The Green Hmong called themselves Mong, which is unacceptable for the majority of the Hmong people. The Mong are the Hmong who was forced into the Chinese lifestyle and governing system in the 14th to 17th centuries. They lost some tunes of the Hmong language such as H and R tunes. When they are intended to say Hmong, they are saying Mong instead. Now there are some Green Hmong volunteers for the project by the City of St. Paul, and they write the word Mong on the stone and the Hmong community protests that it is not appropriated to write Mong. Mong means a very bad meaning in

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both Hmong and English. The issue is pending to do more research by the city of St. Paul and will be finalized soon.
