2. <u>Charity 12 Hour Fundraiser</u>	Open Line	10/09/18	3:00:00	KSCJ participated in the "Big Give;" a 12 hour one day giving event that helped 103 nonprofit agencies and charities. We interviewed representatives from mental health, to children's activities, to help individuals with Down Syndrome. The event was presented by the Siouxland Community Foundation.
3. <u>Domestic Violence</u>	Drivetime Live	10/17/18	11:00	Shelli Jervik, Sioux City Advocate for "Safe at Home" will talk about domestic violence awareness in Sioux City and the state.
4. <u>Military Enlistment</u>	Open Line	10/26/18	15:00	Members of the Air Force Jr. ROTC talked about their military involvement in high school, how it will lead them down their career path, and what steps to take to join the military or ROTC in high school and then college.
5. <u>Opioid Crisis</u>	Grow Siouxland	11/03/18	10:45	Admiral James and Mary Winnefeld from S.A.F.E. (Stop the Addiction Fatality Epidemic) talked about the Opioid epidemic in the United States, losing their child to an overdose, and how to prevent the crisis in your home.
6. <u>Veteran's Affairs</u>	Open Line	11/09/18	22:30	Members of the Veterans Affairs administration talked about Veterans services leading to Veteran's Day and how veterans can reach out for a wide variety of services including mental, physical, emotional, and in helping with monetary concerns.
7. <u>Cyber Security / Financial Matters</u>	InfoTrak	11/18/18	7:43	Ryan Kalember, Senior Vice President of Cybersecurity Strategy for online security company Proofpoint. Scammers have devised a new scheme to steal thousands of dollars from homebuyers who are about to close on a house. Mr. Kalember said buyers are often tricked into wiring their down payment on the day of closing to a fraudulent offshore account, by criminals who have hacked their real estate agent's or title company's email account. He explained how consumers can protect themselves.
8. <u>Holiday Travel Safety</u>	KSCJ News	11/20/18	1:30	Sheriff Dave Drew, County Sheriff, talked about safe travel throughout the holiday weekend, increased risk of traveling, and DUI awareness with holiday gatherings.

- 10: Gambling Addiction      Drivetime Live      12/06/18      15:00      Keith Whyte, Executive Director of the National Council on Problem Gambling Millions of Americans are hooked on gambling, and at least 40 states are addicted to gambling revenue. Mr. Whyte said states have not taken the measures needed to address gambling addiction, as they have greatly expanded gambling in the past ten years. He talked about the most common characteristics of those addicted to gambling and how to recognize if someone has a problem.

Childrens Healthcare      KSCJ News      12/12/18      1:25      Changes could be coming to Hawk-I with Iowa's cost for a children's health insurance program is set to jump from \$7 million to \$37 million over the next two years because of changes approved by Congress that reduce federal funding. HAWK-I provides health insurance to 70,000 children from families with moderate income.

Mental Health      InfoTrak      12/23/18      7:57      Gina LaRoche, organizational consultant, executive coach, co-founder of Seven Stones Leadership Group, co-author of "The 7 Laws of Enough: Cultivating a Life of Sustainable Abundance" Ms. LaRoche said counting your blessings year-round can be good for your mental health and well-being, ultimately boosting a person's chances of success. She talked about ways to avoid a "scarcity mentality," where more is always better and having more will lead to happiness. She talked about the influence of social media on this mentality.

Alcohol / Safe Driving      KSCJ News      12/31/18      1:05      Fred Zwonechek, Nebraska Highway Safety Administrator, says if you drink and have a good time, make sure you have a designated driver to take you home: The Nebraska State Patrol as well as 22 police departments and 28 sheriff's offices will have extra officers out for the final holiday of the annual "You Drink and Drive, You Lose" campaign. Nebraska suffered 71 alcohol-related traffic fatalities in the last year.
