The issues were discussed on the WLYF program *Life in South Florida*, on the dates and times indicated. Unless otherwise noted, each program is one half-hour in length, locally originated, and is hosted by the station's Public Affairs Correspondents.

Dana Sones, Director of Strategic Partnerships, talks about how they bring live music to patients in hospitals, with volunteers playing music to lift spirits, also how they can always use volunteers and donations.

They offer summer service camps and business work-days, helping non-profits get the help they need while providing volunteers with a sense of purpose.

Mothers Against Drunk Driving

Heather Geronimus, Chairperson Walk like MADD, talks about how they provide education to communities, spreading awareness of the dangers of drunk and drugged driving, and urging all to get involved in their upcoming Walk like MADD event.

Memorial's Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital Foundation  
Kim Carbo, Director of Community Development and Craig Cohen, Director of Sponsorships Development, explain how the proceeds from their upcoming Casino Night fundraiser are earmarked to fund a new a 3-D CinemaVision MRI for kids, that reduces noise and transforms the experience into something fun.

Gary Hartfield, Division Director, discusses upcoming Small Business Week and how they have special workshops for businesses interested in doing work with the County in Construction, Architecture and Goods and Services. He also explains how a business can get certified with the County.

Debbie's Dream Foundation  
Brittany Starks, Communications Coordinator, explains how the foundation was created by Debbie Zelman, who became an advocate in the fight against stomach cancer as she battled it herself. The foundation now ten years old provides education and resources and more. Sadly Debbie lost her battle in 2017 but her legacy lives on.

Rachel Tourgeman, Community Relations Director, Florida National University, gives startling statistics about the prevalence of human trafficking in South Florida, and details the best way to combat it, including through awareness and education, and the upcoming Rally May 30<sup>th</sup>.

Susan Racher, President and Kathy Coppola, Executive Director, talk about the upcoming NAMI Film Festival, and their efforts to spread awareness about mental illness, to try to end the silence and the stigma around it.

Young At Art Museum  
CEO and Founder Mindy Shrago discusses how the upcoming summer programs for kids out of school provide a variety of art and media sessions. She also describes upcoming special events and activities, and the importance of volunteerism and donations.

Broward Animal Care and Adoption Division

Lauralei Combs, Director, talks about the current kitten population explosion and how anyone can help. She gives tips on what to do when finding abandoned kittens, lost pets and more. She also explains how easy it is to volunteer and how critical volunteers are to their shelter.

Art Serve

Craig Johnson, Executive Director, discusses how Art Serve supports the community by fostering artistic growth. And with the Change Maker Series, they network and find community leaders to help impact areas of equity, public education, health and human services and social change.

Edward Raine, Executive Director, describes his organization's mission of not only feeding, but helping house and shelter those without any resources in 18 countries. South Florida Wildlands

Matthew Schwartz, Executive Director, talks about how the massive new toll road that was approved will negatively affect the environment, decimating wildlife corridors and spawning urban sprawl. He gives an update on the Kanter Oil Drilling fight and the latest threat on the Florida panther.

Feeding South Florida

Paco Velez, President and CEO, discusses their new Ending Summer Hunger Initiative and how they aid families in the fight against hunger year round with the help of community members who sort, pack, and volunteer, as well as donate and participate.

Miami Dade Animal Services

Lionel Romero, Operations Manager, discusses the current rabies outbreak and how residents can protect themselves and their pets, also how they're initiating the oral wildlife rabies vaccine project over the next few months to try to further eradicate it.

ChildNet

Larry Rein, CEO and President, explains how ChildNet helps children by providing resources linking kids to services needed, including adoption, fostering and more. They also provide programs to help teens transition into independence and adulthood.

Michael Liu, Director, discusses how the First Time Homebuyer Program works, helping low income residents get into their first house. He also discusses partnerships with the Miami Dade School Board and local churches to acquire land for more housing.

Goodman Jewish Family Service of Broward

Karen Rahram, CEO, describes the upcoming Joshua's Path event, how they provide services for the elderly, domestic violence survivors, holocaust survivors, food assistance, classes and educational workshops, and how they rely and always need volunteers.
