<p>After much discussion and a lot of time spent in meetings, the Malone Village Trustees on Wednesday, voted to send the police reform plan to Albany. The original plan went through several revisions before the final draft was finally adopted Wednesday morning. The initial draft had been available online for weeks prior to the heavy criticism it received at a recent public hearing. They say it includes recommendations for training the police department is already doing. Malone Police Chief Christopher Premo commented that the department started diversity and de-escalation training back in 2019.</p>

<p>The town of Chateaugay is taking a leap into current technology that can provide residents with important news updates immediately. It's an app that is available fast and free from either the App Store or Google Play Store called "My City Pocket." Simply download the app on your smart phone, then search for Chateaugay, and set up the specific kinds of notifications you want to receive on your phone. The town purchased the app and pays for the cost of providing the services, and will also pay a yearly fee to be a part of the app's database.</p>

<p>New York state has eased reopening restrictions on schools to allow most students to sit closer together as long as they continue to wear masks. But before they can make any changes, school districts will have to allow parents, school staff and local health officials to weigh in, under guidance released by the state Department of Health. "Ultimately, the school/district's decision to move to shorter physical distances will come down to a local community's risk tolerance based on its unique circumstances," the 24-page document released late Friday said.</p>

<p>Malone Village Trustees met Wednesday to go over the final details of the budget. They agreed on a 1.016% tax levy increase, and a tax rate increase of 0.748% to help cover the slightly more than \$7.38 million proposed budget. It all adds up to just shy of a fifteen cent increase per thousand dollars of assessed value. The tax rate for the current year is 19.73. Under the new budget proposal, next year's tax rate will be 19.87. A public hearing on the final budget will take place at 6 p.m. Monday.</p>

<p>The Malone Central School District has released plans that include an in-person ceremony for Franklin Academy's Class of 2021. It will be held on Saturday, June 26, at 10 a.m., with rain dates of Saturday, June 26, at 4 p.m. or Sunday, June 27, at 2 p.m. The ceremony will also be streamed live online for those</p>				

<p>who can't attend. Under current state rules, only up to 500 people, excluding graduates will be admitted and each graduate can invite three guests. Also, proof of a recent negative COVID-19 test or of immunization is required to attend.</p>

<p>As New York State continues to struggle to re-open after the devastating shutdowns by Governor Andrew Cuomo that have dragged on for more than a year now, US officials are pointing fingers at Canadian officials... asking for a firm plan to reopen the northern border. It has been about 14 months now since the international border was closed to all but so-called "essential travel" with no end in sight. Thousands of American and Canadian property owners and businesses are at risk of losing another summer season. New York State alone... according to some estimates... risks the loss of more than \$900 million.</p>

<p>A proposed law is now set for review later this month in Franklin County that would create a pilot youth deer hunting season for local 12 and 13 year olds. A public hearing is scheduled for May 20, at 10am in the Chamber of the Legislature, on the Franklin County Courthouse's fourth floor. If passed, the new law would allow the county to permit anyone 12 or 13 years old to take part in a test program through 2023 that would teach them new and safe hunting practices... and allow them to hunt deer with firearms and crossbows. The hearing will also be streamed online.</p>

<p>Not long ago, we relayed the good news that the Franklin County Fair will return this year from August 6th through the 15th. Now comes more good news... Planners of county fairs across New York State say as the coronavirus pandemic continues to wind down, more local fairs will be held again this summer... IF they get further word from Governor Andrew Cuomo... who so far has been dragging his feet according to some fair planners. Many vendors say making a profit at a reduced capacity is a serious concern.</p>

<p>A data breach many have exposed the personal information of more than 800 patients of Adirondack Health... operator of Adirondack Medical Center in Saranac Lake; the Lake Placid Health and Medical Fitness Center; and the Mercy Living Center in Tupper Lake. Patients' first names, last names, dates of birth, prescription information and medical record numbers could all have been compromised when a third-party vendor experienced a ransomware attack back in February. Every patient whose information may have been exposed will be notified via mail.</p>

<p>It's almost like the end of prohibition... bars and restaurants in New York no longer have to close at midnight. Governor Andrew Cuomo now says bars and restaurants can return to the closing times that their liquor licenses or other regulations allow. Bar and restaurant owners have been looking forward to the later hours as they try to recover from the drastic shutdowns and other limitations that Cuomo forced upon on their business for more than a year now. Meanwhile, the state and federal investigations into Cuomo's actions during the coronavirus scare, continue to ramp up.</p>

<p>Governor Andrew Cuomo announced on Tuesday, that New York state-mandated COVID restrictions on commercial and social settings were being lifted effective immediately. That mean no more restrictions across the board for sports, construction, manufacturing, camps, offices, buildings, and other places. Social gathering limits and capacity restrictions, along with contact information for tracking have also been eliminated. Any federal guidelines involving schools, health care and mass transit however, remain. Fireworks were held at many places across the state to mark the occasion, including in Lake Placid.</p>				
AGRIMARK EXPANDING	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	06/20/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>A groundbreaking ceremony held Friday in Chateaugay marks the beginning of the next phase of a \$30 Million cheese plant modernization project by Agri-Mark... the dairy cooperative that is such a critical part of the Franklin County economy. The Farm and Cheese factory is being expanded toward by about 6,600 square feet, and the cooperative's 110,641 square foot manufacturing center will be rebuilt with new machinery and other equipment, which all means an increase in production by about 23% more cheese per day. It will mean the retention of the current 106 full-time jobs too. The expansion is expected to be completed sometime in 2023.</p>				
BORDER CLOSURE EXTENDED YET AGAIN!	EYE ON THE COMMUNITY	06/27/2021	6AM	30 MIN
<p>Canadian Prime Minister Justine Trudeau now says the Canada-US border will remain closed until July 21st. Canada has also not yet ended its strict rules for international travelers entering Canada on flights, including getting a negative Covid test and a minimum three day stay in a quarantine hotel. The penalties for not following the quarantine requirements include a fine of up to \$750,000 and 6 months of jail time. Assemblyman Billy Jones said Canada should lift border restrictions immediately... saying it is unconscionable that there continues to be no plan forward from the federal governments to reopen the border.</p>
