WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Auto safety:** Members from the Car Care Council discussed getting your car set for the winter driving season. They talked about their "Be Car Care Aware" campaign and "Car Care Guide."
- **Cancer screenings/Early detection:** James Cancer Center officials discussed how many people believe women are less likely to get colon cancer. They said the truth is that men and women are equally likely to be affected. They talked about the importance of regular screenings.
- **Diabetes education:** Charles Farmer, Communications Director for the Central Ohio Diabetes Association, discussed how diabetes, if left untreated, can lead to serious problems such as heart disease, stroke, blindness and kidney disease.
- **Health and wellness:** Members of the Ohio Health and Wellness Corps talked about the ways to get around being too busy to make health-conscious decisions when it comes to eating.
- **Health awareness:** Ohio Health officials discussed knowing blood pressure, cholesterol and body mass index numbers and taking health assessment opportunities on a regular basis.
- **Holiday volunteering:** This special edition featured area volunteers who take time during the holidays to help out at community food pantries, homeless shelters and senior facilities.
- **Home safety:** Officials from the Ohio Home Safety Foundation talked about how almost two-thirds of home fire deaths were in places without working smoke alarms. They offered information about protecting your home and family.
- **Military & Veterans:** This special edition was produced by iHeartRadio and titled "The Sounds of Heroes: A Special Presentation From iHeartRadio and Musicians On Call." Hosted by Bobby Bones and Sharon Reid, the program paid tribute to America's war heroes and active-duty members of the military. It told the story of Musicians On Call's mission of bringing musicians into hospitals, nursing homes and hospice centers, performing bedside for patients and lifting the spirits of

those who have served our country.

- **Music's impact on children's lives:** This special edition, produced by iHeartRadio, and titled "Music Helps Me Be Understood" explored the ways in which music can unlock the potential of those who struggle with reading, math, organization or focus. The show featured stories from experts, teachers, parents and kids with learning and attention issues and how music has such a big impact on these children's lives. Host by Dave Savage.
- **Ohio State Student Ambassador Program:** Megan Turner, a coordinator for the Student Ambassador Program at Ohio State University, talked about how the program is good for parents who want their kids to become more globally aware.
