WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Advances in diabetes treatment:** Charles Farmer, Communications Director with the Central Ohio Diabetes Association, talked about how medical innovations are helping patients with diabetes inject insulin more comfortably. He also talked about how the organization is working to dispel the myth that injections are painful. Farmer is a member of the Clear Channel Media + Entertainment - Columbus Local Advisory Board (LAB).
- **Assistance for blinded veterans:** Adam Ellison, a veteran and member of Blinded Veterans of America, talked about how the organization helps to secure the compensation and disability benefits for which they are eligible.
- **Assistance for caregivers:** Staff members from the Alzheimer's Association discussed resources available to help families caring for a family member with Alzheimer's disease or dementia. They explained a kit that is available and is a collection of tips and resources to help families handle difficult behaviors caused by the diseases.
- **Assistance for small businesses:** Carol Wilkerson, Regional Manager with the Ohio Small Business Administration, talked about the various ways businesses can rebuild after an accident or a natural disaster.
- **Cord blood donation:** Diana Jensen of Lifeline of Ohio talked about how umbilical cord blood donation could be a cure for patients fighting life-threatening blood cancers like leukemia and lymphoma. She said the donation is free and does not affect labor, delivery or a baby's health. We posted a link to their online information on the WTVN Communities Web page.
- **Family finances and banking options:** Amy Olsen of the Ohio Community Bank Association discussed how a growing number of people are finding that keeping their checking and savings accounts at the same bank is costing them money. She said it was because many traditional banks no longer focus on savings. She also stated that the national average interest rate for savings accounts doesn't even keep up with inflation. She offered a brochure to listeners about viable alternative banking options.
- **Literacy:** Staff members from the Ohio Department of Education talk about their Central Ohio school-based reading programs in collaboration with the Read Across America Month campaign.
- **Neighborhood collaboration:** Michelle Miller of the Central Ohio Neighborhood Collaborative talked about how the organization has successfully linked suburban areas like Hilliard and Dublin to promote neighborhood safety. She discussed how many of the same crimes happen in both suburban and inner-city

areas, especially drug-trafficking.

- **Safety in the home:** Staff members from the Central Ohio Council on Neighborhood Safety talked about simple safety tips that help people feel safe at home. They included special deadbolts to protect against lock drilling and picking and lamp timers. They offered information on how the Council provides safety services free to seniors in the community.
- **von Willebrand disease:** Josie Weiss, a certified nurse practitioner, talked about the hereditary bleeding order von Willebrand disease. She discussed in detail a recent survey commissioned by the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners which found that nearly half of the women who have the signs and symptoms don't discuss them with their health care provider. We posted a link to the Academy's online information via the WTVN Communities Web page.
- **Winter and indoor allergens:** Andrew Feast, Director of Development for the American Lung Association, discussed how allergy sufferers can relieve their symptoms significantly by getting dust, dander and other allergy triggers out of their homes. - **Women and heart health:** Brianne Harman of the American Heart Association of Central Ohio discussed women's heart health issues and the Go Red For Women campaign during February.
