Quarterly Issues/Programs List

WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Arthritis management:** Representatives from the Arthritis Foundation of Central Ohio talked about the growing program that encourages manufacturers to design and offer user-friendly products and packaging. They said that such packaging allows tasks to get done with less stress on joints.
- **Cancer research:** Representatives from The Ohio State University James Cancer Center talked about the progress of cancer research at the university, and outlined many encouraging medical breakthroughs.
- **Cyber bullying/Runaway teens:** This edition continued an earlier discussion with staff members from the Ohio Runaway Switchboard, and focused on teens being able to talk to a real person when they need help, especially among runaway and throwaway youth. They discussed the details of establishing trust as a key element and how it is best achieved by hearing a person's voice, as opposed to social media.
- **Eye health of premature infants:** Representatives from the American Optometric Association talked about how scientists have confirmed a way to reduce the risk of blindness in premature infants. They said that through an eye exam, doctors can identify which infants are most likely to benefit from early treatment for potentially blinding eye conditions.
- **Financial elder abuse:** Representatives from the Central Ohio Area Agency On Aging talked about how elderly citizens can fall prey to financial abuse and how the warning signs are easy to recognize. They said bills not being paid and money missing from accounts are some of the big red flags. We posted their helpful information on our iHeartMedia Communities page, with a link to the agency's website as well.
- **Financial protection for a critical illness:** Representatives from the Ohio Insurance Institute discussed how a critical illness, such as cancer, a heart attack or stroke, can reduce a family's income by more than 12,000 in the first year alone - even with medical coverage. They offered extensive information on preparing for income loss and spikes in expenses that may be associated with a major illness.

- **Martin Luther King, Jr. Day:** Staff members from the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Arts Complex discussed the programs and celebrations taking place at the Center and around town for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day
- **Pain management:** Representatives from the Ohio Dental Association offered information for people who suffer from chronic pain. They talked about temporomandibular disorder, which has symptoms such as seemingly untreatable headaches, neck pain, popping of the jaw joint and sleep apnea. They referenced a number of neuromuscular dentist groups and we posted the information on our iHeartMedia Communities page.
- **Small business insurance:** Carol Wilkerson of the U.S. Small Business Administration discussed small business owners who challenged to sort out what kind of auto insurance they need. - **Supporting your local economic community:** Volunteers from Shop Small Columbus talked about how supporting your community by shopping locally can make a big difference in helping local businesses to create more jobs. We posted their guide to find quality businesses in the Central Ohio community through the online network for businesses known as MerchantCircle.com
- **Talking with teens about drug risks:** This edition was an extension of a previous program aired focusing on youth and drugs in November 2015. Experts from the Ohio Institute on Drug Abuse Prevention discussed how to get a conversation started about the risks of drugs with their teens. They talked about their partnership with the National Drug IQ Challenge which helps to shatter the myths about drug abuse and addiction.
- **Vision health for Latinos:** On this special edition focusing on health concerns in Central Ohio's Latino community, representatives from the Ohio Institute of Health found Latinos developed visual impairment and blindness at the highest rate - nearly three percent - of any ethnic group in the country, with older adults affected more frequently. We posted culturally appropriate vision health information for Latinos in English and Spanish on the iHeartMedia Communities page.
