Local News on “The Rocky Mountain Review”

The Rocky Mountain Review is a public affairs program that airs Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 4 to 5 p.m. Typically the show includes one local newscast and one campus newscast. The reporters who produce the show host interviews with local community influencers, produce 5 to 10 minute feature pieces, and round table discussions between reporters about national, local, and campus issues. Each local newscast takes approximately three minutes.

“The Rocky Mountain Review” aired 11 unique 1-hour episodes Tuesdays and Thursdays at 4pm between 4/01/20 and 5/07/20 for a total of 11-hours of community programming. Below is a listing of air times followed by specific elements that reflect community issues.

1. Issue 1: Public Awareness and Safety with a Focus on Coronavirus
 - a. "First Remote Show" on The Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/02/2020. Duration: 29 minutes.
 - i. Description: Ren Wadsworth and Maximos Hunter look at some of the most important news since the start of COVID-19 closures, and some upbeat news as well. Reporters Kota Babcock, Krissy Conklin, and sports reporter Jonathan Gillham clue us in to what they've been doing with their quarantine and give new updates.
 - b. "The Stigma of Masks" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/07/2020. Duration: 28 minutes.
 - i. Description: Ren Wadsworth and Maximos Hunter discuss reasons people may be not following the order to wear masks with reporters Kota Babcock and Brittany Lieske, who give new updates on the unfolding COVID-19 situation across campus, Fort Collins, and the nation.
 - c. "COVID-19 Update on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air dates: 04/09/2020, 04/14/2020, 04/16/2020, 04/21/2020, 04/23/2020, 04/28/2020, 04/30/2020, 05/05/2020, 05/07/2020. Duration: 4 minutes each, twice a week for 4.5 weeks (36 minutes total).
 - i. Description: Reporter Kota Babcock updates the unfolding situation across Fort Collins, Larimer County, the State of Colorado, and the nation with the novel Coronavirus.
2. Issue 2: Expert interviews on relevant or interesting topics
 - a. "Colorado's New Gun Law" on The Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/07/2020. Duration: 7 minutes.
 - i. Description: Maximos Hunter interviews College Avenue Magazine Reporter Anna Dunn about Colorado's new "Red Flag" law. The law went into place on January 1st, and allows for the government to confiscate firearms of certain people.
 - b. "Interview with Gen Rinzin (from episode "Meditation in the Snow")" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/16/2020. Duration: 9 minutes.
 - i. Description: Gen Rinzin, the resident teacher at the Heruka Buddhist Center, joins the show remotely for an interview about meditation during quarantine.
 - c. "Interview with Katie Otter (from episode CBD with Katie)" on The Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/21/2020. Duration: 17 minutes.
 - i. Description: In honor of 4/20, Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth talk about Lief CBD, and the health benefits of hemp, CBD, and marijuana with special guest Katie Otter.
 - d. "Interview with Dr. Sara Rathburn (from episode "Earth Day")" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/23/2020. Duration: 18 minutes.

- i. Dr. Sara Rathburn, a professor at Colorado State University, discusses her work with ecosystem disturbances.

 - i. Description: On this episode of The Rocky Mountain Review Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth are joined by reporters Kota Babcock and Krissy Conklin, as well as sports reporter Jonathan "Boomtown" Gillham. The group listen to an interview with state senator Kerry Donovan, and discuss who their alter egos would be.
 - b. "Meditation in the Snow" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/16/2020. Duration: 20 minutes.
 - i. Description: On this episode of The Rocky Mountain Review hosts Ren Wadsworth and Maximos Hunter are joined by reporters Krissy Conklin, Kota Babcock, and Jonathan "Boomtown" Gillham for updates on COVID-19's impact on Larimer county and the CSU community.
 - c. "Earth Day" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 04/23/2020. Duration: 17 minutes.
 - i. Description: Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth are joined by reporters Kota Babcock and Jonathan "Boomtown" Gillham to discuss local news, sports, COVID-19, and the escalating tensions with Iran. For Earth Day, Hunter and Wadsworth look back at the interview they did with Colorado State University fluvial geomorphology professor, Sara Rathburn.

 - i. Description: Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth are joined by reporters Kota Babcock and Jonathan "Boomtown" Gillham to discuss sports, COVID-19, local news, and a surprising story concerning UFO's. Then, Michael Buttram from Rams Against Hunger joins the show to talk about food resources for CSU Rams.

 - i. Description: Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth discuss local news, and COVID-19 updates with reporters Ivy Winfrey and Kota Babcock. Babcock then interviews Linzy Upton-Spatz, President of Colorado State University's Multi Faith & Belief Student Council.
 - f. "Looking Back" on the Rocky Mountain Review. Air date: 05/07/2020. Duration: 37 minutes.
 - i. Description: Maximos Hunter and Ren Wadsworth listen to their favorite moments from the last year, and say goodbye as Max

graduates and Ren moves on to new horizons with reporters Kota Babcock and Jonathan “Boomtown” Gillham.

- a. “Talking to White Kids About Race and Racism” on Safe Space Radio.
- b. Air date: 06/22/2020, 9-10am, 06/24/2020, 6pm, 6/27/20, 1-2pm .
Duration: 3-hours.
 - i. Description: Host Dr. Anne Hallward uses stories, statistics, and experts to teach white parents about how and why to talk to white kids about race. In light of public outcry for racial justice nationwide and in Fort Collins, which is largely a white community, KCSU aired this program as a public service to help parents looking for a way to fight racial injustice through education.
