<p>The Franklin County Fair may resume this year... The fair board of directors is optimistic that they will be able to have the fair, and are planning to announce the entertainment lineup on January 20th, with tickets then going on sale online on January 25th. The fair was canceled last summer due to coronavirus, but according to published reports this morning, the 2021 Franklin County Fair is... for now anyway... on the schedule for August 7th through August 15th. In the meantime, other events scheduled at the fairgrounds include a car show, flea market, and horse shows, all starting in June.</p>				
North Country Chamber Dealing With Shutdown In Quebec	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	01/10/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>The North Country Chamber of Commerce is working on how to deal with cross border impacts from the announced shutdown of most activity in Quebec as of Saturday. The province-wide shut down and curfew is to be in effect until February 8th, and require all non-essential businesses to close. There will also be a curfew daily from 8PM to 5AM. The Chamber says they have been assured that there will be no interference with essential personnel commuting across the border, including the hundreds of Quebec doctors, nurses and health care professionals who are a vital part of the North Country's health care system.</p>

<p>Alice Hyde Medical Center is expanding hours for no-cost, state-sponsored COVID-19 testing at its Drive-Thru COVID-19 Testing Site on Park Street in Malone, due to a recent increase in demand. The site, located behind Alice Hyde Occupational Health & Wellness at 130 Park Street, will offer testing to asymptomatic individuals who meet specific criteria from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday – Friday. Ellis has also been heavily involved in emergency services in the community. He is a past president, treasurer and director of Malone Call firemen, and is also a past president and a founding member of Malone EMS. From 2014 to 2019 he served on the Holy Family School Education Council, and he currently serves as a Franklin County Republican Committee member.</p>				

CHATEAUGAY PUBLIC HEARING FOR GRANT	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	01/31/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>The Chateaugay Town Board has voted unanimously in favor of signing a \$1,450 combination agreement with the Friends of the North Country to apply for a community development block grant that could be worth up to \$500,000. If the grant is approved, Town Board members say they would like to use the money for mobile home replacement and housing rehabilitation. The agreement was approved following an open public hearing, but nobody from the public showed up for it.</p>				
CITIZEN ADVOCATES GET GRANT	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	02/07/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>A \$4 million grant was awarded to Citizen Advocates for the expanded delivery of comprehensive services through an innovative program designed to focus on the treatment needs for individuals with serious mental health and addiction conditions. The grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration was pursued so Citizen Advocates could expand its Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic program into St. Lawrence County. Currently, Citizen Advocates is operating a CCHBC demonstration program through its clinic in Malone, where it delivers a full array of services to support individuals with a severe or chronic mental health and addiction diagnosis.</p>				
DUMAS TO RUN FOR JUDGE	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	02/14/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>Following the retirement of Judge Robert G. Main Jr., Peter Dumas has announced that he plans to seek a seat on the Franklin County bench. He plans to begin his Petition Process, starting March 2nd. He points to his 21 years of experience in practice. Dumas received his Bachelor's degree from the State University of New York at Oswego. He received his Juris Doctorate from Pace Law School, before returning to Malone to practice law as an associate at the Law Office of Attorney John A. Piasecki. He then opened his own practice in 2006 and has focused mainly on criminal defense and family court work.</p>				
LOCAL HOSPITAL IN THE RED	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	02/21/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>Despite a better-than-expected close to its 2020 Fiscal year and millions of dollars in federal stimulus funds, yesterday the hospital reported that it lost millions of dollars through the first three months of its 2021 fiscal year. The operating loss of \$2.425 million through December 31, 2020 was offset somewhat by a little more than \$1 million in CARES Act stimulus funding over the same three- month time period, bringing Alice Hyde's net operating loss for the period of Oct. 1 through Dec. 31 to \$1.365 million.</p>				
FRANKLIN COUNTY COVID NUMBERS ON ROLLER COASTER	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	02/28/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>While Franklin County's COVID-19 positivity rate as of earlier this week dropped from 7.6% to 4.2%, the rolling 7-day positivity rate as of Thursday held steady at around 7.5%. 10 new cases were reported. None of them were in the area prisons though, and the number of active cases in the three prisons in the Malone area remained at 190. In Franklin County, 579 people remained in quarantine as of yesterday, and the total number of positive cases since last March, now stands at 2,072. There has been a total of 13 deaths... 2 of them inmates.</p>				

ALONE BUDGET TWEEDS	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	03/07/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>The Malone Village Board of Trustees met Wednesday morning, and work began on the police department and the joint recreation commission budgets. Meetings were formerly held on Saturdays, but due to low attendance by the public, they have now been shifted to mid-week. The Mayor stated that while the preliminary budget for the police department remains flat... at just over \$1 Million... the joint recreation commission's budget is going down five percent from last year's total, coming in at just under \$173,000.</p>				
FRANKLIN COUNTY QUARANTINE RESTRICTIONS LOOSEMED	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	03/14/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>In Franklin County, anyone who has been vaccinated against COVID-19 is now no longer being asked to quarantine as long as they meet a set of requirements. Effective as of last Wednesday — and until formal state guidance is issued — vaccinated Franklin County residents with a possible or confirmed exposure will not be required to quarantine in most cases. However, determining eligibility adds another layer to the contact tracing investigation, which can take some time to verify. Franklin County residents who receive a call to quarantine and meet the vaccination requirements now should call 518-481-1709 to request a release from quarantine.</p>

<p>Sports are returning to Chateaugay... On Monday, the Chateaugay Central Board of Education... by a vote of 4-1... approved to permit a four-to-five-game season for varsity/junior varsity volleyball and modified boys and girls basketball. It will be called "Fall II" and it is being called a final opportunity for all seniors to have "one last hurrah"... a chance to have fun and take pictures doing something fun. Student-athletes will be tested for COVID-19 on Wednesday. Practice begins on or about March 29. Games for the Bulldogs start on April 13th. The Fall II season for Chateaugay will end on April 25.</p>				
VISITORS WELCOMED BACK AT MALONE HOSPITAL	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	03/28/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>The University of Vermont – Alice Hyde Medical Center in Malone will welcome back visitors beginning today at noon in both inpatient units and in the Emergency Department. Visitation at other local facilities, clinics and services remains restricted, however there are plans in the works to loosen visitation restrictions at physician offices and outpatient clinics. There are restrictions still in place, and all visitors must be 18 years of age or older. The decision to resume visitation was based on the low, 7-day average COVID-19 positivity rate of 1.97 percent now in Malone.</p>
