WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Adoption: Staff members from Central Ohio Adoption Service discussed technology that is being used to speed up the adoption process. They said it is a secure and searchable network for adoption professionals, which is designed to provide adoption agencies with one central database that connects them to other organizations. They said the goal is faster connections between expectant mothers and adoptive parents.
- Disaster preparedness: Volunteers from the American Red Cross discussed being prepared for disasters with survival kits and a plan of action. We posted disaster preparedness information on the WTVN iHeartMedia Communities page.
- Elder care: Gail Johnson of Central Senior Life talked about how an organization called Direct Support Professionals helps the elderly and disabled live and work in their own communities rather than being forced to live in an institutional setting.
- Eye health: Meg Collins of Prevent Blindness Ohio talked about how 80 percent of people in America aged 55 or are unaware of a leading cause of vision loss, which is age-related macular degeneration. We linked to their online information from the WTVN iHeartMedia Communities page.
- Foster care transition: Kelly Vzyral, Assistant Director for Government Relations for the Ohio Association of Child Caring Agencies, talked about the tough transitions young people face when aging out of foster care and gave information about the programs and services available.
