<p>Positive Family Relationship Family</p>	<p>1/4/15</p>		<p>Hour 2</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Show Has Helped Her A Lot Brittany was in a drug and alcohol treatment center in 2009 and she listened to the show throughout that, and it helped her a lot. Now she is going through a rough patch in life and she is listening to the show again. Brittany has two kids and is doing well for herself, and she doesn't think she would have been as successful in her treatment if she didn't have the support from the show.</p> <p>TITLE: Parents Getting A Divorce Rachel's parents have been married for 21 years and are now getting a divorce. Her mom told her that she has fallen out of love with her father. Rachel's parents own a business together and there is a lot of tension in the house. Rachel and her brother are trying not to take sides. Dawson told Rachel that if it gets much more intense than she may need to move out of the house.</p> <p>TITLE: Ex-Boyfriend Died In Battle Emily's ex-boyfriend was killed in battle. Emily is in a new relationship now. Emily's new boyfriend is considering going in the Navy. Emily isn't sure how to bring the past up, doesn't want to stop him from doing something he wants to do, but isn't sure she can handle it if he enlists. Dawson told Emily that she would feel so much better if she let this out and told him. Dawson told Emily that even if she stutters through the conversation it is best to get it out in the open.</p> <p>TITLE: Mom Gave Sister Cocaine John found out that his mom gave his younger sister and her friend cocaine. John ended up pressing charges against his mom, and she gave a full confession. He hasn't talked to his mom for a year and a half. John tried to reach out to his mom recently, and she cries to him and wants him to help her. Dawson said that he is a hero for pressing charges against his mom. Dawson said his mom is a manipulator, and that John shouldn't try to get involved with helping her, and to tell her that the authorities have told him not to talk to her.</p>

Pregnancy Relationship Family Relationship	1/11/15		Hour 2	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Pregnant, Boyfriend Moving Away Morgan is pregnant, and her boyfriend is moving away so she feels like she is stuck dealing with all of this by herself. Morgan's ex would like her to give up the baby for adoption, but she isn't in favor of that. Dawson said that normally when something starts quickly it ends quickly. He doesn't feel that this guy is in Morgan's corner or that he will be consistent in her life. Dawson advised her to lean on her friends and family and build a team of supporters to help her face the situation.</p> <p>TITLE: Came Clean To Wife About 10 Affairs Nate has finally came clean with his wife recently about his 10 affairs. Nate's wife moved back to Texas to be with her family. Nate is now a part of Celebrate Recovery and for the first time is hearing the term "sexual addiction" but Nate isn't sure if that is a real thing. Dawson said sexual addiction is a real thing and that Nate fits the description of a sex addict. Dawson also said until he embraces the fact and recognizes that he is an addict he won't go down the road to sobriety.</p> <p>TITLE: Dad Has Never Been There For Her Lauren's dad has never been there for her, and has been in jail most of her life. He recently told Lauren that he has terminal cancer and has only a short time to live. Dawson said she needs counseling and she needs mentors who will walk with her through these things. Dawson said that until she takes some steps to recover from the abandonment she isn't ready to meet with him.</p> <p>TITLE: Heard Ex-Boyfriend Still Loves Her Deja was dating a boy for several months, but got drunk and made out with someone else. As a result the relationship eventually ended. Deja recently heard that he still loves her, but he hasn't said this directly to her. Deja said she often pushes people away because she is afraid of losing them. Dawson said "I love you" is one of the most powerful phrases you could ever say. He said if he really wants to get back with her, she will hear from him. Until she hears from him directly she should ignore the rumors she is hearing. Dawson encouraged her to talk to a counselor about her trust issues.</p>

