The Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association in your state and your state's high school association have produced and distributed a collection of radio public service announcements that celebrate the importance of high school sports. These commercials touch on aspects of high school sports that address their value to our community.

Gave update on the Rattlesnake Fire, and the expected smoke conditions on the highway in our area. Spoke with Steve Johnson, the Public Information Officer from the Forest Service.

Tyler also performed 4 original songs, and discussed local music artists and venues.
