WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Asthma/Lung health:** Andrew Feast of the American Lung Association of Central Ohio talked about the thousands of Central Ohioans suffering from allergies and asthma. He discussed ways to reduce your exposure to pollen, dust mites and other allergens.
- **Bullying:** Members of Parents Preventing Bullying talked about protecting children from bullies in several ways, such as helping kids feel more confident about talking to a trusted adult and minimizing situations where bullying can occur.
- **College entry:** Officials from Ohio Department of Education gave tips on thinking ahead to help with college entry. They said starting in your sophomore year in high school, collect and organize applications, recommendations, test scores, essays and transcripts. We posted information on filling out the free application for Federal Student Aid forms on the iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Consumer credit:** Chris Harding of Central Ohio Financial Planning offered information for consumers who want to improve or maintain their credit standing. He discussed regulations on credit reporting and how they might provide consumers with a better understanding of how lenders view their credit history.
- **Environmental/Recycling:** Student volunteers from The Ohio State University's Ohio Recycles program talked about how recycling plastics keeps the material out of landfills and helps support Central Ohio businesses that make a variety of innovative products with recycled plastics.
- **Eye health:** Staff members from Prevent Blindness Ohio discussed how many people aged 55 or over are unaware of a leading cause of vision loss---age-related macular degeneration. They said that in a Prevent Blindness America survey only half of the respondents could identify any one symptom or its treatment options. We posted their awareness information on the iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Financial planning:** Staff members from Central Ohio Financial Planning discussed the importance of financial planning for young families. They said that planning for a financially secure future should be one of

their top priorities. We posted information about disability income and critical illness insurance on the iHeartMedia Communities page.

- **Gambling addiction:** Staff members from the Ohio Problem Gambling Helpline talked about illegal sports betting and how huge an industry it is in Ohio. They discussed programs that help gambling addicts seeking help to overcome temptation.
- **Heart health:** Staff members from the Central Ohio American Heart Association talked about a life-threatening condition that affects millions of people---heart arrhythmia. They said if left untreated it can lead to sudden cardiac death. We posted treatment information and other heart health information on the iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Managing diabetes:** Charles Farmer, Communications Director with the Central Ohio Diabetes Association, gave information for those who have recently learned that they have Type Two diabetes.
