1. The accuracy and completeness of the response must be certified byan officer, partner or other principal of the Station licensee or broker (as appropriate), or, in the case of a noncommercial educational station, by an officer, member or other principal of the licensee. (See Section 1.16.) The response may be in the form of a $C D$ or other electronic medium, as long as the certification provided refers to the material submitted and is on paperiwith an original signature. § 73:2080 Equal employment opportunities (EEO).
(a) Generai EEO policy. Equal opportunity in employment shall be afforded by all licensees or permittees of commercially or noncommercially operated AM, FM, TV, Class A TV or intemational broadcast stätions (as defined in this pari) to all. qualified persons, and no person shall be discriminated against in employment by such stations because of' race, color, religion, nationalorigin, or sex.. Religious radio broadcasters may establish religious belief or affiliation as a job qualification for all station employees. However, they cannot discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or gender from among those who share their religious affiliation or belief. For purposes of this rule, a religious broadcaster is a licensee which is or is closely affiliated with, a church, synagogue, or other religious entity, including a subsidiary of such an entity.
(b) General EEO program requirements. Each broadcast station shall establish, maintain, and carry out a positive continuing. program of specific practices designed to ensure equal opportunity and nondiscrimination in every aspect of station employment policy and practice. Under the terms of its program, a station shall:
(1) Define the responsibility of each level of management to ensure vigorous enforcement of its. policy of equal opportunity, and establish. a procedure 10 . review and control managerial and
supervisory performance;
(2) Inform its employees and recognized employee organizations of the equal employment opportunity policy and program and enlist theircooperation;
(3) Communicate its equal: employment opportunity, policy and program and its employment meeds to sources of qualified applicants without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, or sex, and solicit their recruitment assistance on a. : continuing basis;
(4) Conduct a continuing program to exclude all unlawful forms of prejudice or discrimmation based upon race, color, religion, national origin, or sex from its personnel policies and practices and working conditions, and
(S) Conduct a continuing review of job structure and employment practices and adopt positive recruitment; job design, and other measures needed to ensure genuine equality of opportunity to participate fully in all organizational :units, occupations, and levels of responsibility.
(c) Specific EEO program requirements. Under the $\cdot$ terms of its program, a station employment unit must:
(1) Recruit for every full-time job vacancy in its. operation: A job filled by an internal promotion is not considered a vaeancy for which recruitment is necessary. Religious radio broadcasters who establish religious affiliation as a qualification for a job position are not required to comply with these recruitment requirements with respect to that jobposition or positions, but will be expected to make reasonable, good faith efforts to recruit applicants. who are qualified based on their religious affiliation. Nothing in this section shall be . interpreted to. require a broadcaster to.. grant preferential treatment to any individual or group based on race, color, national origin, religion. or gender.
(i) A station employment unit-shall use recruitment sources for each vacancy. sufficient in its
reasonable, good faith judgment to widely disseminate information concerning the vacancy.
(ii) In addition to such recruitment sources, a station employment unit shall provide notification of each full-time vacancy to any organization that distributes. : information about employment opportunities to job seekers or refers job seekers to employers upon request by such organization. To be entitled to notice of vacancies , the requesting organization must provide the station employment unit with its name, mailing address, e-mail address (if applicable), telephone number, and contact person, and identify the category or categories of vacancies. of which it requests notice. (An organization may request notice of all vacancies).
(2) Erigage in at least four (if the station employment unit has more than ten full-time employes and is not located in a smaller market) or two (if it has five to ten full-fime employees and/or is located entirely in a smaller market) of the following initiatives during each two-year period beginning with the date stations in the station employment unit are required. to file renewal applications.. or the second, founth or sixth anniversanies of that date:
(i) Participation in at least four jöb fairs-by station personnel who have substantial responsibility in the making of hiring decisions;
(ii) Hosting of at least one job fair;
(iii) Co-sponsoring at least one job fair with organizations in the business and professional community whose mentbership includes substantial - participation of women and minorilies;
(iv) Paricipation in at least four events sponsored by organizations representing groups present in the community. interested in broadcast employment issues including conventions; career days, workshops and similar activities:
(v) Establisliment of an - intemship program designed to assisi members of the community to acquire skills needed for broadcast employment;
(vi) Participation in job"banks, Intemet programs, and other programs designed $10 \cdot$ promote :outreach generally (i.e., that are not primarily directed to providing notification of specific.job vacancies);
(vii) Participation in scholarship programs designed to assist students interested in pursuing a career in broadcasting;
(viii) Establishment of training programs designed. to enable station personnel to acquire skills that could qualify them for higher level positions;
(ix) Establishment of a mentoring Program. for station personnel, 4 , 4 ,
(x) Participation in at least four events or programis sponsored by educational institutions relating to career opporturities in broadcasting;
(xi) Sponsorship, of at least two events in the community designed to inform and- educate members of the public as to employment opportunities in:broadcasting;
(xii) Listing of each supper-level category opening in a job bank or newsletter of media trade groups whose : membership . includes substantial participation of women and minorities;
(xiii) Provision of assistance to unaffiliated non-profit entities in the maintenance of web, sites that provide counseling on the process of searching for broadcas employment and/or other career. development assistance pertinent to broadcasting;
(xiv) Provision of training to management level personnel as to méthods. of ensuring equal employment $: \therefore$ pportunity $: \therefore$. and . preventing discrimination;
(x.v) Provision of training to personnel of unaffiliated non-profin organizations interested in broadcast employment opportunities that would enable : them to better refer job candidates for broadcast positions:
(xvi) Participation in o other activities designed, by the station employment unit reasonably calculated to further the goal of disseminating information as to employment opportunities in broadcasting to job. candidates who might otherwise be unaware of such opportunities.
