The following issues were of greatest community concerns to the listeners in the WYOS broadcast area for the quarter:

Economic issues (includes stories on job trends, local employment opportunities, economic development projects and proposals and updates on development projects.)

Hunger/ Homelessness (includes stories involving on-going and new programs that address food and/or housing insecurity, fund and resource raising efforts and programs that work to improve the lives of the disadvantaged and return them to contributors to society)

Crime/ Criminal Justice (includes prevention information, warnings about scam activities, police requests for information in cases like missing persons and warrants.)

Substance Abuse (includes stories that are not specific to drug use as a criminal activity but deal with efforts to stop the current addiction epidemic and treatment/ recovery efforts)

Culture/Arts/Family Education (includes stories about local history and culture, programs that educate and entertain families and promote new arts and entertainment initiatives)
