<b>Community</b>	KCTV5 News	3/3/14	5pm	1:43	Heather Staggers reported: The KCTV5 Green Impact Zone initiative is now closed after five years because of a lack of funding. Many in the area say the project had a positive impact on their neighborhoods by saving residents money on home repairs and utilities, but that it will take much more to fully revitalize the area.
<b>Community</b>	KCTV5 News	1/31/14	4pm	0:30	KCTV5 reported: City leaders may turn a church into living space in Lee's Summit. The Lee's Summit United Methodist Church is for sale because the congregation has grown too large for the building. There's been interest in turning the building into a senior housing facility.
<b>Community</b>	KCTV5 News	3/1/14	Noon	0:30	KCTV5 reported: The Metcalf South shopping center has been sold to Lane 4 Property Group and Kroenke Group. The two companies hope to be able to revive business in the aging shopping center. They also plan to purchase the recently vacated Kmart at the 95 West shopping center.
<b>Education</b>	KCTV5 News	2/12/14	10pm	1:30	Dave Jordan reported: A defective heating and cooling unit in Lincoln College Prep High school has left a school art classroom in terrible condition. A tipster sent us a photo of flooding, crumbling sheet rock and warped floor boards in the classroom. The Kansas City school district commented that repairs were being arranged within the next several weeks.
<b>Education</b>	KCTV5 News	1/29/14	10pm	1:05	Two years after the Kansas City School District lost its accreditation, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is holding meetings to get feedback on their current proposals to reaccredit the district. Parents at the meetings voiced concerns that DESE didn't understand community concerns and was essentially dismantling the district. DESE is still considering various options, and says they do not favor one plan over another at this point.
<b>Education</b>	KCTV5 News	3/4/14	10pm	2:30	Dave Jordan reported: The Hickman Mills school district is being audited for a questionable \$26,000 in travel expenses

					– mostly for ten board members to attend the national school board conference in Boston. The superintendent says the suggestions from the audit are already underway.
<b>Health</b>	KCTV5 News	2/24/14	6pm	1:37	Bonyen Lee reported: Pulse oximetry is a non-invasive, \$4 test to detect congenital heart defects in infants, but the Kansas Department of Health and Environment does not currently include it as part of the required screenings of all newborns.
<b>Health</b>	KCTV5 News	1/7/14	10pm	1:30	Betsy Webster reported: Doctors declared a California teen legally dead and want to take her off life support, but her parents are fighting to keep her alive. Local experts broke down the various medical and legal issues at play and compared it to similar cases from the past.
<b>Health</b>	KCTV5 News	3/10/14	10pm	0:30	KCTV5 reported: A new test may be able to predict Alzheimer's before the first symptoms appear. It's being developed at the Georgetown medical center, and reportedly has a 90 percent accuracy rate for determining whether a person will develop Alzheimers in the next three years.
<b>Charities</b>	KCTV5 News	1/6/14	10pm	1:25	Alice Barr reported: One Kansas City woman is without heat in zero-degree temperatures, sometimes sleeping in her car with only hand warmers for warmth. She and her pets have been without heat for a month because she is unable to pay her electricity bill. After our story aired, an outpouring of donations to Project Warmth paid off her bill.
<b>Charities</b>	KCTV5 News	1/20/14	5am	0:30	KCTV5 reported: Peyton Manning earned nearly \$25,000 for his charity during the AFC championship game by yelling "Omaha!" Eight businesses pledged to donate money each time he said the word at the line of scrimmage. Peyton managed to fit it in 31 times.

James says private money will fuel the effort, but that the city will do whatever it takes to bring the convention to Kansas City because of the business opportunities.
<b>Political</b>	KCTV5 News	3/6/14	6pm	1:45	Heather Staggers reported: Kansas City council members say they had no choice but to pass an amended gun ordinance to comply with Missouri state gun laws. The law previously prohibited anyone who was intoxicated from carrying a firearm, but now simply says they cannot fire the gun in a negligent manner.

In January Maddox used his position to threaten a clerk and said he would report the store if he was not given money he was owed. He was also censured last October for a disturbance with a Legoland security guard.
<b>Safety</b>	KCTV5 News	1/21/14	6am	0:45	KCTV5 reported: A Target security breach has compromised the credit card numbers and other personal information of 70-million Target customers. Now a security firm is saying that six more retailers have been hacked. If you've shopped at target recently, experts say to check all your bank and credit card information for any strange transactions.

They show up at the door of people with security systems, then ask to come inside to check their panel and even convince people to buy new equipment. Police say to call 911 if anyone suspicious comes to your door.

<b>Religion</b>	KCTV5 News	3/21/14	5am	0:40	KCTV5 reported: No funeral will be held for the founder of the Westboro Baptist Church. Fred Phelps and his church members say they've protested 53,000 events, including many military funerals and LGBT events. One local LGBT advocate said he hopes this is an opportunity to show the group love.
<b>Religion</b>	KCTV5 News	1/29/14	Noon	0:30	KCTV5 reported: A Roman street artist has created a mural depicting Pope Francis as a superman figure. The artist says they both fight for justice and eliminate corruption.
<b>Religion</b>	KCTV5 News	1/2/14	6pm	2:00	Bonyen Lee reported: A last-minute Supreme Court decisions mean that some religious institutions won't have to include birth control in their healthcare coverage. The Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas says it violates its religious beliefs to provide contraception.
<b>Social</b>	KCTV5 News	3/12/14	10pm	2:00	Dave Jordan reported: The Big 12 Championship kicked off in downtown Kansas City, and the Power & Light district was packed with basketball fans. People came from all over the country to watch the games at the Sprint Center, and the crowds meant big profits for local businesses.
<b>Social</b>	KCTV5 News	3/17/14	6pm	1:45	Bonyen Lee reported: Thousands of people took advantage of the nice weather for Kansas City's annual St. Patrick's Day parade. Police reported only two arrests – one was a man who hit a police horse with his elbow. One bar charged a \$5 cover charge and donated it to the Welcome House, a rehab facility for alcoholics.
<b>Social</b>	KCTV5 News	3/5/14	10pm	2:00	Alice Barr reported: An artist has created a doll that is a "more realistic" version of the classic Barbie doll. The real-world Barbie is meant to change the way young girls look at themselves. We spoke to local moms and little girls to get their reaction to the doll.
<b>Environment</b>	KCTV5 News	3/5/14	6pm	2:00	Alan Shope reported: Farmers and businesses along the Missouri River have been ravaged by flood waters four of the last seven years. Now some of those farmers are filing a

					federal lawsuit against the Army Corps of Engineers for causing the flooding and costing them land. They are seeking \$250 million in damages.
<b>Environment</b>	KCTV5 News	1/30/14	5am	0:30	KCTV5 reported: Results are expected to be released today from the environmental impact study of the possible Keystone XL pipeline. If approved, the pipeline would carry 830,000 barrels of oil a day from Canada to the U.S. gulf coast. A final decision may not be made for several months.
<b>Environment</b>	KCTV5 News	1/22/14	4pm	0:30	KCTV5 reported: Crews spent the day pulling debris from the Kansas River. They found three cars and dozens of car parts. The Kansas Department of Transportation is clearing the river to make it safer for barge traffic and improve the river's environment.
