During the past quarter the issues shown below have been significant to our community. We ran the following programs to address those issues.

ISSUE: Finances

DATE: July 17

PROGRAM: My Money Life

TIME: 2:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

DURATION: 2 minutes each program

Host and financial advisor Church Bentley explained how a bad credit score can negatively affect many areas of life such as securing a car loan, buying a house or renting an apartment. He gave several ways in which a bad credit score could be repaired. He suggested paying bills on time and paying down debt as just a couple of ways to improve a credit score.

ISSUE: Dealing with being a widow

DATE: July 27 and July 28

PROGRAM: Focus on the Family

TIME: 12:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m.

DURATION: 28.5 minutes each program

Host Jim Daly invited his guest Robyn Dykstra to share her story of how she lost two husbands within a few years. She also told how that experience deeply affected her life and how she was also to find hope to cope with these troubling circumstances. On this broadcast, host and teacher Dr. David Jeremiah offered encouragement to listeners going through difficult life situations. Dr. Jeremiah explained how painful surprises in life are often opportunities for growth. He also offered other encouragement and hope to those finding themselves in the midst of hard times.

ISSUE: Pornography

PROGRAM: My FamilyTalk

TIME: 11:30 a.m. and 9:15 p.m. DURATION: 2 minutes each program

Host and family expert Dr. James Dobson talked about the dangers of pornography on this broadcast. Dobson served on the U.S. Attorney General's Commission on Pornography. He said that pornography contains unthinkable violence against women and the abuse of children. As a child psychologist he explained how terribly destructive this material is especially on boys in early adolescence. Dobson pled with parents to monitor what kids are accessing online.
