musical. Bane talks about his time on Broadway, how he got his start at the Houston ballet plus his goal to be an EGOT (Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Award) winner when he gets older.

For the Culture - A survey by the Brewers Association showed brewery owners in the United States are 93% White and most of them are men. Jonathan Brown hopes to bring real representation to the beer industry with For the Culture Brewing, Houston's first Black-owned brewery. He has also teamed up with another group underrepresented in the beer world, women, to promote diversity and provide new opportunities.

Terrance McIntyre - A father of two, Terrance McIntyre, is closer to reaching his dreams after receiving a vocational scholarship from the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo. McIntyre was motivated to go back to school during the pandemic after his daughters said they wanted to live in a house rather than an apartment. This past December, the father of two graduated from Lee Community College in Baytown with a degree in applied science and did it debt free thanks to the scholarship.

Freedman's Town Exhibit - The Freedman's Town exhibit is called "This Way" and it showcased the work of twelve local black artists. The pieces in the show included furniture, sculptures, site-specific installations, artifacts, film, and paintings that are meant to take visitors back in time and help them understand the history of Freedmen's Town. The installations include rooms set apart by screen doors from shotgun houses in Freedmen's Town, clotheslines that hold historic photographs printed on fabric, items that re-create the Ebony Bar, which was once the most popular gathering spot in the neighborhood,

The following examples promoted Women's History Month and Disney's Diversity & Inclusion Initiative:

Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo Chairwoman Pat Phillips - For the first time ever, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo has a female chairman of the board. Pat Mann Phillips first started serving as a volunteer with the rodeo in 2002, and has worked on several different committees over the years, including the Special Children's committees. Now, after eleven years serving on the board, she is making history as the first woman to take on the pivotal role as chairman.

Razzle Dazzle - With her bright pink outfit, sequin hat, and suspenders "Razzle Dazzle the Rodeo Clown" is hard to miss. Her real name is Donna Brawley, a Rodeo volunteer of 27 years. She was given the clown name Razzle Dazzle for her sparkly and fancy personality. Donna is often asked if she gets in the arena with the bulls her response is, "No, I'm too cute for that." Instead, Donna speaks on their behalf, educating the public on what rodeo clowns do and their importance at the Rodeo.

Officer of the Year - Precinct 3 Sergeant Amanda Watson was recently awarded Officer of the Year by the Highlands-Lynchburg community. Law enforcement is all Watson knows. She joined the department eight years ago following in her mother's footsteps, who is a retired Precinct Three sergeant. Watson is a canine handler who now mentors new deputies and inspires female deputies to achieve their goals. Watson shared her message for other women wanting to make a difference in their community.

Joy Sewing – Reporter Joy Sewing was recently promoted to News Columnist at the Houston Chronicle, becoming the first black woman to hold that post. Before news, Joy covered fashion for more than 15 years and shared the reasons why her perspective in life has changed and why she was inspired to tell stories in a bigger way.

The following examples promoted Disney’s America Strong and Next Generation Initiatives:

Beads for Needs – An estimated 3 million beads will be used during the Mardi Gras celebrations. Students at Ball High School started a new initiative to prevent those beads from going into the landfill or the ocean. The Beads for Needs program is more than just a recycling effort; it's a lesson in sustainability and entrepreneurship. The program is spearheaded by the school's Life Skills students. These dedicated young individuals collect, sort, clean, and resell the Mardi Gras beads, turning trash into treasure.

Quadruple Amputee Teacher - When former Deer Park High School teacher Sherri Moody started feeling sick on a field trip last year, she thought she had the flu but she ended up being admitted to the hospital and was diagnosed with double pneumonia, sepsis and septic shock. Sherri lost all four limbs due to complications with septic shock. But despite these difficult circumstances, Sherri lives her life to the fullest and has a positive attitude. She’s been relearning how to do normal everyday tasks without arms, like eating and driving. Recently, Sherri was gifted with a much-needed handicap-accessible Honda Odyssey minivan thanks to a fundraiser by a former student

Chance to Dance - Principal Houston Ballet dancer Lauren Anderson celebrated her 40th year with the Houston Ballet. Anderson’s program, Chance for Dance, serves elementary students from disadvantaged schools. The students are invited to the Center for Dance every week where Lauren provides free classical ballet lessons.

Lil’ Rustler Rodeo – Lil’ Rustler Rodeo provided the opportunity for 4 to 10 year old children with special needs to experience the rodeo as they competed in the Main Arena of NRG Center during the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo with riding, roping and barrel racing events that were specialized to their abilities and needs.

