I'm wondering does the immigration law include immigrants from Haiti? From African? Because I don't see any black people being saved by the new immigration law. Is it just for the Mexicans?")

BRAD'S BBQ: 1 (Viewer seeks address.)
- (1/25) OFF THE CHAIN/ED McNAMARA,
CURRENT AFFAIRS OF WAYNE CO.
(LEDUFF) 1 (Doesn't like: "If I were Ed McNamara's widow, I would be very, very upset. How

dare he take a man who has devoted his life to us and died - and put him on TV to make fun of him!")

- (1/25) 8 YR-OLD BRINGS GUN TO SCHOOL:

2 (Viewer states that her son, like the child in this story, is a victim of bullying. Another viewer feels that the child's parents should be held accountable for his actions.)

- (1/25) KWAME KILPATRICK/WEEKEND JAIL TERM (ELRICK):

6 ("This weekend jail is a big joke for Kwame. It sounds like the old traffic court judge from Detroit spending a week in jail. Kwame should be in jail & when he has to go to court, the jail people can bring him over. And each day, when court is through, they can take him back to jail & let him stay there. If it was any of the rest of us in the city of Detroit, you can bet your backside we'd be in jail. I'm from Detroit, a former cop." "It's a crying shame that Kwame Kilpatrick has 14 violations against him, but this is the first time he's in jail."

Viewer says M. L. Elrick's statement re: the jurors won't really know that he went back to jail because they can't watch TV and can't read the newspaper doesn't make any sense. She feels the fact that he was returning to jail shouldn't have been released to the public, so it won't taint the jury pool.

"Fourteen parole violations & he does 2 days in jail. Oh my God, if that had been Mr. Normal Person, there would have been a lot more to it than that!" (Other similar comments))

14 ("If you arm teachers, & an armed combatant comes in, doesn't that mean he's just going to take out the teacher first? I don't see where there's a great advantage." (9 other similar comments)
"I agree with the president of the Teachers Federation. Teachers have no business having guns. They need to teach; that's why you need to have GPS & security guards with guns to handle that."
"We feel that the military or the National Guard should be put in the schools. They know how to use their guns; they're trained for it & they're the ones who should be taking care of our country, instead of running all over to other countries around the world."
Viewer is in favor of arming teachers; she tried to register her comment on myfoxdetroit.com, but was unable to do so. She said she spent the entire 1/2 hour attempting to leave her comment.

1 (Doesn't like: Viewer complains that Jason Carr tried to "steal the interview" from Lee Thomas by asking a question after it ended.)

1 (Viewer states that we mentioned during the 10p news on 1/22 that DPS schools would be closed today, but there was no mention of it this morning. She wants to know the status for DPS.)

1 (Viewer asks us to eliminate entertainment news from our "other newscasts," since there are many other sources for this information. She further complained that all we seem to talk about is Nicki Minaj & Mariah Carey.)

- ANTHEM DURING INAUGURATION: 1 ("You keep talking about Beyonce lip synching the National Anthem at the inauguration - well, frankly, I don't care if she did, or not.")
- RE: MANTI TE'O HOAX: 1 ("When are they going to get off this Te'o thing? He's young, maybe he did something stupid, but he didn't kill anybody or commit a crime. What is the big deal? Please let me know!")
 - (1/22) THE NINE/DISCUSSION RE: ARMED GUARDS IN SCHOOLS: 1 ("You guys have an armed guard there guarding all of you, & you're adults -- so yes, there should be armed guards in the schools, too.")
 - (1/21, 10:46a) PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION: 1 ("You're the station that's supposed to work for us -- and we wanted to watch the inauguration on Ch. 2, but you don't have it on. Every other channel is carrying it.")

She was called again, & given the information requested after her second call to us.)*

- (1/18, 10p) OFF THE CHAIN/COLEMAN YOUNG (LEDUFF):

6 (Don't like: Viewers feel the tone of this report was inappropriate, that it was a "negative stereotype.")

- (1/17) THE NINE/JASON CARR'S COMM'TS RE: THE WYOMING MOTHER WHO SOLD HER SON'S CAR (PUNISHMENT FOR DRUNK DRIVING):

1 (Caller says as the mother of 4 grown children & as someone who has had this same experience, she agrees with the Wyoming mom. She states that it's "better to embarrass them now, than to have them killed in an accident.")

- (1/16) DETROIT HOMELESS CHOIR (ASHER):

1 (Likes: Viewer compliments Taryn Asher on this story, says it was "great." She'd like to make a donation to help the choir travel to the inauguration.)

- (1/16) OBAMA GUN VIOLENCE PKG:

2 (Viewers agree with the President's decision.)

- (1/16) SUGAR DADDIES SURGE:

1 (Viewer disagrees w/our reporters' comm't that "you can make up to \$3,000 a month for a date." She complains that it was terrible to talk about this issue in this manner, especially to kids, & that it is actually prostitution.)

- (1/15) D IS FOR DUMB/DUMB

- CARJACKER (LEDUFF):
- 1 (Viewer agrees with Charlie LeDuff on several points, but says the way it was presented was very "thuggish" & "like the Cosa Nostra or a mob boss," which she didn't appreciate.)
- (1/14) HOMEOWNER DELINQUENT TAX RELIEF PROGRAM: 3 (Viewers request additional information.)
 - (1/14) GOLDEN GLOBE AWARD COVERAGE: 1 (Doesn't like: Viewer began watching FOX 2 several years ago to avoid what he calls "Hollywood glitz & glamour," but now, since we are now covering entertainment news, we've lost him as a viewer.)
 - (1/13, 1/14) NORTH AMERICAN INT'L AUTO SHOW PRESS PREVIEW: 2 (Re: Electric cars, a South Lyon viewer owns a horse farm. He says he and his neighbors lose electricity 3X a year or more, so they all have generators. He feels the notion of electric cars is "stupid" because - as he says - they'll require larger transformers & other components that "aren't going to happen." He asks us to contact him, and he'll provide more details if we're interested. Another viewer watches Jason Carr on The Big Brown Couch every morning, enjoys the auto show commentary; she'd like him to ask re: why cars no longer have white wall tires.)
 - (1/13) RE: PROPOSED WOODWARD LIGHT RAIL SYSTEM: 1 (Viewer states that pursuit of a rail system would be a waste of money.)
