WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **9/11 Day/Concerns of insurance consumers:** Representatives from the Ohio Insurance Institute answered listener concerns about ensuring ethical insurance practices by companies. Also, a look back at September 11, 2001 and how it changed the way we live today. Host Mike Eiland discussed 9/11 Day activities.
- **Achieving small business success:** Representatives from the U.S. Small Business Administration talked about its most recent website upgrade that will provide easier access to information about ways to start up, grow and achieve small business success.
- **Avoiding foreclosure scams:** Local mortgage servicing representatives talked about how people can avoid losing their homes by working with their mortgage lenders and avoid foreclosure scams.
- **Avoiding sports injuries and dehydration:** Local school sports representatives discussed the sports programs in full swing for the new school year, and the increased concern about proper hydration and avoiding serious injuries.