(3) Analyze its recruitment; prograin on an ongoing basis to ensure that it is effective in achieving broad outreach to potential applicants, and address any problems found as a result of its añalysis.

(f) Enforcements The following provisions apply to employinent lactivity" conceming full-time positions afeach broadcäst station employment unit (defined in this part) employing five or more persons in full-time positions except where noted.
(1) All broadcast stations, including those that are part of an employinent unit with fewer than .five full-time employees, shall file a Broadcast Equal Employment : Oppoirtunity "Program Report (Form -396) : with their renewal application. Form 396 is filed on the date the station ris due: 10 fille its application for renewal of license. If a broadcast licensee acquiressa station pursuant to EEC Form 314. or. FCC Form 315 during the period that is to form the bäsis for the Form 396, information provided on its form 396 should, cover the licensee's EEO recruitment activity during the period starting with the date it acquired the station. Stations are required to maintain a copy of their Form 396 in the station's public file in accordance with the provisions of $\S \S \S \$ 73,3526$ and 73.3527 .
(2) The Commission will conduct a mid-term review of the cimployment practices of each broadcast eelevision station and each radio station
that is part of an employment unit of more than ten full-time employees. four years following the station's most recent license expiration date as specifled in $\beta^{3} 73.1020$. Each. such licensec is required to file with the Commission the Broadcast Mid-Term Report (FCC Form 397). "four months prior to that date. If a broadcast licensee acquires a station pursuant to FCC Fom 314 or FCC Form 315 during the period that is to form the basis for the Form 397, its:Report should coiver the licensee's EEO recriitment activity during the period starting with the date it acquired the station.
(3) If a station is subject to a the brokerage agreement, the licensee shall file Forms 396, Forms 397, and, EEO public file repoits conceming only its own recruitnent activity, If a licensee is a broker of another station or stations, the licensee-broker shall include its recruitment activity for the brokered station(s) in determining the bases of Forms 396, Forms 391 and the EEO public file, Peots for its own station. If a licensee-broker owns mope than one station, it shall include its recruitment actịity for the brokered station in the Forms 396 , Forms 397 and EEOP Public fie reports filed for its own station that is imost closely affiliated with, and in the same market as, the brokered station, if a licensee-broker does not own a station in the same market as the brokered station, then t shall include its recruitment activity for the brokered station in the Eorms 396, Fornis 397, and EEO public file reports filed for its own station that is geographically closest to the brokered station:

Stations shall. ensure that they maintain records' sufficient to verify the accuracy of information provided in Foms 396 , Forms 397 , and EEO püblic file reports: To determine compliance- with the EEO fule, the Commission may conduct inquiries of licensees at random or if it has evidence of a possible violation of the EEO rule In iaddition, the Commission. will conduct random audits. Specifically, each year approximately fiye percent of all licensees in the television and radio services will be" randomly selected for audit, ensuring that, even though the number of radio licensees is significantiy larger than television licensees, both services are represented in the audit process. Upon request, stations shall make records avaitable to the Commission for its review.
(5) The public may file complaints throughout the license term based on a, station's Foim 397 or the contents of a station's public file Provisions. concerting filing, withdrawing, or non-filing of. informal objections or petitions to deny license renewal, assignment, or transfer, applications are. delineated in $\$ \$ 73.3584$ and $73.3587-3589$ of the Commission's rules.
(g) Sanctions and Remedies. The Commission may issue appropriate sanctions and remedies for any violation of this rule.
