I. Issue: Healthcare

Program Title: Morning Newscast

As far as needs in the community, dental care is the top need residents struggle to pay for. Seventeen percent of residents say they have been homeless for a week or more at some point in their lives.

In the Glen Avon/ Jurupa Hills area, they say it is movement along several nearby fault lines. Hundreds of small quakes have hit the area just in the past week but, one of the larger ones was a 4.0. Type / Description: The morning news announcer discussed an uptick of activity along the US/Mexico border. The images are on the news almost daily now of thousands of migrants seeking asylum from countries like Honduras and El Salvador. Border Patrol and Customs Enforcement can't handle the influx so they are requesting federal funds and they're going to start transporting migrants into cities around the nation. There will be three flights daily into San Diego with 125 migrants that will be processed, given a meal, a shower, a change of clothes, and a medical assessment, and then released until their asylum hearing.

Program Title: Morning Newscast


