I Sex Trafficking in the Tri States

The Tri States are in the middle of routes between Milwaukee, Chicago, and Waterloo and Cedar Rapids. Victims are being brought into our area and are being kidnapped from it. "Set Free" held a seminar on July 30th, featuring many people from different organizations including Dubuque Police Chief Mark Dalzing, offering help to victims. The seminar is being held to enlighten tri-staters about this growing problem.

II Welfare of Animals

Every Tuesday Morning, Cumulus of Dubuque presents interviews with Jane McCall of the Dubuque Regional Humane Society. The interviews contain information about proper animal care, upcoming fundraising events, and descriptions of animals available at the Dubuque Regional Humane Society. The interviews are heard on WDBQ-FM at 8:40 am, WJOD at 8:50 am, and Y-105 at 8:40 am.

III Alzheimer's Disease

Alex Barton is the Program and Event Coordinator of the Dubuque Alzheimer's Association. Alex told our listeners about different symptoms that could indicate that persons have Alzheimers, but do not necessarily mean that they are affected. WEATHER: Townsquare features full access to satellite and radar transmissions of current conditions. WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 20 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.