<p>Relationship Family Self-Harm Career</p>	<p>1/18/15</p>		<p>Hour 2</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: In Love With Girl Who Is Mormon Jose has been in love with this girl for the last 5 years. They never officially dated but Jose said she was his first love and first kiss. The reason they haven't dated is because her family is Mormon. Jose has thought about converting because he loves her. Dawson said that he can't fake a belief in her faith, and that is not a way to start a marriage.</p> <p>TITLE: Fighting With Mom Gets Physical Hope and her mom have had a hard time getting along since her dad died in 2007. She said sometimes it even gets physical when they fight. She isn't sure how to get out of the situation. Dawson said that she needs to have a relationship with her mom but perhaps from a distance. Since she is 18, Dawson advised her to move out and build a team of supporters around her, and then very slowly set up boundaries and restart her relationship with her mom.</p> <p>TITLE: Dating A Girl Who Self-Harms Christian dated a girl who was self-harming, and Christian told her that whenever she was going to do that to call him instead. Christian eventually got his life straight, stopped drinking, and started dating an amazing girl. They have a great relationship but he recently found out that this girl is also self-harming. Dawson said that Christian needs a woman who will challenge him to be better than he is, and someone who is as healthy. He told Christian that he is attracting girls with needs and that is not good for him. He advised that they take a "time out" while she gets some counseling. Dawson said that by Christian enforcing the "time out" period it will show her how serious it is.</p> <p>TITLE: Wants To Play In The NBA Blair wants to play in the NBA. He is a truck driver and making good money, but he knows there is a lot of life out there for him. Blair is a street ball player and has grown up with and played with several guys who are now in the NBA. He wasn't able to play in high school because of his grades. Dawson recommended trying to go talk to a college coach and some of the connections he has at the NBA, and come up with a plan to follow but if he is going to do it he has to do it now. Dawson said he should follow his dream and see what happens.</p>
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<p>Positive Relationship Relationship Family</p>	<p>1/25/15</p>		<p>Hour 2</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Thank You For Advice Two Years Ago Travis called about 2 years ago and wanted to call back tonight to say thank you for the help Dawson gave. When Travis called he was having issues with his stepdad, and Dawson advised him to get out of the home and situation. Travis followed through with the advice and is thankful for the help he received.</p> <p>TITLE: Boyfriend Enlisted To Be A Navy Seal Morgan just found out that her boyfriend enlisted to be a Navy Seal. Morgan is having a lot of emotions about it. Morgan isn't sure that she can stay with him. Dawson said that some people are wired to deal with the issues that go along with their significant other enlisting, while others are not. Dawson said that Morgan's boyfriend is going to have a lot on his plate while he is serving and doesn't need Morgan dragging him down. He suggested taking a time out so that he can concentrate on what he is doing and Morgan can process her emotions.</p> <p>TITLE: Feeling Detached From His Fiancée JJ feels a little detached from his fiancée, they tend to argue more and he is seeing more down times than up times. JJ and his fiancée's families played a big part in getting them together. He isn't sure what to do at this point - if he should just end it or if he should try to speak to her about it first. Dawson said that JJ shouldn't live a lie, but needs to tell her the truth if he is no longer having deep feelings for her. Dawson also told JJ that family pressure is not a good enough reason to stay in a relationship. He told JJ that the sooner he can go to her and have this conversation the better.</p> <p>TITLE: Dad Left And Now Wants To See Her Rachel's dad left her and her mom when she was young. Her mom had to work two jobs and Rachel had to help raise her younger brother. About two weeks ago her dad called her to ask about life, and now he has been calling her nightly and wants to get together with her. Rachel says that her dad was physically and mentally abusive. Rachel hasn't told her mom about her dad contacting her. Dawson said that she needs to set up safe boundaries with him, and encouraged her that if or when she does talk to him she should always bring someone else into the conversation.</p>
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<p>Medical Addiction Positive Relationship</p>	<p>1/4/15</p>		<p>Hour 1</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Thought Pregnant But It's An STD Megan thought she was pregnant. Megan's doctor told her she wasn't pregnant but that she had an STD. Megan says that the virus is curable, but she hasn't told her parents. Megan is feeling the side effects of the virus, and doesn't want to bring it up to her family. Dawson told Megan that the sooner that she can tell her family, the better off she will be. He believes that Megan's family will be behind her as she fights off this virus.</p> <p>TITLE: Deal With Stress Without Relapsing Dee's mom was diagnosed with M.S. Dee had a surgery this past fall and became addicted to pain pills. Once Dee's prescribed pills were gone, she began taking her mom's Percocet. Dee has been clean for about a month now, but her mom was recently diagnosed with cancer in addition to the M.S. Dee isn't sure how to deal with the stress without relapsing. Dawson said that Dee is in a battle because of her addictive personality, her history, and the stress of her mother's situation. Dawson said we'll help her with a strategy on how to handle this.</p> <p>TITLE: Thank You Dawson For Advice Chad called in a while back because he had 3 jobs and was taking care of his girlfriend and his grandmother. At the time Dawson advised him to find a financial counselor. Chad followed that advice and his financial advisor has helped him get down to one job. Chad wanted to let Dawson know that his advice worked and say thank you.</p> <p>TITLE: Boyfriend's Family Doesn't Like Her Amanda's boyfriend's family doesn't approve of her. Amanda believes she is pregnant with his child. He is currently in jail for being \$1000 behind in child support from another relationship. Dawson said that there are a lot of strikes against her boyfriend and that she doesn't really need to get hooked up with a guy who can't support but also whose family also doesn't support her. Dawson said both parties in a relationship need to be able to take care of themselves before they get together.</p>

