It was the darkest season.” Grappling with this new solo responsibility, the divorced dad turned to his church for comfort and support. He was saddened to find very few Christian resources address the deep loneliness and doubt that many single parents endure. Out of his own need to be part of a welcoming faith community, Beeson founded the Solo Parent Society.

The Clean Green Team helps those maybe re-entering society from prison to learn skills in landscaping and also a paycheck working with clients the ministry has grown over the years. 					<p>unemployment, and enjoy connected families with happy and healthy children. In 2019, Community of Hope reached 1,227 families overcoming or threatened by homelessness and also helped 13,835 patients. The goal is to end homelessness for families in Washington, DC. With five housing programs, they keep families – all along the continuum of homelessness – safe with a roof over their heads. Case managers give families the support they need at the most pivotal times and link them to resources such as job referrals, counseling and mentoring programs for their children. They even offer a Midwifery service. Serving the under-resourced communities in Washington, DC, they have three Federally Qualified Health Centers and one community resource hub across the District that meet the medical, dental, and emotional wellness needs of the un- and under-insured.</p>

It is the only acceptable reality" and they have three major programs to assist people out of the cycle of poverty; Essential Support, which is a house full of furniture and home goods for people in transition; Workforce Development, everything you might need to get and keep a job; Neighborhood Partnerships, a collaborative model that walks with people and even neighborhoods right out of poverty. Project Mend-A-House replaces HVAC, electrical, windows, plumbing and more, while providing help to those who are disabled with ramps, elevators and modifications to hallways and kitchens.
