WTVN provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Alzheimer's research: Representatives from the Alzheimer's Association talked about how a quarter of older Americans have memory loss, and how regular assessment can let you know what's normal. They said if it's abnormal memory loss or the early stages of Alzheimer's disease, there are ways to delay the progression.
- Blood pressure medications: Officials from the American Heart
  Association discussed how if you have high blood pressure, to remember
  to use use caution when choosing over-the-counter medications. They
  said many cold and flu products contain decongestants that can raise
  your blood pressure or interfere with the effectiveness of prescribed
  blood pressure medications.
- Brain health: Officials from the Central Ohio Area Agency On Aging discussed how doctors are working on ways to combat cognitive impairment and promote healthy brain aging.
- Compulsive gambling: Officials from the Ohio Problem Gambling Helpline talked about how recovering gamblers do everything they can do to avoid temptation. They said that some gambling addicts can't even read ads that give information to sports gamblers because of the anxiety such ads cause.
- Eye health: Representatives from Prevent Blindness Ohio talked about how harmful U-V rays that can damage your eyes are actually present even during the current cold weather period.
- Family participation in education: Elizabeth Miller, a local school teacher, offered information on teaching children teamwork. She said the whole family can work as a team and have fun doing it, while helping to do better in school and in life.
- Health care consumer information: Author Lorene Burkhart talked about her series of books on how to be an empowered patient. She said the books are designed to be an insightful look at how to be a better health care consumer.