Addiction Grief Relationship Relationship	1/11/15		Hour 1	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Brother Started Using Drugs Aliyah's 20 year old brother was living in another state and was having a hard time there. Aliyah invited him to move in with her but since he has done that he got into drugs. She has recently told him he isn't allowed to stay with her anymore but she feels responsible since he moved to live with her. Dawson said that Aliyah's brother will have to hit the wall before he changes. He encouraged Aliyah to stay strong in her stance and not enable him.</p> <p>TITLE: Mom Died From Cancer Rachel's mom passed away last April from a rare form of cancer. Rachel took care of her mom when she was sick, but during that time Rachel was doing drugs and alcohol. Rachel feels guilty because she thinks if she had been off of drugs she could have taken care of her mom better and perhaps she would have lived longer. Dawson said that Rachel was not responsible for the cancer and that regardless it would have run its course.</p> <p>TITLE: Thinks Girlfriend Might Be Cheating Jeff thinks his girlfriend might be cheating on him. They live together in a one room apartment, she comes home late from work, and isn't as intimate with him as she once was. Jeff has been dating her two and a half years and he just recently met her parents. Jeff's friends are saying that she is saying bad things about him and she won't let him look at her phone. Dawson said that those signs all point to the fact that she is cheating.</p> <p>TITLE: Keeps Seeing Ex-Boyfriend At School Rebecca dated a guy for a couple of years. They broke up but they see each other at their college classes every day. Rebecca really wants to move on but she doesn't know how. Rebecca is seeing someone else, but she is scared to open up to him and is having trouble wanting to be in a relationship with someone else. Rebecca's new boyfriend is sweet and encouraging. Dawson said since they dated for a couple years it might take at least that long to get over him. Dawson advised Rebecca to stay away from him as much as possible, but also not to beat up her new boyfriend because of the issues with her old one.</p>

