WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Car care**: Members from the Car Care Council discussed how important it is to invest an hour or two to have your vehicle checked to stay safe on the road and avoid the hassle of a breakdown and cost of unexpected repairs.
- **Care for caregivers**: Officials from the Central Ohio Area Agency On Aging talked about how many people take the role of caregiver, yet they don't always do all they need to do to care for themselves.
- Care for the aging: Officials from the Ohio Department of Health and Human Services talked about how many of the nation's 72 million baby boomers have reached their 60s, and how they can help families provide care for older adults and others with chronic health problems.
- Children's Miracle Network Hospital Week: This special edition kicked off the Children's Miracle Network's Hospital Week in support of over 171 local hospitals across the country and highlighted personal patient and family stories related to local hospital treatment. Produced by the iHeartRadio Community Engagement Team.
- **Crime**: Ministers from area churches discussed the record-breaking number of homicides in 2017 and how it is trending to be the same or worse in 2018, with 10 homicides so far as of the recording date of this program. They talked how a collaboration of churches in the community can affect change.