The following examples promoted Disney’s America Strong and Diversity & Inclusion Initiatives:

Sarah Alfaro - Running was more than a physical challenge for Sarah, it was a lifeline during a time of deep personal sorrow following the tragic loss of her cousin to suicide two years ago. With the support of Latinas Run Houston, she transformed her grief into a powerful force of personal growth. She now uses running to preach wellness and possibility, inspiring the community to get moving and tackle mental health.

Threads of Hope – Clothed by Faith provides free new or gently worn clothing to those in need. Their mission is to provide quality clothing for those who cannot afford them to boost self-esteem, to have outfits for job interviews or employment and give people a helping hand when they need it most.

Princessa Trejo – University of Houston Freshman Princessa Trejo's family has been struggling since losing her mom to cancer four years ago. Trejo's dad has been working nonstop to provide for his four daughters and to pay off their mom's medical bills. The 19-year-old shared how the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo scholarship has helped her focus on school and eased a tremendous financial Burdon from her and her family.

Charles Sampson - The Black Cowboy Museum in Rosenberg inducted legendary Bull Rider Charles Sampson into its Hall of Fame. In 1981, Sampson was the first black man to win the bull riding championship at Rodeo Houston. The following year he made history again by winning the World Championship in Bull Riding.

PSA Submissions

The station airs selected PSAs submitted by local, regional and national nonprofit entities. Broadcasted on regular PSA rotation, the spots cover a wide range of subjects and interests -- from health, education and issues addressing children's concerns to drug abuse prevention, public safety and the environment.

Community Spotlight PSAs

ABC13 regularly produces and broadcasts 10, 15 and 30-second public service announcements under its *Community Spotlight* banner. The announcements promote the public service programs and activities of local nonprofit organizations, community groups and government entities. The spots are broadcast on a regular PSA rotation schedule. In the first quarter, the station produced and broadcasted PSAs promoting COVID-19 vaccine distribution, and Disney Magic of Storytelling literacy campaign.

Houston Loves Teachers Campaign

Multi-platform campaign to promote Houston Loves Teachers and the College Football Championship that occurred in Houston in January of 2024. Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo

ABC13 broadcast recaps of the daily activities at the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo, which was held from Saturday, February 24th through Sunday, March 17th during daily news reports. In addition, ABC13 broadcast the Rodeo Parade on February 25th at 10:00 am and also live streamed it on ABC13 digital platforms. The sponsor was Boot Barn.

CITGO Distinguished Scholars

ABC13 runs an on-air and digital campaign promoting the 2023/24 Distinguished Scholars Program, which was created to assist students planning to continue their education at a two-or four-year university. The sponsor was CITGO.

Medical Moments

COMMUNITY MEETINGS

ABC13 regularly hosts community meetings to support the ABC13 Localish positive news series. Seasonally, ABC13 highlights a different community in Houston’s surrounding area. The multi-platform event features local good works, deeds and hometown pride for an entire week. As a supplement, ABC13 hosts community meetings to meet local leaders, neighbors and inspirational people. Our goal is to hear firsthand the positive and inspirational contributions happening in our neighboring communities.

WEBSITE RESOURCES

The station’s website *ABC13.com* features information, video streaming and links corresponding to its news reports, programs, PSAs and public service campaigns. These informational resources cover a wide range of subjects, from news issues, current events and weather topics to health and consumer concerns. The website also features all segments of ABC13 Localish positive news series. It also provides Doppler radar weather updates and traffic information. In addition, ABC13.com provides a calendar venue for community event postings. In the first quarter, the website featured content coinciding with Black History Month, the Original MLK Jr. Day Parade, ABC13 Blood Drive, ABC13 Pick Your Pet Adoption Drive, the 96th Academy Awards, Human Rights Campaign Dinner 2024, Pride Houston’s logo reveal, Houston’s New Faces of Pride Parade, Texas Epilepsy Walk 2024, Leukemia & Lymphoma Society’s Big Climb Houston, and the second annual Fort Bend Hike for Hope.

ACTION 13 TOWN HALLS

ABC13 regularly produces and streams a series of one-hour town halls under its *Action 13* banner. These town hall conversations promote the activities of local nonprofit organizations, community groups and government entities. The virtual town halls streamed exclusively on *ABC13.com*, ABC13's app, and ABC13's connected TV apps on Amazon Fire TV, Apple TV, Android TV and Roku. In the first quarter, we produced a town hall discussing Houston Mayor John Whitmire's first 30 days in office, and how he intends to combat violent crime.