<p>Medical Grief Addiction Career</p>	<p>1/18/15</p>		<p>Hour 1</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: May Only Have About 12 Years To Live Natasha has SMA Syndrome. She said that she has an artery that can collapse and stops her from eating and drinking, and every few months she has to be hospitalized. The doctors have told her she only has about 12 years to live. She is thinking about not going to college and not pursuing having a family of her own. Dawson reminded Natasha that it isn't the quantity of life, it is the quality of life. He also talked about making the most out of each day. He also said the doctors could be wrong and that she just doesn't know what God has planned for her.</p> <p>TITLE: Grandfather Passed Away Last Night Brittany's grandfather passed away last night. She isn't sure how to move on, and she feels like it is a dream. Brittany lives with her grandparents and that makes this extra hard to handle. Dawson said that she is in shock, and that is a blessing. The shock helps protect us as we process through the situation and it is the first stage of grief. Dawson encouraged Brittany that she will get through this but it will take some time. He also told Brittany to get her emotions out and don't hold them in.</p> <p>TITLE: Has Relapsed, After 18 Months Clean Levi is struggling with alcohol. He was clean for 18 months and in the last few weeks has relapsed. He hasn't gotten to the point where he has gotten in trouble with it yet, but in the past he has had 6 alcohol poisonings and 9 overdoses. Levi said to stay clean for the 18 months it took family support and Celebrate Recovery. He has a good job now and is afraid to lose it. Dawson said to go back to doing what he did when he was most successful with his sobriety.</p> <p>TITLE: Should He Change Majors? Bryant is deciding if he wants to change majors. He is currently in construction management, and he is in that for the money and because he enjoys working with his hands. Bryant's goal is to be able to live comfortably and well while he supports his family. Bryant's dream is to be a teacher but knows he wouldn't make as much money as he would in construction management. Dawson said that more money doesn't equal more happiness. He advised Bryan to follow his dream and not worry about the money.</p>
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<p>Abuse Relationship Family Relationship</p>	<p>1/25/15</p>		<p>Hour 1</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Traumatized From Past Relationship Alyssa was with her ex-boyfriend for about 4 and a half years, and it was a very abusive relationship. Alyssa was so traumatized from her previous relationship that she is having a hard time in her new relationship. She is afraid it will turn out the way it did last time. Dawson told Alyssa that the abusive relationship has had a bigger impact on her than she even knows. He said that Alyssa needs to share all of this with her new boyfriend and also that she needs to get in to counseling.</p> <p>TITLE: Ex-Girlfriend Is Calling Him Again Brody started dating a girl and for about six months they saw each other and talked constantly. Brody said that eventually it got more and more one sided. After a few weeks of feeling like he was the only one trying in the relationship she broke up with him. Brody's ex-girlfriend ended up going out with another guy. Now she has broken up with the other guy and is calling Brody again. Dawson said that this relationship is dead and that Brody should not allow this girl to jerk him around anymore. He reminded Brody that it would take a while for him to get over this. Dawson advised Brody to get to the bottom of why he is so obsessed with this girl.</p> <p>TITLE: Living With Brother, Lying To Him Michael moved away from his parents and in with his brother since he was getting in a lot of trouble. He did well for a while but for the last few weeks he returned to drinking and partying, and he is lying about it to his brother. He has recently tried to turn his life around but he isn't sure how to talk to his brother and work toward regaining his trust. Dawson said to ask for forgiveness, but also ask him to hold him accountable and recommended finding a mentor who would hold him accountable.</p> <p>TITLE: On Her Own For First Time Brittany is a single mom. She moved out of her grandparent's house and is independent now for the first time, has her own place, her own car, and a well-paying job. She began dating a guy from work who she feels she has fallen in love with. Brittany is a little concerned because he has a drug past, and she is concerned he will have a relapse. Dawson fears she will lose all these positive things she has recently gained. He suggested that if she stays with him, have hoops he needs to jump through to prove himself.</p>
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Relationship Bullying Relationship Depression	2/1/15		Hour 2	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Has "Empty Cup" Syndrome Ashton doesn't have a strong male role model in her life. Dawson referred to the "empty cup" syndrome, where in a healthy situation a girl leaves her father to go out in to the world with a "full cup." However when a girl goes out in the world with an empty cup she is just looking for love anywhere and guys who are empty as well know how to use her situation for their own gratification. He told Ashton that she needs to get to understand her own self and also get someone to keep her accountable.</p> <p>TITLE: Bullied Because Of Her Teeth Breanna has been bullied because of her teeth. Breanna said the students call her names such as "shark." She said that many of the students also go to her church but treat her differently at school. Dawson encouraged her to talk to the students' one on one and explain the situation to them. He also recommended going to her youth pastor and having him help her have these conversations.</p> <p>TITLE: Ex Playing With Her Emotions Tiffany met a guy when she was 15, and he was 6 years older than her. Tiffany feels he has been playing with her emotions for the last three years. Tiffany is engaged to another guy and pregnant. Dawson said that he is trying to get back at her and mess with her head. Dawson said that she needs to say to him that she is engaged and pregnant and doesn't need the stress that he is putting on her.</p> <p>TITLE: Dealing With PTSD And Depression Katelyn's lost her home when her mom and grandma both died. She ended up living with an abusive boyfriend and began drinking alcohol. Katelyn is depressed and has PTSD from her childhood. Dawson recommended going to the chaplain on the air force base. He said she is a survivor but still needs more help. He reminded Katelyn that counseling isn't a dirty word. He suggested that after she goes through this she might be able to help others.</p>

