During the past quarter the issues shown below have been significant to our community.

We ran the following programs to address those issues.

ISSUE: Mental Illness DATE: October 23
PROGRAM: Focus on the Family TIME: 12:31 a.m. and 9:31 a.m.
DURATION: 28.5 minutes each program

Host Jim Daly talked with his guest Dr. Matthew Stanford about treating mental health issues with a holistic approach -- addressing physical, spiritual, emotional, and relational needs. Dr. Stanford shared that one in five adults suffer from a mental illness. His desire was to offer compassion, hope and healing to those suffering from this type of illness.

PROGRAM: My Money Life TIME: 2:31 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.
DURATION: 2 minutes each program

Host and financial advisor Chuck Bentley offered hope and help to those struggling with financial debt. Bentley gave several ideas to help listeners achieve financial freedom including making lifestyle changes, creating a truly functional budget, and considering an extra job.

ISSUE: Autism in children DATE: October 26
PROGRAM: Family Talk TIME: 2:34 a.m.
DURATION: 26 minutes each program

Host and family expert Dr. James Dobson talked with his guests Chuck and Emily Colson about Emily's son, Max, who has been diagnosed with autism. They shared that parents of special needs children often experience a unique joy and perspective that other parents may never encounter. They also offered hope and help for parents involved in the challenging task of raising an autistic child.

PROGRAM: Living a Legacy TIME: Saturdays at 12:36 a.m. Sundays at 6:36 p.m.
DURATION: 24 minutes each program

In a world suffering from war, disease and natural disasters, Crawford Loritts host and teacher of the program "Living A Legacy" helped listeners to build their courage through a two-part message titled "Call to Courage". Using the Biblical example of Joshua, Loritts showed listeners the importance of courage in our world today and how to build this characteristic by acquiring wisdom and trust.

PROGRAM: My Family Talk

DATE: November 15
TIME: 11:31 a.m. and 9:15 p.m.
DURATION: 1.5 minutes each program

On this broadcast, host and family expert Dr. James Dobson talked to parents about helping children who are shy. Dobson shared that shyness occurs in 15% of children and in most cases tends to be a lifelong characteristic. He advises parents of shy children to not try to change the basic temperament of a child. Parents, however, can help children to learn how to cope with new and threatening situations. It is always best, though, to accept a child the way they were designed.

ISSUE: Leadership
PROGRAM: Insight for Living

DURATION: 27.5 minutes each program

On this broadcast host and teacher Chuck Swindoll talked about what it takes to build good leadership skills. He shared real-life stories about courageous leaders. He related those stories to listeners who tirelessly serve their fellow co-workers and family members often with little or no applause. Swindoll called those leaders "silent heroes" and promised that their efforts would not go unnoticed forever.

Host Jim Daly talked with Chaplain Bill Goodrich about the forgotten generation -- the elderly. He says this generation needs and deserves our love and attention. He also explained that many elderly residents of nursing homes rarely if ever have an outside visitor. Among other things, Goodrich shared how a simple visit could make a real difference in the life of an elderly person.
