- **Public safety/Road rage:** Staff members from the Ohio Department of Public Safety talked about how curbing road rage could help keep drivers safe behind the wheel.
- **Cancer research:** Officials from the James Cancer Center talked about the thousands of Ohio women with breast cancer and how there may be an unexpected consequence. They said bones may become weakened because of the cancer spreading or treatments used to fight it.
- **Eye health:** Adrienne Johnson of the National Eye Institute discussed how student's eyesight may suffer from extended use of technology due to the pandemic keeping them at home for learning.