Family Family Friendship Pregnancy	2/8/15		Hour 2	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Primary Care Giver For Mom Kara's mom has been diagnosed with paranoid schizophrenia. Since Kara has been 18 she has been her mom's primary care giver. Kara is about to graduate college and has some opportunities for work and travel with her husband, but is feeling anchored to her current location because of her mom. Dawson feels Kara needs to get on with the rest of her life. He recommended having a family meeting with the extended family about what to do next. He also suggested getting some professional help with her mom.</p> <p>TITLE: Wants To Reconcile With Mom Nathan was kicked out of his mom's house most recently when he was 17 and they haven't reconciled their relationship since. Recently, when Nathan's grandmother passed away he went to tell his mom that he loved her, but it doesn't really seem to have helped. Nathan isn't sure what to do. Dawson said that Nathan needs to address the broken relationship. He recommended specifically telling her that he is sorry for ways he has hurt and disrespected for and ask for her forgiveness.</p> <p>TITLE: Wants To Just Be Friends With Girl Chris has known a girl for about 10-12 years and recently ended up sleeping with her. Chris has a past relationship with this girl, but she cheated on him and had a baby with Chris' best friend. Chris wants to just be friends with her, but he doesn't want to hurt her. Dawson said staying around and acting like he cares more than he does won't keep her from getting hurt, but will make it twice as bad in the long run. He told Chris that even if they did get back together there would be so many issues for them to deal with.</p> <p>TITLE: Pregnant, Boyfriend Is Scared Sierra recently found out she is pregnant. Sierra's boyfriend is scared and is making things up about it not being his child. Sierra is willing to do a paternity test but he isn't responding. Sierra isn't sure how to handle the situation. Dawson said he isn't responding because deep down he knows, and he doesn't want to deal with the situation. He told Sierra that she should consider him gone, but that he is still responsible for child support.</p>

