Min, was in Kansas City when he was called to the Trade Towers collapse in New York City with The Salvation Army. Rev. Dr. Tim Carentz was a young Air Force medic in D.C. when he got the call to the Pentagon on 9-11.

Bob Dittman talked with the CEO of the Baltimore Leadership School for Young Women, Chevonne Hall, about their success, and how they prepare students not only with STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) education, but the leadership skills for them to be successful in school and beyond. These young women, mainly of color, can begin taking classes as early as 6th grade, which Chevonne says is imperative, because reaching them at an early age, with leadership skills paired with academics, will lead to future

					success. The school works together with the Baltimore School District in enrollment procedures, and students are chosen through a lottery system after applying. There is no cost to the student's families, as BLSYW is considered a public school.

In New Jersey, all rail service remains suspended today, except the M&E and AC lines. Buses and light rail are still operating today with significant cancellations, detours and delays. Good news--I-83 is back open in York County, Pennsylvania. The power is out for more than 20,000 customers in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, and Connecticut. In Baltimore about 3500 people are still without power. In Maryland, the following roads are closed because of high water: Maryland 279 at Maryland 545; Maryland 7 at Catherine Street; and Maryland 222 between Ratledge Lane and Canal Road; also, Maryland 316 between Belle Hill road and Maryland 279. In Fredrick County, Maryland 77 is closed west of

					<p>Haughs Church Road because of high water. Michaels Mills Road in Buckeystown is also closed, just off Route 80, because of Monocacy River flooding. In Annapolis and Edgewater, a tornado that could have been as strong as an EF-3 tornado severely damaged at least 100 homes. KLOVE/Air1 ministry partner Convoy of Hope is on their way to bring meals, water, supplies and prayer support here to the areas affected by IDA.</p>
