April 2008

April 5, 2008

Jeff Bays and Ronald Cameron – Warriors Path District, Sequoyah Council Boy Scouts of America – Jeff and Ron brought us information about upcoming Scouting events such as the Scout Exposition, summer camping at Camp Davey Crockett and a host of other events. We discussed the new co-educational program for those 18 to 21 years of age. We also discussed in importance of the Scouting program in helping develop future leaders for our country.

Chris McCartt – Assistant to the City Manager, City of Kingsport – Chris brought us information regarding the “RiverWalk” project. The project, focusing on the arts, culture and heritage or history of the region will be an economic boost to our region. Plans are moving forward with the hiring of Sarah Pope to oversee the marketing of the project.

April 12, 2008

Barbara Kyte – Kingsport Convention and Visitors Bureau – Barbara brought us up to date on the AAU tournament programs coming to Kingsport, the ‘Hijacking’ program operated in conjunction with tour operators, and the events relate to National Tourism Week coming up in May.

Barry Brickey -- City of Kingsport Fire Department – Barry brought us spring and summer fire safety tips, particularly in relation to cooking out doors, propane usage, and outdoor fire places.

April 19, 2008

Bill Grigsby and John Moyle – Stephen Russell Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society – Bill and John brought us information regarding upcoming society events including a ‘beginners walk.’ Proper feeding and feed selection for a variety of birds and the importance of a healthy bird population to our environment were also discussed.

Martha Beverley and ‘Lightnin Charlie’ – City of Kingsport Cultural Arts Division – Martha brought us information regarding upcoming cultural arts enjoyment opportunities including the Red, Hot and Blue Review. Lightnin Charlie performed a sample of the music from the review and shared information about the other entertainers.

April 26, 2008

Marcy Sturgill – Frontier Health, Therapist – Marcy brought us information on the devastating effects of depression and how and where to get help. We also discussed the prevalence of domestic violence in today's society and its link to depression particularly among women.

David Oaks – Netherland Inn Steering Committee – David brought us information about the upcoming (2008) season at the Inn. Progress reports on the Bank Barn and the Flat Boat (life size) projects were provided and a call for membership issued.

May 2008

May 3, 2008

Anne Newton – Frontier Health – Anne brought us information on Children's Mental Health Month and the "Kid Power" event to be held at the Appalachian Fair Grounds. We discussed the nature and prevalence of mental health problems in our region; what to look for and how to get help. The "Kid Power" event is an annual awareness boosting event during Children's Mental Health Month.

Tammi Dye – Sullivan County Health Department – Tammi is the Assault Prevention & Tobacco Control Educator for the Sullivan County Health Department. Tammi brought us information on the prevalence of tobacco use in our area and the resultant health issues.

Almost 1,000 people per day in our region rely on the food provided by the 2nd Harvest Food Bank to its member clients. The need continues even increases in the summer months because of the "free lunch" children not being in school.

David Quillin – Deputy Chief Kingsport Police Department City of Kingsport Fire Department – David brought us up to date on the effectiveness of the red light cameras and the plans for future locations. He also provided us some personal protection tips.

May 17, 2008

Kingsport Mayor Dennis Phillips & Johnson City Mayor Dr. Phil Roe – There is more going on “behind the scenes” between the two largest regional cities. All is not competition and jealousy; cooperation is the order of the time. The future of the Air Port and the establishment of an air port authority were discussed in this 30 minute session.

May 24, 2008

Wayne Anderson – Sullivan County Sheriff – A fascinating 30 minutes finding out about the problems and challenges facing modern law enforcement in the region’s largest county. From patrol to courthouse security to housing inmates in the Sullivan County jail was fodder for the discussion.
