Aleah's mother, Cara Beckerle, has not been listed as a person of interest and has not been labeled a suspect.

Michael Gann pleaded guilty to driving drunk causing death and injury, and to leaving the scene of an accident. Reitz High School student Logan Brown, 15, was killed in the crash.

Kendra Tooley is sentenced for her involvement in a high-profile case involving Joelle Lockwood, the victim held for two months against her will inside a home who was bound, caged and raped. Tooley's sentencing brings closure to the graphic kidnapping case.