<p>School Relationship Friendship Positive</p>	<p>2/15/15</p>		<p>Hour 2</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: People Say Don't Go To Medical School Morgan wants to go to medical school after high school graduation, but a lot of people are discouraging her because of the amount of time it will take and the expense of it. Dawson told Morgan to follow her dream. He told Morgan that even once she starts college she will have a few years of undergrad work before she has to make a final decision. Dawson doesn't want Morgan to regret not pursuing her dreams.</p> <p>TITLE: Boyfriend Cheated, Wants To Move On Genesee wants to know how to move on after her boyfriend cheated on her. Genesee said that for a while everything was going fine but one night a random girl messaged her to tell her about her relationship with her boyfriend. Genesee confronted him about it but he denied it. Genesee is trying to move on from him but people at school keep bringing it up and asking her about it. Dawson said that he doesn't respect her and does not love her. Dawson told Genesee to remind herself that she deserves better than this, and that he isn't worth losing any sleep over. He also recommended doing more research on the person she gets in to a relationship with next.</p> <p>TITLE: Trying To Remain Friends With Ex Alex and his girlfriend broke up in November after dating for two years. Alex's girlfriend went through basic training, and Alex found out that she met another guy while she was away. They are trying to still stay friends since they know each other so well. Now she is bragging to everyone about how much happier she is with her new boyfriend. Alex is still trying to get over her breaking his heart. Dawson said that Alex needs to cut off the relationship. He said that she is not treating him as a good friend, and that Alex is going to have to take some time off from her so that he can heal from this broken relationship. He recommended getting some new friends in his life.</p> <p>TITLE: Thank You For Encouragement Beven called to thank Dawson for all of the encouragement that he gives people. She said that she appreciates that Dawson "tells it how it is" and doesn't sugar coat things. She also wanted to encourage everyone with relationship issues that whatever is meant to be will be, and that when one door closes another one opens.</p>
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<p>Suicide Relationship Positive Relationship</p>	<p>2/22/15</p>		<p>Hour 2</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Young Man Committed Suicide Patrick is a youth leader at his church, and about a week ago a young man in the school system committed suicide. Patrick is struggling with where he is at and the fact that he wasn't able to reach him. Patrick is wondering why this guy felt there were no other options. Dawson told Patrick that statistically 1 out of 3 people are suicidal, and 50% of all suicides would happen no matter what anyone did to intervene, so Patrick can't beat himself up over this. However, he said that Patrick could use this as a springboard and do more to reach students in the schools. Dawson told him that he can love as many people as possible, and ask God for divine appointments.</p> <p>TITLE: Tried To Jump From Girlfriend's Car Chris met a girl that he fell in love with, probably too quickly. They moved in together three days after they met. Yesterday she called him controlling, and immediately Chris had the thought to kill himself and tried to jump from her car at 70 miles per hour. Chris said this isn't the first person that has called him controlling. Chris is currently on his way to be with his family. Dawson said the fact that he is only okay when he is in control is something that goes back to when he was very young, and control is toxic to any relationship. Dawson said that Chris has traumatized this girl, and that Chris has some serious problems to work through.</p> <p>TITLE: Dawson's Advice Has Helped Him Toby is calling to thank Dawson for all of the advice he gives out. Toby sometimes feels he gets pulled between his divorced parents, and he also lost a friend to suicide around Christmas, and said that Dawson's advice helped him get through these situations.</p> <p>TITLE: Ex Is Lying About Him Shane was recently discharged from the military after 3 years of service. While Shane was in Afghanistan his fiancé cheated on him and they broke it off. Now, she is telling people that he molested her son, which isn't true. Shane isn't sure what to do at this point, and he has already moved out of the state to get away from her. Dawson said she is so hateful that she is trying to destroy his reputation. Dawson told Shane to continue to stay away from her.</p>
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Relationship Positive Friendship Family	2/1/15		Hour 1	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Girlfriend Keeps Going Back And Forth Caleb has been dating someone for a while now. His girlfriend keeps going back and forth on if she wants to date him or just be his friend. Caleb's friends don't like her and think she is jerking him around. Caleb is thinking maybe he should end it. Dawson said she doesn't know what she wants, and she seems to be someone who lives off drama. Dawson said Caleb should listen to his friends because they want to make sure he doesn't get hurt. He recommended talking with her face-to-face and sorting out where they are going with their relationship.</p> <p>TITLE: Show Has Inspired Him Gabriel wanted to call in to say thank you for all he has done to help people. He just heard Caleb's story and wanted to let Caleb know that he is praying for him. Gabriel said Dawson's show has helped inspired him to be a part of the youth leadership team at his church so that he can help as many people as possible.</p> <p>TITLE: Doesn't Have Time To Make Friends Chris is in a relationship with a great girl now. He doesn't really have a lot of time to make new friends and is looking for advice on how to form new friendships. Dawson said one of the problems with dating relationships is that often you lose your other friends because you are so focused on that other person. He reminded Chris that any friendship or meaningful relationship takes time.</p> <p>TITLE: Can't Live Up To Mom's Expectations Jenny has always thought her mom had a lot of mood swings, but recently found out that her mom has borderline personality disorder. Jenny has never been rebellious and has always tried to be a good girl but feels she has never been able to live up to her mom's expectations. She wants to know if she should cut her mom off completely. Dawson said that if her mom is not doing anything to help her then she should cut her off until that changes. If her mom does get help, he advised being slow about reintroducing the relationship.</p>

