WTVN Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Disaster relief: This special edition, produced by iHeartRadio, covered he monetary and tangible item donations, along with on-site volunteer aid for the victims of Hurricane Harvey, a natural disaster that took place less than a week before this broadcast.
- Disaster relief (Part II): This edition was a follow-up to the September 3, 2017 program, where at this time a second hurricane struck (Irma). This special program, produced by iHeartRadio, explored the combined efforts to provide relief from the destruction of both Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Irma.
- Eye health for children: Prevent Blindness Ohio staff members discussed how many parents have recognized that eye injuries are the leading cause of blindness in children in the U.S., and many are sports-related. They said parents have stepped up the use of protective eye wear for their children as a result.
- Eye health for veterans: Blinded Veterans of America officials discussed the Military Eye Trauma Center of Excellence and Trauma Therapy. They said the registry analyzes and tracks both the injuries and the care veterans get.
- Heart health: American Heart Association officials talked about how people are kept from restful sleep by obstructive sleep apnea, a chronic disease that involves the repeated collapse of the upper airway during sleep. They discussed available treatments.
- Home safety: American Red Cross officials talked about fires that are caused by faulty products but also caused by misuse and poor maintenance of electrical equipment and incorrectly installed wiring.
- Managing Alzheimer's disease: Alzheimer Foundation officials talked about how reminiscence therapy involves caregivers using personal items such as old photos or music to rekindle memories.
- Public safety: Columbus law enforcement officials discussed the stepped-up measures to ensure safety during 4th of July holiday festivities.

- Retirement savings: Ohio Administration on Aging officials discussed how workers are less confident that they'll be able to afford a comfortable retirement. They offered information on how to do retirement savings calculations to improve confidence.
- Skin health: Members from the American Academy of Dermatology discussed protecting against sun damage and premature skin aging.
- Small business assistance: Officials from the U.S. Small Business Administration offered information for those who own a business or are thinking of starting one.
- Volunteer firefighters: Local fire department officials talked about how seven out of ten fire fighters and emergency responders are volunteers. They offered information on how to find local volunteer opportunities.
- Women's health: Ohio State University James Cancer Center officials discussed how women can improve their odds of staying healthy, with the focus on screenings for colorectal cancer, the third leading cause of cancer death in women.