<p>Friendship Relationship Relationship Relationship</p>	<p>2/8/15</p>		<p>Hour 1</p>	<p>Dawson spoke to the following young people about their issues:</p> <p>TITLE: Having Issues With A Former Friend Marina is having issues with a former friend. After their senior year of high school they worked together for a few months, and Marina says that her friend insulted her in various ways. He also told Marina that if there is anything that she has done that needs forgiveness, she needs to ask for it, but also made it clear that asking forgiveness does not mean you are opening the door for an ongoing relationship.</p> <p>TITLE: She Has A Love Addiction Courtney says that she and her boyfriend have been put in jail for hitting each other. Courtney knows it isn't okay, but she loves him and knows it isn't all his fault. Courtney went back to him after the first incident. Courtney said he drinks a lot. Dawson said that there is no question that Courtney needs to leave him. He told Courtney that she has a love addiction for him that is blocking her ability to think clearly. He also said that once she leaves him and is able to look back on it, she will realize how bad the situation really was.</p> <p>TITLE: Met Guy On Facebook, He Never Showed Lydia was in a relationship through Facebook. She felt they had a connection and had many things in common. They never met in person, but he promised to go see her. He never showed up. Dawson said that there are some guys that get a thrill out of seducing women through social media. He told her to get rid of him.</p> <p>TITLE: Being Deployed, Girlfriend Stressing Logan is in the National Guard and found out he is deploying in about two weeks. His girlfriend has known this was a possibility, but now that it is becoming a reality she is freaking out. Dawson said that Logan needs to talk to her and say it isn't healthy for him to have this drama happening because he needs to be focused on his work. Dawson said if he can't find a way to go with her blessing, than it is time to break up.</p>

Cammie feels like she should be getting on birth control. Cammie doesn't feel like she can stop having sex with her boyfriend because she is afraid he won't stay with her. Dawson recommended telling her the truth about her boyfriend pressuring her to have sex, but also to say she has decided to break up with him because of it.</p> <p>TITLE: Dad Drinks From Morning Until Night Kayla lives with her dad, who is an alcoholic. He doesn't work and basically drinks from morning till night. Kayla is a senior in high school. Kayla's dad comes to her for money, and she feels guilty if she doesn't help him. He says he is using it to buy gas, but Kayla knows he is buying alcohol with it. Dawson said that Kayla is a classic enabler and is helping him stay in alcoholic. He told Kayla that he is manipulating her.</p> <p>TITLE: Pattern Dating Girls Who Self-Harm Christian was dating a girl who told him early in the relationship that she was self-harming. Christian dated two other girls who were doing the same thing and decided that he needed to change his life. He stopped drinking and partying, and then started dating a new girl. However, he recently found out she is also self-harming. Dawson said that Christian needs to be with a woman who is as healthy as or healthier than he is. Dawson suggested Christian let her know that this issue is over his head and that they need to take a time out so that she can get some professional help.</p> <p>TITLE: Wants To Play Basketball In The NBA Blair wants to play in the NBA. He is 23 years old, he is a truck driver, and has an established life. He knows he is good, but hasn't played organized basketball since middle school. He has played in school and on the street with players that are now in the NBA. Blair is thinking of going back to college and trying out for the basketball team. Dawson recommended getting ahold of some of his connections with the NBA or the college coaches to try to get some advice. He said if he is going to do it now is the time. Dawson told Janet that she has to have a plan to be able to move forward with dealing with her bulimia. He recommended finding another therapist and going in asking them to help her put together a plan.</p> <p>TITLE: Was Asked To Do Inappropriate Things Michaela's dad sometimes asked her to do inappropriate things, like showing him her body. When this would happen, Michaela would be grounded. She recently told her step mom what was happening and it hasn't happened again since. Dawson said that Michaela has been through trauma and being in that house with her birth father is not helping her heal. Dawson said that he would help her find a new place to stay.</p> <p>TITLE: Bounced Checks, Boyfriend Left Her Tracy and her boyfriend split after being together for four or five years. Tracy bounced a few checks and when he found out he was very angry. Tracy wants to prove to him that he can trust her again. Dawson said that although Tracy is trying to prove herself trustworthy, she also needs to watch him to see if he is the kind of guy who can be forgiving.</p> <p>TITLE: Son Died, Her And Daughter Homeless Kay's son died, and now is homeless, and it has caused her to turn to drugs. Kay and her daughter are living in a hotel. Kay's son died a little over a year ago and people wonder why she hasn't gotten past it. Kay wants to know why this all has happened to her. Dawson said that healing takes a long time, and when you use drugs it just delays the grief process. Dawson said things are just going to get worse, and it is only a matter time before she and her daughter suffer even more for this. Bradley isn't sure if he should stick it out and give her another chance. Dawson said that she doesn't love or respect him, and the fact that she pawned the jewelry proves that.</p> <p>TITLE: Mom Is Drug Addict, Stole From Him Blake's mom is a drug addict and stole \$25,000 from him while he was in boot camp. He also has younger siblings; some are still living at home with her. His parents are divorced but his mom is currently living in the home. His dad is afraid if he kicks her out of the house she will do something drastic. Blake is concerned with the impact she is having on his siblings. Dawson reminded Blake that he isn't responsible to heal all of the family issues. Indiana ranks high in student suicide, child poverty

INDIANAPOLIS –Teens in Indiana are more likely to think about taking their own lives than students in any other state in the nation. Hoosier children also are still struggling to live outside of poverty, despite the current economic recovery.

Those facts are just some of many found inside the 2015 KIDS COUNT® in Indiana Data Book compiled by the Indiana Youth Institute. The annual book provides data from hundreds of national and statewide sources to paint a picture of the state of Hoosier children and families.

The top three topics for this year's book are:

Suicide:

- Indiana has the highest rate in the nation of teens who have considered suicide in the past 12 months (19%).
- Indiana has the second-highest rate in the nation of teens who have attempted suicide (11%).

“Every Hoosier needs to be aware of these high rankings,” says Indiana Youth Institute President and CEO Bill Stanczykiewicz. “The mental and emotional challenges Hoosier students face are very real. Youth, parents and other caring adults need to be aware of the warning signs so they can intervene now and make sure these kids don't reach a state of desperation where they feel taking their own life is the only solution.”

Poverty and the Economy:

- Single-mother families are not experiencing the same economic recovery seen in single-father or married couple families.
- While Indiana incomes are rebounding from the recession, child poverty is not improving at the same rate—22 percent of Hoosier children still live in poverty.

Stanczykiewicz goes on to say, “Even though the economy is getting better, poverty and child poverty are usually the last indicators to improve. Many times, that is due to issues related to family structure and economic structures. We need to redouble our efforts to meet these kids' needs and help them achieve academic and future success so they can break the cycle of poverty.”

Education:

- Indiana ranks ninth-worst in the nation for student-to-school counselor ratio. Indiana has one counselor for every 535 students. Additionally, counselors say most of their time is not spent on getting kids ready for college or the workforce.

“Today's economy requires education beyond high school,” Stanczykiewicz adds. “Counselors are usually the first line of defense in helping our teens decide what their future could look like. But many of those counselors are overwhelmed by the high number of students for which they are responsible, as well as other duties and issues they deal with every day. We need parents, community organizations and mentors to help fill the gaps and set these young people on a path to success in a 21st century economy.”

Other important issues included in the book are:

Family Life:

- Indiana children are more likely to be abused or neglected by their own parents than any other group of perpetrators.
- 19 percent of Hoosier children living in poverty have witnessed domestic violence.

Infant Mortality:

- Indiana infants are 25 percent more likely to die within their first year of life than the national average.
- One of the leading risk factors for infant mortality is mothers who smoke or use illegal drugs while pregnant. One in six Hoosier mothers admit to smoking while pregnant.

Drug Usage:

- For the first time on record, the percentage of 12th graders who tried marijuana outpaced the number who tried cigarettes in 2014.
- Abuse of prescription drugs among teens has increased by more than 95 percent from 2003 to 2014. A dangerous trend contributing to the problem is known as “pharming parties” during which teens trade and share different prescriptions.

School Violence:

- One in twenty (5.2%) Indiana parents of school-aged children feel their child is never or only sometimes safe at school.
- In Indiana, 28.2 percent of high school girls and 21.8 percent of boys reported being bullied on school property in 2011.
- More than a quarter of Indiana’s high school girls (25.5%) and about 1 in 8 boys (12.1%) were electronically bullied in the past year.

The data book is funded by the Annie E. Casey Foundation (AECF), as part of its national effort to inform program and policy decisions based on real-world data. Some data from this book also will be included in AECF’s national KIDS COUNT Data Book, which provides state by state comparisons of child well-being and will be released this summer. 




